YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio - "Viva Mexico!" is the theme of Worldfest '87 April 20-25 at Youngstown State University.

Worldfest, held each year at the University, is dedicated to understanding and appreciating the world. This year, for the first time, the events focus on understanding the past, present and future perspectives of one nation.

All events are open to the public

In addition to entertainment, films and displays of Mexican art, artifacts and crafts, there will be a number of lectures and presentations.

Guest lecturers will include Gustavo Gonzalez-Baez, Mexican counselor for public affairs; Jorge C. Castaneda, journalist, author and scholar; Jose "Pepin" Hernandez Laos, artist, architect and photographer; and Carlos de Obeso, financier and educator. A number of YSU faculty members will also present programs.

Worldfest '87 is sponsored and arranged by a campus-community steering committee and coordinated by YSU's Office of International Student Services under Susan Khawaja. This year's events help mark the 50th anniversary of the Mexican Society of Youngstown. Also cooperating in the programs are the International Institute Foundation and the University's Spanish organizations.

Some 250 students from 50 countries are currently enrolled at YSU. The University is also involved in faculty and student exchange programs.

The Program Series at 8 p.m. Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday in the Ohio Room of Kilcawley Center will feature lectures by Gonzalez-Baez, Castaneda and Laos and de Obeso. The latter two are Wean Lecturers.

Gustavo Gonzalez-Baez is currently serving as Counselor for Political Affairs assigned to the Mexican Embassy in Washington, D.C. A lawyer and journalist, he has also served as the Mexican Secretariat of Public Education, Tourism and Commerce.

Presently a senior associate with the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace, Jorge Castaneda is also a journalist for PROCESO, a weekly Mexican paper; Le Monde Diplomatique, a monthly French paper; and Radio Canada. He has also served as the president of Political Science and Economics for the National Autonomous University of Mexico and advisor to Mexico's Foreign Ministry.

Jose "Pepin" Hernandez Laos, a painter who combines high technology with humanistic themes, has had his art work exhibited throughout the world. Before turning to painting, he had successful careers in architecture, education and photography. He is responsible for the design and construction of approximately 100 buildings in Guadalajara.

De Obeso has taught at Universidad Iberoamericana, the Universidad de Chihuahua and others, and has served in numerous local, state and national governmental positions.

One of the Worldfest highlights will be All Nations Day from 11 a.m. to 10 p.m. Friday, April 24, sponsored by the Federation of International Students.

There will be foods and crafts from around the world on display and for sale by students on the first floor of Kilcawley Center. There will also be intermittent live entertainment, including folk singers and dancers in traditional dress from France, Ireland, India, Australia, Arabia, Thailand, Pakistan, West Africa and Palestine.

All Nations Day will conclude events on campus. However, on Saturday Mariachi Zapopan, an authentic Mexican mariachi band, will play from 1 to 3 p.m. in Southern Park Mall.
