

They would walk for hours.
























Together...






As the boy grew older



















"It is another path,"




















"Its dertination l do not know."


The man motioned to his son to sit next to him in the middle of the path. Brushing the flys from his face, he looked over to the boy and spoke.



To The Student Body:

Forty-five years ago the first NEON was dedicated to Howard W. Jones, President of Youngstown College, in recognition of the "inspiring service and successful endeavor" he so generously gave this youthful institution.

This anniversary edition of 1980, at the beginning of a new decade, gives us an opportunity to look back at accomplishments and sight ahead at goals we'd like to attain—as students, faculty, administrators and as part of this community and an interrelating Mankind.

Out on this campus is a granite rock that marked a beginning when what is now Youngstown State University was established by the Young Men's Christian Association. The ideals are the same, the horizons far broader.

In 1952, the NEON was presented as the symbol of the Lamp of Knowledge. It, too, recorded the university experience: learning, self-accomplishment, frustrations and fun. One picture of book-laden students at semester start was captioned "Books, Brains and Bedlam." Another was the NEON photographer's delight, a student asleep! (Presumably from studying the night through.)

In other yearbooks down the years, NEON has portrayed students engrossed in a lab project, or music, athletes being tested, sweaters and bobby sox, military uniforms and hula hoops.

The 1978 NEON asked: "Where have you been, where are you going?" In it I mentioned the dramatic changes in physical environment of our campus and the advances in academic standards with new ideas, new awareness and pride in Youngstown State and, more important, its increasing influence and the impact of its graduates on the community.




The attitude of a university, unlike the structural and functional aspects, is not hinged on the opinions of a few, but the ideas of many.



Chosen as this year's theme, as we enter a brand new decade, is 'Black Images of the 80's: A Claim for True Portrayal.''



The Penguins, who concluded their 25th season under coach Dom Rosselli, enjoyed an outstanding spring as they finished the season with a sparkling 21-5 overall record. That marked the 10th season in the last 11 that YSU baseball squads have won 20 or more victories in a season. As the Penguins baseball mentor, Rosselli has fashioned a 393-193 mark.

After a slow start, in which they won just two of their first four battles, the Penguins came on strong as the season progressed. A 10-3 defeat by Akron, in the first game of a twin bill, halted a 13 game victory streak. That loss, coupled with the regional com-mittee's decision, tested the mettle of the Penguins. They answered that test in first-class fashion by nailing six wins in their last eight contests.

A young team for the most part, the Penguins had only one senior in the infield and none in the outfield. Of the ten pitchers on the staff, only two were seniors.

Senior second baseman Andy Saxon was a study of consistency during his ca-reer at YSU. A four-year letterman, he pro-vided the Penguins with a steady glove in the field and consistent punch at the plate.

One of the top hitters in the region, Saxon ended the campaign with a .315 bat-ting average. He tied teammate Dave Ziegler for runs scored with 18, and was the pace-setter in walks with 17. His four dou-bles was also second best on the squad.

YSU enjoyed a fine season, due in part to the pitching of seniors Dave Smercansky and Bill Sattler. A southpaw from Poland, Smercansky fashioned a 40 record with a 0.90 ERA. The team leader in complete games with four, Smercansky's ERA was third in that category. Smercansky and Sattler both tied for team honors in wins

with four apiece.

sattler, a righthander from Youngstown Wilson, led the squad in strikeouts with 39 and innings pitched with 31. At the sea son's end. Sattler had a 42 mark on the hill A four-year letterman, Sattler's career stats include a 17.10 record and 224 strikeouts. That strikeout mark is the sec-ond-most in YSU history. Two years ago, as a sophomore, Sattler fanned 89 batters to establish a new school record. Last year, his 48 whiffs in 33 innings was good enough to lead the nation's Division II hurlers.

Saxon, Sattler, and Smercansky were not the only heroes for the Penguins. More than anything else, YSU's baseball squad could be characterized as a team great balance.

Freshman catcher Mike Nittoli and junior centerfielder Joe lacabucci tied for the team tead in batting average with .333 marks. Sophomore third sacker Scott Bass aided the YSU hitting punch with a .307 average.

