

C. Reid Schmutz

Today's commencement speaker, C. Reid Schmutz, has served since 1989 as president of the Youngstown State University Foundation, the major source of scholarship funding for YSU students. During Mr. Schmutz's tenure, Foundation assets grew from \$50 million to over \$150 million, making it one of the largest endowments for universities of comparable size.

Mr. Schmutz, a lifelong resident of the Mahoning Valley, graduated from The Rayen School, Class of 1960. He earned an AB in economics from Brown University in 1964. During his 25 years with the Standard Slag Company of Youngstown, he worked in various positions, concluding as vice president of operations.

Active in his community, Mr. Schmutz serves as a trustee and past president of the Association of Fundraising Executives, the Mahoning Valley Historical Society, the Youngstown Rotary Club, and YSU Penguin Club. Mr. Schmutz is a trustee of the Mahoning/Shenango Planned Giving Council, The Rayen School Foundation, and the Youngstown Hearing and Speech Center. He is a member of the 1985 inaugural class of Leadership Mahoning Valley.

Past community board service includes Junior Achievement, Mahoning Valley Sports Charities, St. Elizabeth Development Foundation, and the Park Vista Retirement Community Philanthropy committee.

## Academic Regalia and Ceremony

The gowns, hoods, and caps worn in academic ceremonies today are relics of those worn in medieval times by students and professors. Probably the gowns and hoods were worn for warmth in the unheated halls where lectures were delivered. From the sixteenth century on, somber black garb became the norm, and it is primarily in the hoods worn in academic processions today that the medieval academic pageantry is retained.

The hoods representing graduate degrees granted by various

colleges and universities have linings (turned to exhibit their hues to the fullest advantage) in the colors of the granting institutions. In addition, the facing of the hood represents by its color the discipline in which the degree has been granted: white for arts, letters or humanities; golden yellow for science; purple for law; green for medicine; lemon yellow for library science; orange for engineering; olive for commerce or business; light blue for education; pink for music; brown for fine arts; apricot for nursing; dark blue for philosophy; scarlet for theology; citron for social work; sage green for physical education.

There are different opinions about the origin of the caps worn in academic ceremonies. One view is that the "mortar board" is in actuality adapted from the wooden square used by masons. Another is that it stems from the ecclesiastical or clerical head covering of the medieval period.

There is something of the same adherence to tradition in commencement processions that exists in academic garb, although each institution has



the right to adapt the ceremony to its own requirement. The faculty leads the line of march followed by the candidates for degrees. Then follow the chief marshals, the president, speaker, trustees, deans, and other members of the party to be seated on the platform.

Recipients of University Honors receive golden honor cords placed around the shoulders. University Scholars wear a specially minted medallion on a red ribbon to denote their academic achievement.

#### **The Presidential Medallion**

President Anderson wears a one-of-a-kind medallion that bears an embossment of the Youngstown State University seal on each of the small elements and on the large central piece. On the back of the central medallion are engraved the names of the University's six past presidents.

The presidential medallion was designed and created out of sterling and bronze by Wendell August Forge of Grove City, Pennsylvania.

The Youngstown State University Seal

The University's official seal was adopted in 1936. Designed by a student, the seal includes a torch, quills, wings, a globe, and the Latin words animus liberatus. In simple terms, those words summarize the transformation—or liberation that occurs on this campus countless times each day. In English, they are translated *The Mind Freed*, or *The Spirit Freed*.
