YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio - Summer enrollment at Youngstown State University shows a decrease from last summer's second record high.

There were a total of 5,826 students enrolled in this summer session. Last summer the total was 6,064 with the school record of 6,100 being recorded in the summer of 1984.

Women outnumber the men this summer, 3,147 to 2,679.

There are 1,056 full-time and 4,770 part-time students. Full-time students are defined as those carrying 12 or more hours of credit work.

The Full-Time Equivalent this summer is 2,797. (FTE is the student-credit hour formula used by the state to measure both full-time and part-time students into a full-time equation).

A comparison of this summer's class enrollment compared to last summer shows a decline in all classes. There are 1,790 seniors or 99.6 percent of last summer's figure; 1,110 freshmen, 93.6 percent; 1,031 juniors, 91.6 percent; and 977 sophomores, or 98.5 percent compared to sophomores in summer session last year.

There are 4,908 undergraduates taking courses and 918 graduate students.

Enrollment figures also show that 5,385 YSU students are Ohio residents and 441 are from other states and countries.

The breakdown of this summer shows 1,527 students in the College of Arts and Sciences; 1,351 in the College of Applied Science and Technology; 918 in Graduate School; 727 in the Warren P. Williamson, Jr. School of Business Administration; 654 in the School of Education; 392 in the William Rayen School of Engineering; and 257 in the College of Fine and Performing Arts.
