YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio - The third Annual Honors Exhibit at Youngstown State University's Kilcawley Center Art Gallery displays the artwork of five YSU graduating seniors.

The show opened Monday and continues through July 25.

A public reception for the artists is scheduled from 6-8 p.m. July 11 in the gallery.

Featured in the exhibit are the works of Noel Davis of Austintown, Curtis L. Harvey of Hubbard, Myung Lee of Liberty, Alberto Palma of Warren, and Kath M. Ramunno of Campbell. Their art was selected by the Studio Art Faculty of YSU's Art Department in the College of Fine and Performing Arts.

Davis' paintings have been displayed at the Butler Institute of American Art, in two <u>Graffiare</u> exhibits, an annual Student Show and in the Al Bright Studio and Gallery.

Harvey, a magna cum laude graduate and recipient of the Dean's Award, recently won the <u>Penguin Review</u> photo award. His work has been exhibited at YSU's Bliss Hall Gallery, the Butler Institute and at two Student Shows.

Lee received honorable mention for her work in the 50th Annual Student Show at Butler.

Palma, a member of the "National Dean's List," has had his work displayed at three <u>Graffiare</u> exhibits and three Student Art Shows. He has been accepted to the Art Center College of Design in Pasadena, Calif., to study transportation design. He plans a career in automotive design.

Ramunno, a cum laude graduate, has had her work displayed in two Student Art Shows and two <u>Graffiare</u> exhibitions in addition to a show at the YWCA. She is currently a student assistant for the Art Department and president of YSU Student Art Association.
