YOUNGSTOWN, OHIO - "College Bowl," a quiz battle involving academic knowledge, has returned to Youngstown State University for the second consecutive year.

Sponsored by YSU's Kilcawley Center Program Board, College Bowl is designed to promote competition incorporating fun, prestige, and profit.

This year's YSU team, "The MD's," will advance to the regional play-offs at Hiram College, Feb. 6-7. Competing with schools from Ohio, Michigan, and Ontario will be:

Mike Eighan, 554 Barbcliff Lane, Canfield; William Houser, 3552 Susan Circle, Youngstown; George Spirtos, 458 Blossom Avenue, Campbell; all YSU students now attending the North Eastern Ohio Universities College of Medicine (NECUCOM) at Rootstown, and Manuel Spirtos, 458 Blossom Avenue, Campbell, a pre-med student.

Should this team win, they will go on to the national championship in mid-March in North Carolina.

College Bowl originated on radio in the 50's and was on television through 1970. It reappeared on college campuses in 1976 and almost 300 schools are currently participating.

The game begins by a 10-point toss-up question of an academic field. The first player to successfully answer, scores ten points for their team which qualifies them for a bonus question. Following the bonus question the teams return to toss-up questions and intensity builds.
