THE COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER
and
CANDIDATE FOR THE DEGREE
HONORARY DOCTOR OF LAWS

DR. BERNARD J. YOZWIAK, retired dean of the College of Arts and Sciences, has lent his talents and energies to Youngstown State University for over forty years. Beginning as an instructor in the Mathematics Department in 1947, Yozwiak served as chair of that department from 1966 until 1971, when he was appointed dean of the College of Arts and Sciences. He will continue his association with YSU through Extended Teaching Service.

The College of Arts and Sciences is the largest of YSU's eight colleges and professional schools, offering sixty percent of all instruction. Yozwiak is credited with outstanding leadership of a complex combination of sixteen academic departments ranging from Mathematics and Computer Science to Philosophy and Religious Studies. Under his tenure as dean, YSU established its first graduate programs, in English, history and chemistry. Yozwiak was also instrumental in formulating YSU's role in the Northeastern Ohio Universities College of Medicine (NEOUCOM), a consortium formed in 1975 with Kent State and Akron universities.

Yozwiak is a member of the American Association of University Professors and the Mathematical Association of America, where he has held several leadership positions, including chair of the Ohio Section. He is also a member of the Society of

Sigma Xi, a national honorary research society. In 1961, Yozwiak received the University's highest faculty honor, the Watson Distinguished Professor Award.

Yozwiak has served the University through his work on numerous committees including: The University Curriculum Committee; Committee on Graduate Faculty Membership; Graduate Council; Publication Board (chair); and the University Negotiating Team for collective bargaining; NEOUCOM Academic Council; NEOUCOM Curriculum Committee; Academic Planning Committee of the University Senate; and the *ad hoc* Committee on Articulation (chair). At the state level, he has served on the Committee on General Education in Introductory Professional Courses for the Ohio Board of Regents and has chaired the Council of Deans of Arts and Sciences Colleges.

His community commitments include membership on the Youngstown Players Board, Catholic Services League, the Mahoning Valley Red Cross Board and Catholic Charities Board.

Yozwiak earned a bachelor's degree in mathematics from Marietta College in 1940, and a master's degree in 1951 and doctorate in 1961, both in mathematics from the University of Pittsburgh.

He and his wife, Helen, a YSU graduate, have four grown children.

ACADEMIC REGALIA AND CEREMONY

The gowns, hoods, and caps worn in academic ceremonies today are relics of clothing worn in medieval times by students and professors. In the early universities — Bologna, Paris, Oxford — the undergraduate students had no prescribed academic dress but wore their usual clerical or ecclesiastical habits. The professors wore more colorful academic regalia than their modern-day descendants. Probably the gowns and hoods were worn for warmth in the unheated halls where the lectures were delivered. From the sixteenth century on, there is a change to somber black and it is only in the hoods worn in academic processions today that the warmth and color of medieval academic pageantry is retained.

The hoods representing degrees granted by various colleges and universities have linings (turned to exhibit their hues to the fullest advantage) in the colors of the granting institutions. In addition, the facing of the hood represents by its color the discipline in which the degree has been granted: white for arts, letters, or humanities; golden yellow for science; purple for law; green for medicine; lemon yellow for library science; orange for engineering; drab for commerce or business; light blue for education; pink for music; brown for fine arts; apricot for nursing; dark blue for philosophy; scarlet for theology; citron for social work; sage green for physical education.

Since 1895, in the United States, the colors and types of caps and gowns have been largely standardized; in 1932 the code was revised to some extent, and in 1960 it was revised once more. A few American universities have adopted gowns other than black in color, and in European universities there is more diversity in cut and in the cap than prevails in the United States. Trustees and administrators of American colleges and Universities, too, may wear regalia which is different from that commonly worn. The trustees of Youngstown State

University wear a specially designed cardinal gown.

The bachelor's gown is worn closed; the master's gown is worn open or closed, depending partly on its tailoring; and the wearer of the doctor's gown has the privilege of wearing it open or closed. The sleeves of the three types of gowns are of different lengths and cuts, and in addition the sleeves of the doctor's gown have three horizontal velvet stripes. The doctor's gown also has vertical facing of velvet in front. The stripes and facing may be either black or in the color representing the field in which the wearer has received the doctorate.

There are different opinions about the origin of the caps worn in academic ceremonies. One view is that the "mortar board" is in actuality adapted from the wooden square used by masons. Another is that it stems from the ecclesiastical or clerical head covering of the medieval period. The tassels worn on the caps may or may not be of the same types. In some institutions all masters' and bachelors' tassels are black; in others the tassels, which are the same as the colors of the facings of the hoods, reflect the degree received. The tassels worn by doctors may be black or gold thread.

There is something of the same adherence to tradition in commencement processions that exists in academic garb, although each institution has the right to adapt the ceremony to its own requirements. The chief marshals lead the line of march, followed by the president, the speaker, trustees, and other members of the party to be seated on the platform. Then follow the faculty and the candidates for degrees. The procession at the end of the ceremony follows the same order.

Recipients of University Honors will receive special insignia, consisting of golden honor cords placed around the shoulders.
