Please write a brief summary of the report the Committee is submitting to the Senate: The committee voted to modify the Academic Dismissal Policy as pursuant to the attached document. After the warning and probation, the first suspension results in the inability to return for one Fall or Spring semester, an academic year after the second suspension, and two academic years after the third suspension. There is no guarantee to be readmitted after the third suspension.

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Grade Requirements

Four categories of academic standing are established: Good Standing, Warning, Probation, a nd Suspension. These categories are intended to signify a student's progress toward graduatio n, to provide an opportunity for making improvements and achieving academic success, and t o provide more effective academic advising.

To be considered in good academic standing, a student must have a minimum, cumulative 2. 00 grade point average.

"Warning" and "Probation" indicate that grade standards consistent with graduation requirem ents are not being met. Under these conditions, an advisor's approval of course load is required prior to continuing studies at the University.

"Suspension" means that a student is separated from the University for a period of time.

A student whose cumulative grade point average falls below 2.00 will be placed on warning.

A student who has been on warning and who fails to bring his or her cumulative grade point average up to the minimum by the end of the following semester will be placed on probation for the next semester. A probationary student who has failed to bring his or her cumulative grade point average up to 2.00 by the end of the probationary semester will be suspended unles s the student averages at least 2.00 for that semester in which case they will be continued on probation.

Following the first suspension, a student will not be permitted to enroll again until a fall or sp ring semester has passed. After the second suspension, a student will not be allowed to enroll for a complete academic year. Reinstatement after either the first or second suspension is det ermined by the dean (or designee) of the college from which the student was suspended, or, i f the student enrolls in another college, by the dean (or designee) of the new college.

After the third suspension, a student will not be allowed to enroll for two complete academic years. A student may petition for Academic Readmission prior to the semester for which the student seeks readmission. Two college reviewers will determine the conditions under which the student may return. One reviewer must be an academic advisor; the second must be the st udent's academic department chairperson or designee. The decision of the two reviewers is fi nal. Readmission after a third suspension is neither automatic nor guaranteed.

A student who is reinstated after a suspension will be placed on academic probation.

Transfer students admitted on probation must meet the 2.00 minimum grade point average aft er the first semester to be removed from probation.
