



Commencement Speaker



Alfred L. Bright Professor Emeritus and Internationally Renowned Artist

Alfred L. Bright, *Distinguished Professor Emeritus*, Youngstown State University, is an internationally renowned artist and educator. He earned his bachelor's degree in art education from Youngstown University in 1964 and his master's degree in painting from Kent State University in 1965.

Professor Bright's motto has always been, "maximize your potential, find your voice, and reject fear." This motto has helped him face many hardships in life and it is something that he has encouraged his students to always follow. Professor Bright has turned life's challenges around to make them key components in the development of his character. His success as an artist and educator can be attributed to his resolve to take on life's experiences, learn from them, and share them. Professor Bright credits Jon Naberenzy, his seventh grade art teacher and founding chair of the art department at Youngstown University and Junior Achievement for opening many doors for him. Junior Achievement's impact started with his college years and especially grew with its mentoring program.

Professor Bright was a pioneer at YSU; he led the way, forged, established, opened up, initiated, prepared and broke new ground for African American faculty. He was the **first** African American full service faculty member at Youngstown University in 1965. His appointment and subsequent success paved the way for the hiring of many more African American faculty and staff members. Professor Bright was the **founding** director of the Black Studies (Africana Studies) Program at YSU from 1970-1987. As the "Father of Black Studies at YSU," Professor Bright developed an interdisciplinary program of study and coursework that brought curricular diversity to the university and the greater Youngstown area. Students of all racial, ethnic and cultural backgrounds enrolled in Black Studies courses and gained insight, perspective and appreciation for cultures (Nonwestern and African American) that previously was not possible.

For over 40 years, Professor Bright has directly influenced, by teaching or mentoring, the careers and lives of thousands of YSU students. The direct impact of his art instruction is obvious on the students enrolled in his courses; however, his influence extends far beyond the classroom. He has influenced the artistic careers of many local and non-local artists with his teaching, knowledge of and passion for art, moral support and nurturing. His external activities, i.e. his art exhibitions and artistic performances (painting to music), have had a direct impact on his teaching style. The exposure and ability to practice his craft has made him a more consummate professional, a better teacher and a more dedicated advisor to his students. Students greatly benefit from his consistent and persistent honing of his skill-his art.

Professor Bright has had more than 50 solo exhibits, including shows at the Butler Institute of American Art, Stanford University, Kent State University and the Canton Art Institute. His work also appears in permanent collections, including those at the Butler Institute of American Art, Kent State University Gallery, Roanoke Museum of Fine Arts, Northeastern University, the Harmon and Harriet Kelly Collection of African-American Art and the Canton Museum of Art. A 2012 performance on Super Bowl Sunday at the Akron Art Museum, in which Professor Bright painted "Portals In Time" to live music by the Jesse Dandy Jazz Trio, drew the largest crowd the museum has ever seen in its 90-year history.

Professor Bright's awards/honors/listings include but are not limited to: Who's Who in American Art, Who's Who in Black America, three Youngstown State University Distinguished Professorship Awards, Phi Kappa Phi National Artist Award Nominee, and the Honor Society of Phi Kappa Phi. Professor Bright served a five-year term on the Ohio Arts Council, and is on the Junior Achievement Foundation Board of Directors.

Commencement Student Speaker

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Angela Cameron

Angela Cameron is a graduate of Princeton High School in Cincinnati, Ohio, and she received a Bachelor of Arts degree in sociology from Ohio University. In January 2010 she enrolled in the Beeghly College of Education's Department of Counseling, Special Education, and School Psychology in the graduate program for counseling. She will receive a Master of Science in Education in counseling with a focus on clinical mental health counseling and school counseling. Following this achievement, she will be eligible to obtain credentials as a Licensed School Counselor and a Licensed Professional Counselor.

During her graduate work, Angela presented research at the All Ohio Counselors Conference in 2011 and 2012, the School Psychology Summer Institute in 2012, the Educational Research Exchange in 2013 and the American Counseling Association's National Conference in 2013. Angela was inducted into the Golden Key International Honor Society, Omicron Delta Kappa—a national leadership honor society, the Phi Kappa Phi Honor Society and Chi Sigma Iota—an international honor society for counselors. Angela was very involved in Chi Sigma Iota and served as President of the Eta Chapter from 2012-2013. She was also nominated by her faculty and peers for *Chi Sigma Iota's Outstanding Entry Level Student Award*. Angela is a member of the American School Counselor Association, American Counseling Association, Ohio Counselors Association, Ohio School Counselors Association, Ohio Afterschool Association and National Afterschool Association.

Angela's work experience includes her service as the Children Services Coordinator at the Jewish Community Center where she oversaw the preschool, school age programs and summer camp. She also worked as the Director of the Youngstown Afterschool Alliance and as a Research Associate/ Evaluator at Youngstown State University. In this position she evaluated various community grants, developed after school programs for four local school districts and provided various professional development sessions. Most recently, Angela completed her school counseling internship at Lordstown and Warren City schools, and she completed her clinical mental health counseling internship at Meridian Community Care in Youngstown, Ohio. Throughout her career, Angela has been awarded over \$6.5 million in grant funding for various programs.

Angela resides in Mineral Ridge, Ohio with her husband and three children.

Academic Regalia and Ceremony

The gowns, hoods, and caps worn in academic ceremonies today are relics of those worn in medieval times by students and professors. Probably the gowns and hoods were worn for warmth in the unheated halls where lectures were delivered. From the sixteenth century on, somber black garb became the norm, and it is primarily in the hoods worn in academic processions today that the medieval academic pageantry is retained.

The hoods representing graduate degrees granted by various

colleges and universities have linings (turned to exhibit their hues to the fullest advantage) in the colors of the granting institutions. In addition, the facing of the hood represents by its color the discipline in which the degree has been granted: white for arts, letters or humanities; golden yellow for science; purple for law; green for medicine; lemon yellow for library science; orange for engineering; olive for commerce or business; light blue for education; pink for music; brown for fine arts; apricot for nursing; dark blue for philosophy; scarlet for theology; citron for social work; sage green for physical education.

There are different opinions about the origin of the caps worn in academic ceremonies. One view is that the "mortar board" is in actuality adapted from the wooden square used by masons. Another is that it stems from the ecclesiastical or clerical head covering of the medieval period.

There is something of the same adherence to tradition in commencement processions that exists in academic garb, although each institution has



the right to adapt the ceremony to its own requirement. The faculty leads the line of march followed by the candidates for degrees. Then follow the chief marshals, the president, speaker, trustees, deans, and other members of the party to be seated on the platform.

Recipients of University Honors receive golden honor cords placed around the shoulders. University Scholars wear a specially minted medallion on a red ribbon to denote their academic achievement.


The Presidential Medallion

President Dunn wears a one-of-a-kind medallion that bears an embossment of the Youngstown State University seal on each of the small elements and on the large central piece. On the back of the central medallion are engraved the names of the University's past presidents.

The presidential medallion was designed and created out of sterling and bronze by Wendell August Forge of Grove City, Pennsylvania.

The Youngstown State University Seal

The University's official seal was adopted in 1936. Designed by a student, the seal includes a torch, quills, wings, a globe, and the Latin words animus liberatus. In simple terms, those words summarize the transformation—or liberation that occurs on this campus countless times each day. In English, they are translated *The Mind Freed*, or *The Spirit Freed*.



Youngstown State University – An Innovative Educational Leader
