## THE UNIVERSITY CEREMONIAL MACE

The ceremonial mace has its roots in ancient Rome. During the Middle Ages, the two types of maces—one a scepter and symbol of royal authority, the other a weapon—gradually evolved into a symbol of lawful power and regal authority. Beginning in fourteenth-century Europe, the academic mace became part of the pomp and ceremony of university commencements, denoting the authority of the University to confer academic degrees.

The new Youngstown State University mace being carried today was designed and crafted by a collaborative team that included YSU faculty, students, alumni, and area K-12 art educators under the leadership of YSU professor Greg Moring.

From 1994 to 2005, she served as an educational consultant in the Ohio Department of Education, and prior to that, was coordinator of Mahoning Area Consortium Tech Prep. Brooks has also served as coordinator of the Right-to-Read grant in the Canfield, Ohio, schools, curriculum supervisor and personnel director in the Mahoning County Office of Education and the Youngstown City Schools. From 1993 to 1995, she served as assistant to the dean in YSU's Beeghly College of Education. Brooks began her journey in education as a reading specialist in the Canfield Local School District.

A graduate of Canfield High School, Ms. Brooks earned her Bachelor of Science in Education magna cum laude at Youngstown University and a Master of Science in Education at Youngstown State in 1970. She has pursued post-master's education and doctoral study at YSU, Ohio State University, the University of Dayton, Kent State University, and the University of Akron.

Among the many honors Ms. Brooks has received during her career was having the conference center at the Mahoning County Career and Technical Center named for her in 2008. She has also been named a Master Board Member by the Ohio School Boards Association and an Outstanding Leader by the Ohio Education Service Center Association. In 1997, she received the YSU Alumni Association's Alumni Involvement Award and was the first recipient of the Beeghly College of Education's Outstanding Alumni Award.

Ms. Brooks is married to YSU engineering alumnus Loran W. Brooks. They have three adult children, Loran D. Brooks, Cheryl Montag, and Cindy Corll, and nine grandchildren.

Today, Petra Knapp will receive her MA in History, with a Certificate in Historic Preservation. Petra graduated from Central-Hower High School in Akron, Ohio, in 1996, and within a week of graduation, was in Basic Training for the Army National Guard. After completing her training, Petra returned home

and, knowing she was not ready for college, explored many different career paths before deciding to enroll at YSU as an undergraduate in 2001. Six years later, having twice taken a year off to have children, Petra graduated cum laude with her BA in history in 2007.

Some of Petra's accomplishments include raising three children, seven-year old Alicyn and five-year old twins Morgan and Brianna, with her husband of ten years, Brian. She is a member of Phi Kappa Phi, National Organization for Women, National Trust for Historic Preservation, and the Ladies Oriental Shrine of North America, which raises funds and supplies for the Shriners Hospitals. Petra was active in student organizations at YSU, and served as president of Phi Alpha Theta and the Student Society for Applied History for two years, and vice president of History Club for one year. ## Academic Regalia and Ceremony

The gowns, hoods, and caps worn in academic ceremonies today are relics of those worn in medieval times by students and professors. Probably the gowns and hoods were worn for warmth in the unheated halls where lectures were delivered. From the sixteenth century on, somber black garb became the norm, and it is primarily in the hoods worn in academic processions today that the medieval academic pageantry is retained.

The hoods representing graduate degrees granted by various

colleges and universities have linings (turned to exhibit their hues to the fullest advantage) in the colors of the granting institutions. In addition, the facing of the hood represents by its color the discipline in which the degree has been granted: white for arts, letters or humanities; golden yellow for science; purple for law; green for medicine; lemon yellow for library science; orange for engineering; olive for commerce or business; light blue for education; pink for music; brown for fine arts; apricot for nursing; dark blue for philosophy; scarlet for theology; citron for social work; sage green for physical education.

There are different opinions about the origin of the caps worn in academic ceremonies. One view is that the "mortar board" is in actuality adapted from the wooden square used by masons. Another is that it stems from the ecclesiastical or clerical head covering of the medieval period.

There is something of the same adherence to tradition in commencement processions that exists in academic garb, although each institution has



the right to adapt the ceremony to its own requirement. The faculty leads the line of march followed by the candidates for degrees. Then follow the chief marshals, the president, speaker, trustees, deans, and other members of the party to be seated on the platform.

Recipients of University Honors receive golden honor cords placed around the shoulders. University Scholars wear a specially minted medallion on a red ribbon to denote their academic achievement.

#### The Presidential Medallion

President Sweet wears a one-of-a-kind medallion that bears an embossment of the Youngstown State University seal on each of the small elements and on the large central piece. On the back of the central medallion are engraved the names of the University's five past presidents and Dr. Sweet.

The presidential medallion was designed and created out of sterling and bronze by Wendell August Forge of Grove City, Pennsylvania. Dr. Sweet is the first president to wear this medallion.

#### The Youngstown State University Seal

The University's official seal was adopted in 1936. Designed by a student, the seal includes a torch, quills, wings, a globe, and the Latin words animus liberatus. In simple terms, those words summarize the transformation—or liberation—that occurs on this campus countless times each day. In English, they are translated *The Mind Freed*, or *The Spirit Freed*.
