"Great Years Beyond 1984" will begin at 8 p.m. in Powers Auditorium, Federal Plaza West in downtown Youngstown.

YSU's Special Lecture Series is free and open to the public. Seating is on a first-come, first-served basis. These programs are designed to enhance and enrich community and University life by bringing in prominent social, political, and intellectual leaders.

Bradbury published his first story in 1941, and has since added more than 400 short stories, plus 17 novels and anthologies to his credit. Among the many prestigious magazines that have published his works are, The New Yorker, Life, and The New Republic.

Some of his most famous titles are Fahrenheit 451, The Martian Chronicles, and Dandelion Wine. Many of his works have appeared in movie and stage versions.

Bradbury recently served as a consultant on EPCOT Center at Disney World, and designed the Spaceship Earth building there.

His current projects include a murder-suspense novel, a screenplay, and an opera.
