# THE COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER and

# CANDIDATE FOR THE HONORARY DEGREE DOCTOR OF HUMANE LETTERS

MORRIS SLAVIN, emeritus professor of history at YSU, joined the University as a limited-service instructor in 1948 and was appointed assistant professor in 1961. A Rayen School graduate, he received his bachelor's degree from Ohio State University and his master's degree from the University of Pittsburgh. He received his doctorate from Western Reserve University in 1961.

Slavin began his life of teaching in the Youngstown schools where he taught for 20 years, interrupted only by service in the Army during World War II. In 1961, he left his faculty position at Woodrow Wilson High School to become a full-time member of the History Department at YSU. He was promoted to professor in 1970.

During his tenure at YSU, Slavin was a distinguished member of the Senate and the Graduate Council and served in the leadership of the YSU-OEA faculty union. In addition to his University teaching, he taught courses on labor studies for Ohio State University, and served as a visiting professor at the State University of New York at Stony Brook.

Slavin has pursued his study of 18th century France and the French Revolution from his doctoral dissertation through numerous articles and two major books, published by Harvard and Princeton university presses. His scholarship has won him national and international recognition as an authority on the French Revolution.

Since his retirement in 1981, Slavin has continued his research and writing. He spent the 1987-88 academic year as a Member of the prestigious Institute for Advanced Study at Princeton, one of 200 noted scholars who are invited annually to pursue and share their research in history, the social sciences, math and physics. In 1988, he was honored by YSU as recipient of the Heritage Award, which is given to members of the University faculty or staff who have made outstanding contributions to YSU.

Throughout his career, Slavin has been highly regarded by students, who praise him for his intellectual standards, his concern for their personal well-being and aspirations, and his unstinting commitment to teaching. His meticulous scholarship has earned him the respect of a large community of historians around the world, and many have been touched by his generous regard for his fellow human beings.

#### ACADEMIC REGALIA AND CEREMONY

The gowns, hoods, and caps worn in academic ceremonies today are relics of clothing worn in medieval times by students and professors. In the early universities — Bologna, Paris, Oxford — the undergraduate students had no prescribed academic dress but wore their usual clerical or ecclesiastical habits. The professors wore more colorful academic regalia than their modern-day descendants. Probably the gowns and hoods were worn for warmth in the unheated halls where the lectures were delivered. From the sixteenth century on, there is a change to somber black and it is only in the hoods worn in academic processions today that the warmth and color of medieval academic pageantry is retained.

The hoods respresenting degrees granted by various colleges and universities have linings (turned to exhibit their hues to the fullest advantage) in the colors of the granting institutions. In addition, the facing of the hood represents by its color the discipline in which the degree has been granted: white for arts, letters, or humanities; golden yellow for science; purple for law; green for medicine; lemon vellow for library science; orange for engineering; drab for commerce or business; light blue for education; pink for music; brown for fine arts; apricot for nursing; dark blue for philosophy; scarlet for theology; citron for social work; sage green for physical education. It is possible, also, to determine from the length of the hoods the type of degree held by the wearer-quite long for the doctor's degree, medium for the master's, short for the bachelor's.

Since 1895, in the United States, the colors and types of caps and gowns have been largely standardized; in 1932 the code was revised to some extent, and in 1960 it was revised once more. A few American universities have adopted gowns other than black in color, and in European universities there is more diversity in cut and in the cap than prevails in the United States. Trustees and

administrators of American colleges and universities, too, may wear regalia which is different from that commonly worn. The trustees of Youngstown State University wear a specially designed cardinal gown.

The bachelor's gown is worn closed; the master's gown is worn open or closed, depending partly on its tailoring; and the wearer of the doctor's gown has the privilege of wearing it open or closed. The sleeves of the three types of gowns are of different lengths and cuts, and in addition the sleeves of the doctor's gown have three horizontal velvet stripes. The doctor's gown also has vertical facing of velvet in front. The stripes and facing may be either black or in the color representing the field in which the wearer has received the doctorate.

There are different opinions about the origin of the caps worn in academic ceremonies. One view is that the "mortar board" is in actuality adapted from the wooden square used by masons. Another is that it stems from the ecclesiastical or clerical head covering of the medieval period. The tassels worn on the caps may or may not be of the same types. In some institutions all masters' and bachelors' tassels are black; in others the tassels, which are the same as the colors of the facings of the hoods, reflect the degree received. The tassels worn by doctors may be black or gold thread.

There is something of the same adherence to tradition in commencement processions that exists in academic garb, although each institution has the right to adapt the ceremony to its own requirements. The chief marshals lead the line of march, followed by the president, the speaker, trustees, and other members of the party to be seated on the platform. Then follow the faculty and the candidates for degrees. The procession at the end of the ceremony follows the same order.

Recipients of University Honors will receive special insignia, consisting of golden honor cords placed around the shoulders.
