Ms. Artzt has been described as "America's best player and a model for any guitarist" by Guitar Magazine and praised by critics around the world. She studied in France with Ida Presti and Alexandre Lagoya, and in England with Julian Bream, and has done graduate work in composition and musicology at Columbia University.

Each year, Ms. Artzt tours Europe extensively and has made frequent tours throughout Central and South America, Africa, Europe and the Far East.

She recently reconstructed and performed widely the "Concerto for Guitar (originally lute) and Strings" by Johann Sigismund Weiss which Chanterelle in Germany has now published. She and the eminent harpsichordist Igor Kipnis have also arranged this piece for guitar and harpsichord for their own duo concerts.
