YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio - WYSU-FM (88.5), Youngstown State University's fine arts radio station, will broadcast the world premier of 33 of J.S. Bach's chorale preludes, recently discovered by Harvard Professor Christoff Wolff. The historic concert will be broadcast live at 2 p.m. Sunday, March 17.

Discovery of the unpublished preludes late last year stunned the cultural world and caused hundreds of recording companies, scholars and concert producers to fight for rights to perform the new Bach works.

The premier will be broadcast live from Yale University's Battell Chapel. Yale organist Charles Krigbaum and Harvard organist John Ferris will perform on the Yale Chapel organ, a Walter Holkamp instrument built to the tonal and architectural specifications of 17th and 18th century European organs.

Co-hosted by Bill Henry and Faith Middleton of Connecticut Public Radio, the event will include an interview with Wolff, who will tell how he solved the mystery of the manuscripts.

Organists Krigbaum and Ferris will explain how they prepared for a concert that has no precedent.

Harold Samuels, curator of the Yale Music Library, where the unknown Bach manuscripts were discovered, will discuss the possibility of finding other hidden masterpieces.

Joseph Dzeda and Nick Thompson-Allen, organ curators who spent months preparing the Yale instrument for this event, will discuss the Yale organ and its history.

The program will also feature Jaroslav Pelikan, a Yale professor and world authority on Bach.

Reactions from the audience and interviews with national artists in attendance at the performance will complete the broadcast.

YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio - Youngstown State University's annual "College Night" will be held from 7-9 p.m. March 19 in Beeghly Center, Spring Street.
