The Penguins unleased a speedy backfield to lace Geneva in the opener making their record with Covenanters stand at 5 wins, 1 defeat, and 1 tie.




Durina tossed 25 yards to Lanzi for the opening tally in the fourth quarter. The same combination scored again this time on a 18 yard heave.


YoCo 25 Waynesburg 7
