THE COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER and CANDIDATE FOR THE DEGREE HONORARY DOCTOR OF HUMANE LETTERS

Paul J. Powers, a native of Boston, Massachusetts, is chairman, president, and chief executive officer of Commercial Intertech Corporation. He is the Youngstown State University Alumni Association's Distinguished Citizen Award winner for 1997.

Mr. Powers came to Commercial Intertech in 1982 as group vice president of Hydraulic Systems. In 1984, he was elected president, chief operating officer and director of the company, and in 1987 was named chairman of the board and chief executive officer.

Prior to his affiliation with Commercial Intertech, Mr. Powers was president of the Denison Division of Abex Corporation, a hydraulic component manufacturer. Before that, he had been in management positions with American Standard and earlier with Chrysler Corporation, where he completed various management assignments in the United States, Mexico, Argentina, Venezuela, and Great Britain.

Mr. Powers received a bachelor's degree in economics from Merrimack College and an MBA from George Washington University. While pursuing his graduate degree, he served as a lieutenant in the navy, where he was a qualified frogman and deep-sea diver trained in the disposal of unexploded ordnance.

Active in professional and civic organizations, Mr. Powers currently serves on the board of the Ohio Business Roundtable, the Youngstown Warren Regional Chamber of Commerce, and the Manufacturers Alliance for Productivity. He is a former director of the National Association of Manufacturers, the National Association of Fluid Power, the Youngstown Symphony Society, the Youngstown Club, and Leadership Youngstown. He was also founding chairman of the Youngstown Community Cup and served in 1995 as general chair of the YSU Alumni Association's Distinguished Citizen Award. In 1994, Mr. Powers was named a Knight of the Order of Merit of the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg.

ACADEMIC REGALIA AND CEREMONY

The gowns, hoods, and caps worn in academic ceremonies today are relics of clothing worn in medieval times by students and professors. In the early universities— Bologna, Paris, Oxford—the undergraduate students had no prescribed academic dress but wore their usual clerical or ecclesiastical habits. The professors wore more colorful academic regalia than their modern-day descendants. Probably the gowns and hoods were worn for warmth in the unheated halls where the lectures were delivered. From the sixteenth century on, there is a change to somber black and it is only in the hoods worn in academic processions today that the warmth and color of medieval academic pageantry is retained.

The hoods representing degrees granted by various colleges and universities have linings (turned to exhibit their hues to the fullest advantage) in the colors of the granting institutions. In addition, the facing of the hood represents by its color the discipline in which the degree has been granted: white for arts, letters or humanities; golden yellow for science; purple for law; green for medicine; lemon yellow for library science; orange for engineering; drab for commerce or business; light blue for education; pink for music; brown for fine arts; apricot for nursing; dark blue for philosophy; scarlet for theology; citron for social work; sage green for physical education.

Since 1895, in the United States, the colors and types of caps and gowns have been largely standardized; in 1932 the code was revised to some extent, and in 1960 it was revised once more. A few American universities have adopted gowns other than black in color, and in European universities there is more diversity in cut and in the cap than prevails in the United States. Trustees and administrators of American colleges and universities, too, may wear regalia which is

different from that commonly worn. The trustees of Youngstown State University wear a specially designed cardinal gown.

The bachelor's gown is worn closed; the master's gown is worn open or closed, depending partly on its tailoring; and the wearer of the doctor's gown has the privilege of wearing it open or closed. The sleeves of the three types of gowns are of different lengths and cuts, and in addition the sleeves of the doctor's gown have three horizontal velvet stripes. The doctor's gown also has a vertical facing of velvet in front. The stripes and facing may be either black or in the color representing the field in which the wearer has received the doctorate.

There are different opinions about the origin of the caps worn in academic ceremonies. One view is that the "mortar board" is in actuality adapted from the wooden square used by masons. Another is that it stems from the ecclesiastical or clerical head covering of the medieval period. The tassels worn on the caps may or may not be of the same types. In some institutions all masters' and bachelors' tassels are black; in others the tassels, which are the same as the colors of the facings of the hoods, reflect the degree received. The tassels worn by doctors may be black or gold thread.

There is something of the same adherence to tradition in commencement processions that exists in academic garb, although each institution has the right to adapt the ceremony to its own requirement. The chief marshals lead the line of march, followed by the president, the speaker, trustees, and other members of the party to be seated on the platform. Then follow the faculty and the candidates for degrees. The recessional at the end of the ceremony follows the same order.

Recipients of University Honors will receive special insignia, consisting of golden honor cords placed around the shoulders.
