YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio - Students from 23 area high schools will compete in a computer programming contest at Youngstown State University on Jan. 12.

The YSU student chapter of the Association for Computing Machinery, in cooperation with YSU's Mathematical and Computer Sciences Department, and the university's Computer Center, is sponsoring the contest, which will be held from 8:15 a.m.-2 p.m. in Cushwa Hall on the YSU campus.

Thirty-one teams of four members each are entered in the contest. Activities will include a large screen demonstration of terminal usage, practice time on the terminals, and the contest.

The three-hour contest will consist of five programming problems to be solved by using the VSBASIC programming language (a version of the most common programming language for microcomputers). Winners will be determined by the number of problems solved correctly. Ties will be broken on the basis of the time required to obtain the solution and the number of trial runs.

Trophies will be awarded to first, second, and third place winners.

YSU Mathematical and Computer Sciences Department faculty will judge the contest.