Freshman first baseman Dave Zeigler, who had a disappointing season at the plate with a .237 mark, still played a promi-nent role for YSU with his bat. Zeigler led the Penguins in total bases with 49, crack-ing five homers, three doubles, and a triple. He set the pace in RBI's by driving in 18

Five rookie hurlers saw action this spring, and YSU's baseball future looks brighter because of their performances this season. Righthander Dave Baker, for example, pitched well enough to compile a 3.0 record and led the squad in ERA with a brilliant 0.44 mark.


Two former Coshocton High School standouts, who teamed with Zeigler to lead Coshocton to the state Class AA baseball title a year ago, also hurled for the Penguins this year and will be the backbone of next year's mound staff. Glenn Head was second in ERA with a 0.81 figure, and he also posted a 2-1 record in three starts. Also a righthander, Mark Schlarb was used mainly in relief where he was extremely effective. Schlarb finished the year with a 1.0 record and a 1.86 ERA.


Junior righthander Joe Sekora began the season in impressive style before being bothered by a sore arm. But despite that


malady, he built a 2.1 record with a 2.61 ERA. His 28 strikeouts in 20 frames was second in that department.

While Rosselli will hate to lose the ser-vices of Saxon, Sattler, Smercansky, and reserve catcher Rick Zuzik, enough top-flight talent will return next season to again make the Penguins a competitive baseball unit.

Men's Basketball

The 1979-1980 Basketball campaign was one that proved to be very successful at YSU.

The man most responsible for making winning and basketball synonomous at YSU is legendary head coach Dom Rosselli. The "Wizard of Wick Avenue," Rosselli completed his 36th season as the Penguins I basketball mentor. His squads have achieved success on the hardwood matched by few other schools in the nation.

With a 570-353 overall coaching record, Rosselli ranks as the third winningest active basketball coach nationally. In 36 years at YSU, Rosselli—coached teams have compiled 25 winning campaigns and appeared in 13 postseason tournaments. Despite their youth, the Penguins have branded themselves as a never-say-die unit with their hustling and aggressive style of play. This attack was led by sophomore Dave Zeigler, a 6'5" forward who averaged 27.7 points a game. His 1,288 points set a new sophomore scoring mark, and he has been named to two All-American squads.

Adding additional punch for the Penguins was sophomore Bruce Alexander. A fine-shooting guard, the 5' 11" Alexander netted 13.5 points an outing to finish as the squad's second-leading point producer. His fine all-around play will make him an integral part of the Penguins plans for the next two season. The Penguins consistent play was closely aligned with the improved play of 6'8" junior center Mitchell Atwood. A junior college transfer, Atwood led YSU in rebounding with 196, and tossed nearly 11 points a contest in his second season for the Penguins.

Besides that trio, starters Steve Miodrag and Shawn Burns have also contributed to the team's steady play. Miodrag, a 6'5% forward, averaged 9.7 points to aid the YSU offense, while Burns dished out 144 assists to lead the time in that category.



Women's Basketball

The Lady Penguin cagers had a successful year by compiling a 13.5 season tab.

As a team, the Penguins shot .445 from the field, while they were able to can their free throws at a .553 clip. Hauling down 691 rebounds, dishing out 276 assists and stealing the opponents' ball 253 times, the Lady Penguins rippled the nets for I,310 points in their 18 outings, scoring at a 73.1 clip every game. When you couple that with the opponent's scoring average of 59.9, you see why the Penguin cagers were able to cop 13 of their 18 travs

able to cop 13 of their 18 frays. The Penguins were led all season long by All-American candidate Wanda Grant, who paced the lady basketeers in every offensive category. She led the team in scoring with 26 points per game and also hauled down 236 rebounds (14.8 per game) despite missing two games due to an injury.

injury. "Wanda did exactly what we expected her to do for us this year," Ramsey stated. "She's a tremendous talent and we're expecting bigger and better things from her next year."


The play-maker of the team, Vicki Lawrence, was the second leading scorer on the team (15.4) and is considered by many as the catalyst who makes the team go. "Vicki played good ball for us throughout the whole year," Ramsey emphasized, "but when you couple her return with that of Grant's next season, you can only expect better things of the two of them for they complement each other very well."




