YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio - Hot jazz will take the chill out when Youngstown State University's award-winning Jazz Ensembles I and II sizzle the air with their Winter Jazz Concert at 8 p.m. Monday, March 4, in the Chestnut Room of YSU's Kilcawley Center.

The concert, free and open to the public, will feature classic tunes like Cole Porter's "Easy to Love," showcasing the Ensemble I sax section, and Rob McConnell's "Just Friends." Ensemble II's offerings will include selections by Stan Kenton, Michel LeGrand, and Les Hooper.

There will also be some new sounds as Ensemble I presents an original composition by trumpeter Dave Rivello entitled "Somewhere West of Here."

Jazz Ensemble I and YSU jazz director Tony Leonardi of Poland were recently selected to perform at the annual Ohio Music Educators Association conference in Cleveland. Two members of Jazz Ensemble I, Kent Englehardt, Boardman, lead alto saxophone, and Tom Potjunas, Warren, trombonist, were among collegians chosen to play in the 19-member Intercollegiate Jazz Ensemble at the conference. They and others were chosen from taped auditions sent in from colleges and universities throughout Ohio.

Leonardi, assistant professor of music at YSU's Dana School of Music, was selected to direct the performance of the conference's first Regional All-Star High School Jazz Ensemble.

The Dana School of Music is part of the university's College of Fine and Performing Arts.

YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio - Carmen E. Turner, general manager of the Washington, D.C., Metropolitan Area Transit Authority, will deliver the commencement address at Youngstown State University's Winter Commencement at 10 a.m. Saturday, March 23, in Beeghly Center.

The entire program will be broadcast live beginning at 9:55 a.m. over WYSU-FM (88.5), the university's fine arts radio station.

Mrs. Turner joined WMATA in November 1977 as assistant general manager of administration after a distinguished career as a federal administrator. She became general manager in July of 1983. This authority is one of the nation's largest transit properties, providing transportation for almost 800,000 District of Columbia area residents. Operating costs this year are \$425 million.

During her 26-year federal government career, Mrs. Turner has worked for the Department of the Army, U.S. Department of Transportation, served as deputy director of Civil Rights for the Urban Mass Transportation Administration, and as acting director of Civil Rights for the U.S. Department of Transportation.

She received her Bachelor of Arts degree in government from Howard University and Master of Arts degree in public administration and political behavior from the American University.

She has taught community planning and management principles at Federal City College and has been a guest lecturer at Northeastern University in training seminars for transit executives. Mrs. Turner chairs the training committee for the American Public Transit Association.

Among her community services, Mrs. Turner is an active member of, and has served on the vestry of St. George's Episcopal Church.

She is married to Frederick B. Turner, Jr.. They are parents of two sons. The family resides in Washington.
