YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio - Teams of 7th and 8th grade students from 33 area junior high schools will participate in this year's MATHCOUNTS competition at Youngstown State University's Kilcawley Center on Friday, Feb. 20.

Each team will be made up of four students who will compete in both team and individual events. The afternoon competition will follow a game show format, with students racing against the clock to answer math questions.

Questions will deal with such topics as probability, statistics, linear algebra and polynomials.

Both the morning sessions, beginning at 9 a.m., and the team events about 1 p.m., will be held in the Chestnut Room of Kilcawley Center.

Individual team winners will receive trophies, and the top three teams will advance to the statewide competition in Columbus on March 28. A state championship team will be selected for the national competition.

Awards will be presented at the annual Mahoning Valley Society of Professional Engineers (MVSPE) dinner held in celebration of National Engineers Week at 6:30 p.m. Feb. 26 in Kilcawley Center. MVSPE is the local sponsor of MATHCOUNTS.

Major funding for the contests in Ohio is provided by Standard Oil Company (SOHIO). Several area businesses and engineering firms have also assisted in funding the local competition.

MATHCOUNTS is a nationwide program designed to reverse the current trend of declining skills and interest in math among students at the precollege level.

National sponsors of MATHCOUNTS are the Society of Professional Engineers (NSPE), the CNA Insurance Companies, the U.S. Department of Education, the National Council of Teachers of Mathematics (NCTM), and the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA).

Prof. Jack Ritter of the Civil Engineering Department of YSU's William Rayen School of Engineering is the coordinator of the local MATHCOUNTS program.

YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio - Dr. H. Thomas McCracken, Youngstown State University professor of English, has taken office as national chairman of the Conference on English Education (CEE), an organization of teacher educators within the National Council of Teachers of English.

He will serve for two years.

Through its conference sessions, its journal, <u>English Education</u>, and its task groups, CEE provides a forum for sharing ideas on pre-service and in-service teacher education for English. Besides chairing the CEE Executive Committee, Dr. McCracken's duties include representing teacher educators on the Executive Committee of the National Council of Teachers of English.

Dr. McCracken, who joined the YSU faculty in 1970, resides in Canfield. He received Bachelor of Science and Master of Science degrees from the State University of New York at Oswego, a Master of Arts degree from Middlebury, Vt. College, and a doctoral degree from the University of Illinois.

Before joining the faculty here, Dr. McCracken supervised student teachers of English at the University of Illinois, Urbana-Champaign, taught humanities at Parkland College, Champaign, Ill., and taught English at the State University of New York at Cortland.

The National Council of Teachers of English is a non-profit organization of teachers of English at all levels of education. It's aim is to improve the teaching of English.
