The Convocation Speaker

JOHN G. HERVEY

Dr. John G. Hervey, dean emeritus of the Oklahoma City University School of Law, is recognized as one of the leading legal educators in the United States.

Formerly dean of the law school at Temple University (Philadelphia) and at the University of Oklahoma, Dr. Hervey has served for the past fifteen years as advisor to the Section of Legal Education and Admissions to the Bar of the American Bar Association. He was charged with the law school inspection for the Survey of the Legal Profession conducted in 1949-50.

The author of numerous books, he is editor of the Annual Review of Legal Education in the United States and the Oklahoma Bar Association Journal. He

has served as executive secretary of the Oklahoma Bar Association, is past president of Phi Delta Phi international legal fraternity, and is the civilian member of the Board of Review of the Army Judge Advocate General's School at Charlottesville, Virginia.

Dr. Hervey holds the Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Laws degrees from the University of Oklahoma and the Doctor of Philosophy degree in international law from the University of Pennsylvania; he holds honorary doctorates from six institutions of higher learning.

Dr. Hervey recently assumed law clerk responsibilities for United States District Court Judge Luther Eubanks.

The School of Law / Youngstown

The founding date of Youngstown State University, 1908, commemorates the establishment of its first academic unit, the law school. Chartered as the School of Law of the Youngstown Association School under the sponsorship of the Young Men's Christian Association, the school was organized from a commercial law class of nine men. In 1920 the State of Ohio empowered the institution to grant the Bachelor of Laws degree, and in 1922 three students were awarded the LL.B. and became the first to graduate with a degree from the University.

From the first, the tradition that the law student should learn from practicing members of the bench and bar was maintained, exemplified in the dedicated leadership of its deans — Judge William P. Barnum, Theodore A. Johnson, Judge George G. Gessner, and attorneys Raymond L. Falls and R. C. Westenfield—and the professional distinction of its faculty.

Over the years an increasingly close relationship developed between the School of Law and the legal profession in the Mahoning Valley of which so many of its graduates became members. It was therefore a matter of general regret when it was decided in 1957 to close the school rather than attempt its expansion into a full-time program. With the conferral of the 359th degree of Bachelor of Laws in 1960, the School of Law ended its fifty-two years of service to the community and the law profession.

Academic Regalia & Ceremony

The gowns, hoods, and caps worn in academic ceremonies today are relics of clothing worn in medieval times by students and professors. In the early universities - Bologna, Paris, Oxford - the undergraduate students had no prescribed academic dress but wore their usual clerical or ecclesiastical habits. The professors wore more colorful academic regalia than their modern day descendents. Probably the gowns and hoods were worn for warmth in the unheated halls where the lectures were delivered. From the sixteenth century on, there is a change to somber black and it is only in the hoods worn in academic processions today that the warmth and color of medieval academic pageantry is retained.

The hoods representing degrees granted by various colleges and universities have linings (turned to exhibit their hues to the fullest advantage) in the colors of the granting institutions. For instance, the lining of the hood placed this evening over the heads of the recipients of the Juris Doctor degree is cardinal and white, the colors of Youngstown State University. In addition, the facing of the hood represents by its color the discipline in which the degree has been granted: purple for law; white for arts, letters, or humanities; golden yellow for science; green for medi-cine; lemon yellow for library science; orange for engineering; drab for commerce or business; light blue for education; pink for music; brown for fine arts; apricot for nursing; dark blue for philosophy; scarlet for theology; citron for social work; sage green for physical education. It is possible, also, to determine from the length of the hoods the type of degree held by the wearer—quite long for the doctor's degree, medium for the master's, short for the bachelor's.

Since 1895, in the United States, the colors and types of caps and gowns have been largely standardized; in 1932 the code was revised to some extent, and in 1960 it was revised once more. A few American universities have adopted gowns other than black in color, and in European

universities there is more diversity in cut and in the cap than prevails in the United States. Trustees and administrators of American colleges and universities, too, may wear regalia which is different from that commonly worn. The trustees of Youngstown State University wear a specially designed cardinal gown.

The bachelor's gown is worn closed; the master's gown is worn open or closed, depending partly on its tailoring; and the wearer of the doctor's gown has the privilege of wearing it open or closed. The sleeves of the three types of gowns are of different lengths and cuts, and in addition the sleeves of the doctor's gown have three horizontal velvet stripes. The doctor's gown also has vertical facing of velvet in front. The stripes and facing may be either black or in the color representing the field in which the wearer has received the doctorate.

There are different opinions about the origin of the caps worn in academic ceremonies. One view is that the "mortarboard" is in actuality adapted from the wooden square used by masons. Another is that it stems from the ecclesiastical or clerical head covering of the medieval period. The tassels worn on the caps may or may not be of the same types. In some institutions all masters' and bachelors' tassels are black; in others the tassels, which are the same as the colors of the facings of the hoods, reflect the degree received. The tassels worn by doctors may be black or gold thread.

There is something of the same adherence to tradition in commencement processions that exists in academic garb, although each institution has the right to adapt the ceremony to its own requirements. The chief marshals lead the line of march, followed by the president, the speaker, trustees and other members of the party to be seated on the platform. Then follow the faculty and the candidates for degrees. The procession at the end of the ceremony follows the same order.
