

RECIPIENT OF THE DEGREE HONORARY DOCTOR OF HUMANE LETTERS

Anu Shukla is a serial entrepreneur. She is the founder and CEO of Offerpal Media, a social advertising network. Prior to founding Offerpal Media, she was the founder and CEO of Mybuys Inc. where she currently serves on the Board of Directors. Mybuys is a venturebacked company in the **eCommerce** personalization market. Prior to Mybuys, Ms. Shukla pioneered the concept of internet

marketing automation as founder and CEO of Rubric, Inc., which was acquired in 2000 for \$366 million.

Prior to her founding of Rubric, Ms. Shukla held a variety of executive roles including the vice president of marketing and product strategy at Versata (VATA), and vice president of worldwide marketing and product management at Compuware/Uniface Corporation (CPWR).

Ms. Shukla serves on the board of directors of FWE&E (Forum for Women Entrepreneurs and Executives), the International Museum of Women, and the advisory board for the Leavey School of Business, Santa Clara University. She was named to the computer industry "Dream Team" by Business 2.0 magazine in 2004 and named a YSU Distinguished Alumni in 2005 and

2005 Entrepreneur of the Year by the Washington D.C.-based Dialogue on Diversity organization.

Ms. Shukla earned a Master of Business Administration with a marketing emphasis from Youngstown State University in 1984. She also received a Bachelor of Arts in history from YSU in 1982 and a bachelor's degree in history with honors from St. Stephen's College in New Delhi, India, in 1979.

Academic Regalia and Ceremony

The gowns, hoods, and caps worn in academic ceremonies today are relics of those worn in medieval times by students and professors. Probably the gowns and hoods were worn for warmth in the unheated halls where lectures were delivered. From the sixteenth century on, somber black garb became the norm, and it is primarily in the hoods worn in academic processions today that the

medieval academic pageantry is retained.

The hoods representing graduate degrees granted by various colleges and universities have linings (turned to exhibit their hues to the fullest advantage) in the colors of the granting institutions. In addition, the facing of the hood represents by its color the discipline in which the degree has been granted: white for arts, letters or humanities; golden yellow for science; purple for law; green for medicine; lemon yellow for library science; orange for engineering; olive for commerce or business; light blue for education; pink for music; brown for fine arts; apricot for nursing; dark blue for philosophy; scarlet for theology; citron for social work; sage green for physical education.

There are different opinions about the origin of the caps worn in academic ceremonies. One view is that the "mortar board" is in actuality adapted from the wooden square used by masons. Another is that it stems from the ecclesiastical or clerical head covering of the medieval period.

There is something of the same adherence to tradition in commencement processions that exists in academic garb, although each institu-



tion has the right to adapt the ceremony to its own requirement. The faculty leads the line of march followed by the candidates for degrees. Then follow the chief marshals, the president, speaker, trustees, deans, and other members of the party to be seated on the platform.

Recipients of University Honors receive golden honor cords placed around the shoul-

ders. University Scholars wear a specially minted medallion on a red ribbon to denote their academic achievement.

The Presidential Medallion

President Sweet wears a one-of-a-kind medallion that bears an embossment of the Youngstown State University seal on each of the small elements and on the large central piece. On the back of the central medallion are engraved the names of the University's five past presidents and Dr. Sweet.

The presidential medallion was designed and created out of sterling and bronze by Wendell August Forge of Grove City, Pennsylvania. Dr. Sweet is the first president to wear this medallion.

The Youngstown State University Seal

The University's official seal was adopted in 1936. Designed by a student, the seal includes a torch, quills, wings, a globe, and the Latin words animus liberatus. In simple terms, those words summarize the transformation—or liberation—that occurs on this campus countless times each day. In English, they are translated *The Mind Freed*, or *The Spirit Freed*.
