YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio - Youngstown State University's "Private Police Basic Training Course," cosponsored by the University's Criminal Justice Department, Campus Security and Office of Continuing Education, will be held April 12 through June 14.

The course will provide approved training to qualify participants for positions as special police, security guards, or privately employed police, as established by the Ohio Peace Officer Training Council.
