While serving as a YSU trustee, Mrs. Isroff has been chairman of the board for two years; served as chairman of the Personnel Relations, Student Affairs and Budget and Finance committees; and chaired an ad hoc committee on insurance and university audit. She is also Board representative to the YSU Schermer Trust program.

Mrs. Isroff's nine-year term on the YSU Board of Trustees expires this year. She is a lifetime member of the YSU's Alumni Association.
