The YSU program will feature State Rep. Ronald Gerberry, discussing "The Role of Legislator and the Responsibilities of the Citizenry."

Representative Gerberry (D-71) of Austintown is in his third term of office. He is a 1975 Political Science graduate of YSU.

He is chairman of the House Education Committee and the Senate/House Joint Select Committee on Pupil Testing Evaluation, and ex-officio member of the Ohio Board of Regents, representative of the North Central Regional Educational Laboratory in Chicago, commissioner to the Education Commission of States, and Ohio representative on the Steering Committee for the Education Commission of States.
