YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio - Daniel Patrick Moynihan, U.S. senator from New York, will be a Skeggs Lecturer for Youngstown State University's Special Lecture Series on Nov. 19.

His topic at the 8 p.m. program at Powers Auditorium, Federal Plaza West, will be "International Involvements: A View from the Senate."

YSU's Special Lecture Series is free and open to the public. Seating is on a first-come, first-served basis. These programs are designed to enhance and enrich community and University life by bringing to campus prominent social, political, and intellectual leaders.

Senator Moynihan is the only person in American history to serve in four successive administrations -- he was previously a member of the cabinet or sub-cabinet of Presidents Kennedy, Johnson, Nixon and Ford.

He enlisted in the Navy in 1944. In 1966, he completed 20 years in the Naval Reserve and retired.

Senator Moynihan has taught at Russell Sage College, Troy N.Y., and the Cornell University School of Industrial Relations, Ithica, N.Y. He also has been an assistant professor of Government at Syracuse (N.Y.) University, and professor of Government at Harvard University.

He received his Bachelor's degree, cum laude, from Tufts University, Medford, Mass., in 1948, and his doctoral degree from its School of Law and Diplomacy in 1961.

The senior senator from New York State was first elected in 1976 and re-elected in 1982 with the largest majority in a mid-term race in the history of the Senate.

He is the author, co-author, or editor of 13 books, beginning with <u>Beyond</u> the <u>Melting Pot</u> (with Nathan Glazer), a study of the ethnic groups of New York City, which won the Anisfield-Wolf Award in Race Relations in 1963. His latest work is <u>Family and Nation</u>, published in February. He is a member of the <u>Publication Committee</u> of <u>The Public Interest</u>, and, formerly, of <u>The American Scholar</u>.

Senator Moynihan is a member of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences and the American Institute of Architects. The Board of Regents of the Smithsonian Institution awarded him the Joseph Henry Medal in recognition of his services.

He has received 52 honorary degrees, including Doctor of Strategic Intelligence, the first such degree granted by the Defense Intelligence College. In 1984, the State University of New York at Albany awarded the senator a University Medallion, its highest award for public service, in recognition of his "extraordinary public service and leadership in the field of education."

In addition to honorary degrees, Sen. Moynihan has also received a myriad of service awards.

He is a member of the Senate Finance Committee, the Budget Committee, and the Committee on the Environment and Public Works. He is also a member of the official U.S. Senate observer group to the arms talks between the U.S. and the Soviet Union. Moynihan is also a member of the Senate Democratic Policy Committee.

Skeggs Lectures are endowed by the Skeggs Foundation in recognition of the vital role played by the late Leonard T. Skeggs, Sr., in the founding of YSU.