Kathy Quinn also featured for the Penguins by finishing second in the goals scored category with six. Kathy and Leslie also serve as the team's co-captains.


Y.S.U. Football MCC Champs







GAME 1 The Penguins claimed their first win of the 33-27, in year by clipping host Illinois State 33-27, in the initial meeting between the two schools. Keith Snoddy led the Penguin of fense which amassed 410 total yards. The senior quarterback completed 14 of 21 passes for 229 yards and four touchdowns. Jim Ferranti hauled in eight aerials for 158 yards, including three of Snoddy's TD strikes.

Game 2

In what marked the first of three defensive efforts, YSU ripped Central State, 17-6, in the Penguins first home contest. Senior safety, Kevin Statzer, gathered in one theft, and sophomore linebacker Joe Schartner add ed another.

Game 3

Defense keyed the Penguins' third win as YSU rolled past visiting Ashland, 243. Pat Durina, Junior cornerback, had a pair of in-terceptions, while Statzer, senior noseguard Terry Dittmer, and sophomore linebacker Jeff Gergal each had six solo tackles. GAME 4

Game four was a shutout at Falcon Stadi um as the Panguins' defense held Northern lowa to only 13 yards rushing and crushed their first MCC foe, 19-0. Jim Ferranti collect-ed seven passes for 132 yards and a touchdown becoming YSU's all time record holder for both career receptions and yards. Kevin Statzer, Larry Grist, and T.C. Reynolds each picked off a Panther pass while Chris Weber kicked five punts for a 40.5 average.

GAME 5

Game 5 proved to be one of their biggest as YSU upset host Villanova, 27-22. Robby Robson put on an offensive show scoring four touchdowns, rushing for 85 yards on 25 carries, and throwing a 51-yard halfback option pass to set up a Penguin tally. GAME 6

YSU stretched its unbeaten streak to six as Michigan, 2423, on the road. Snoddy di-rected a ten-play, 83-yard scoring drive late in the final quarter, and senior cornerback ten bras intercented a Wild cornerback Tom Jaros intercepted a Wild

cat pass in the last minutes of the game to assure the win. GAME 7

For game seven, the Penguins traveled to Akron and dealt their archrival at 163 set back. Snoddy was awarded the MCC player of the week as he passed for 183 yards on 13 out of 22 completions. Carey Orosz booted three field goals, and Jim Ferranti had nine receptions, while Terry Dittmer and senior Tom Harder led the de-fensive squad.

GAME 8

Five records were shattered on the Penguins' 29-8 Homecoming triumph over Western Illinois. Robson carried the ball 38 times for 175 yards and three touchdowns. Ferranti's six catches broke the YSU single season reception performance, and Orosz placed his name into the record book with a 52-yard field goal, the longest in the Pen-guins' history. Snoddy's twenty-third fouchdown pass of his career shattered the old Jaworski mark, and lastly, the victory marked the first time a YSU football team had won eight games in a row. GAME 9

In game nine, YSU captured their second straight MCC crown as the guest Penguins smashed Eastern Illinois, 49-21 to avenge last year's playoff defeat. The game proved to be another record breaking contest for Robson and Ferranti. Snoddy was also awarded the MCC player of the week for the second time. GAME 10


In the tenth game, the YSU undefeated streak was shattered at the hands of Dela-ware by the score of 51.45. Superb perfor-Robson, Ferranti, and senior Dwight Dumas. GAME 11

In the beginning of the playoffs, YSU rolled over South Dakota State, 50-7 with a solid defensive effort and advanced to the na-tional semifinals. The YSU defensive squad caused seven turnovers and stopped the Jackrabbits' running attack cold, holding it to zero yards rushing. In addition, Robson scored four touchdowns and became YSU's single season rushing leader.



Freshmen Mari Anne Sefcik and Beth Chepke both qualified to compete in the meet, and Mari Anne later went on to win the title.




Other top performers include: backstroker, Stephanie Ondich and Tammy Swearinger who swims both the butterfly and freestyle events.


Another standout for the team was last year's most valuable player and four-year letterman, Butch Thomas.



Wrestling

The 1979-80 wrestling season became the most successful in the school's history. 





































Intramurals
