YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio - Youngstown State University's Engineering Student Societies Council recently named their "Man" and "Woman of the Year" at their annual dinner dance.

David J. Ray of New Castle, Pa., a recent civil engineering graduate, was named "Man of the Year."

Annette C. Kulifay of Poland, a chemical engineering major who will graduate in June, was named "Woman of the Year."

The Mahoning Valley Society of Professional Engineers also gave their annual Deetz Award to Miss Kulifay for having the highest grade point average. She won a handbook of her choice.

The Engineering Student Societies Council is an organization made up of the different student chapters of professional engineering societies in the William Rayen School of Engineering at YSU. They include: American Institute of Chemical Engineers, American Society of Civil Engineers, Institute of Electrical and Electronic Engineers, Institute of Industrial Engineers, American Society of Mechanical Engineers and the American Society of Metals.

The six societies, each representing the curricula in the school, nominated one candidate for each award. The candidates submitted a resume and written statement of goals and were interviewed by a panel of two judges and Dr. George Sutton of Poland, Dean of the School of Engineering.

The judges were David Moore of LTV, a graduate in metallurgical engineering from YSU, and Pat Kiraly of Packard Electric Division of General Motors Corp., 1983-84 "Man of the Year."

YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio - The Masters of Business Administration program of Youngstown State University's Warren P. Williamson, Jr. School of Business is sponsoring a symposium on MBA career options from 6-7:30 p.m. Wednesday, May 14.

Included in the symposium will be the session, "What Can I Do With An MBA?" which will feature four MBA graduates from YSU.
