Commencement Speaker and Candidate for the Degree Honorary Doctor of Science

Today's commencement speaker, **Bernie Kosar**, **Jr.**, is well known in northeast Ohio and the nation for his accomplishments on the football field. Since he retired from the gridiron, however, Kosar has found new success in business entrepreneurship and public service.

Kosar is director and senior vice president of Precision Response Company, a Miami-based teleservices company. He is also director of ClaimCard, Inc., a developer of software and smartcards in electronic payment systems, and a director of Global Agricultural Technology and Engineering L.L.C., a Florida company involved in improving environmental and worker safety. Notwithstanding his retirement from the Miami Dolphins, Kosar remains chair of the board of the NFL Quarterback Club, which he helped organize while still an active player. In addition, Kosar consults with YSU alumnus Carmen Policy in the return and rebuilding of the Browns in Cleveland.

During his career at Boardman High School, Kosar was named state Football Player of the Year as a senior; he was also one of Boardman High School's top baseball and basketball players. His college career at the University of Miami was highlighted by the Hurricanes' 1983 national championship, in which he was named Most Valuable Player of the Orange Bowl classic.

Kosar graduated from the University of Miami in three years with honors and a major in finance and a minor in economics.

In 1985, he was chosen in the first round of the supplemental draft by the Cleveland Browns, starting ten games that year. During his eight years as quarterback with the Browns, he led the team in three AFC championship games. Midway through the 1993 season, Kosar signed with the Dallas Cowboys and, before the start of the 1994 season, was signed by the Miami Dolphins.

During his football career, he twice received the "Pro Athlete of the Year" award and was inducted into the Orange Bowl Hall of Fame and the University of Miami Hall of Fame.

Kosar maintains strong ties to the northeast Ohio area. He serves as chair of the Paula and Anthony Rich Center for the Study and Treatment of Autism at Youngstown State University and as trustee of the Bernie J. Kosar Charitable Trust. This June, the YSU Alumni Association celebrated Mr. Kosar with its Distinguished Citizen Award.

Kosar and his wife Babette reside in Weston, Florida, with their three daughters.

ACADEMIC REGALIA AND CEREMONY

The gowns, hoods, and caps worn in academic ceremonies today are relics of clothing worn in medieval times by students and professors. In the early universities— Bologna, Paris, Oxford—the undergraduate students had no prescribed academic dress but wore their usual clerical or ecclesiastical habits. The professors wore more colorful academic regalia than their modern-day descendants. Probably the gowns and hoods were worn for warmth in the unheated halls where the lectures were delivered. From the sixteenth century on, there is a change to somber black and it is only in the hoods worn in academic processions today that the warmth and color of medieval academic pageantry is retained.

The hoods representing degrees granted by various colleges and universities have linings (turned to exhibit their hues to the fullest advantage) in the colors of the granting institutions. In addition, the facing of the hood represents by its color the discipline in which the degree has been granted: white for arts, letters or humanities; golden yellow for science; purple for law; green for medicine; lemon yellow for library science; orange for engineering; drab for commerce or business; light blue for education; pink for music; brown for fine arts; apricot for nursing; dark blue for philosophy; scarlet for theology; citron for social work; sage green for physical education.

Since 1895, in the United States, the colors and types of caps and gowns have been largely standardized; in 1932 the code was revised to some extent, and in 1960 it was revised once more. A few American universities have adopted gowns other than black in color, and in European universities there is more diversity in cut and in the cap than prevails in the United States. Trustees and administrators of American colleges and universities, too, may wear regalia which is

different from that commonly worn. The trustees of Youngstown State University wear a specially designed cardinal gown.

The bachelor's gown is worn closed; the master's gown is worn open or closed, depending partly on its tailoring; and the wearer of the doctor's gown has the privilege of wearing it open or closed. The sleeves of the three types of gowns are of different lengths and cuts, and in addition the sleeves of the doctor's gown have three horizontal velvet stripes. The doctor's gown also has a vertical facing of velvet in front. The stripes and facing may be either black or in the color representing the field in which the wearer has received the doctorate.

There are different opinions about the origin of the caps worn in academic ceremonies. One view is that the "mortar board" is in actuality adapted from the wooden square used by masons. Another is that it stems from the ecclesiastical or clerical head covering of the medieval period. The tassels worn on the caps may or may not be of the same types. In some institutions all masters' and bachelors' tassels are black; in others the tassels, which are the same as the colors of the facings of the hoods, reflect the degree received. The tassels worn by doctors may be black or gold thread.

There is something of the same adherence to tradition in commencement processions that exists in academic garb, although each institution has the right to adapt the ceremony to its own requirement. The chief marshals lead the line of march, followed by the president, the speaker, trustees, and other members of the party to be seated on the platform. Then follow the faculty and the candidates for degrees. The recessional at the end of the ceremony follows the same order.

Recipients of University Honors will receive special insignia, consisting of golden honor cords placed around the shoulders.
