

Born in Quito, Ecuador in 1977, Washington Garcia began his musical studies at the age of six. The success of his first public performance at age six led him to perform at the most important cultural centers in Quito. As a young teenager, Mr. Garcia was already a seasoned veteran of the concert platform, having performed extensively throughout his native country. Four times he has been soloist with the National Symphony Orchestra of Ecuador, performing concertas by Mozart, Tchaikovsky, Beethoven, and Grieg.

At the early ages of eighteen and twenty, Mr. Garcia obtained his Bachelor and Master of Music Degrees from the National Conservatory of Music in Quito and the Johns Hopkins University in Baltimore respectively. He was chosen by the Kennedy Center to receive one of two grants awarded to pianists in its Fellowships of the Americas Program. As a result of this award, he was able to come to the United States in the spring of 1996 to begin intensive piano studies with Professor Julian Martin at the Peabody Institute. He is currently a full scholarship Doctorate student of Professor Martin.

With the support of the Fellowships of the Americas Program, he was invited to play at the Kennedy Center Terrace Theater, the Organization of American States (O.A.S.) in Washington, D.C. as well as the World Bank and the Corcoran Gallery of Art.

Mr. Garcia, under the auspices of Continental Airline, was invited to perform in Israel with Maestro Sam Zebba and the campus orchestra of the city of Tel-Aviv. He also performed a solo recital at the Felicia Blumental Music Center in Tel-Aviv.

Future engagements include a performance with the Peabody Symphony Orchestra as the winner of the Harrison L. Winter Piano Concerto Competition held at Peabody this past February. He will also perform solo recitals in Quito, Ecuador and Washington, D.C. at the Inter-American Development Bank.

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

About the Artists

Dr. David McClune is Professor of Woodwinds and Director of Bands at Union University in Jackson, TN. He has graduate degrees in clarinet performance from Florida State University and Bowling Green State University. McClune's has studied with Frank Kowalsky, Edward Marks, Robert Fitzer and Richard Yeager. An active performer, McClune plays with the Jackson Symphony, Memphis Symphony, Paducha Symphony and as a woodwind doubler for touring musicals at the Orpheum Theater in Memphis.

Dr. Terry McRoberts is Professor of Piano at Union University and teaches private and class piano, and is coordinator of keyboard for the Music Department. His degrees are from Manchester College, Youngstown State University, and Ball State University. He performs regularly as a soloist, a collaborative musician, and as a member of the Jackson Symphony Orchestra.

PROGRAM NOTES:

Three Places in New Haven: Concerto for Marimba, Percussion, and Wind Ensemble by Thomas C. Duffy, BMI

Charles Ives spent four years on the Yale campus in New Haven, Connecticut, from 1894-1898. Many of the places that he frequented are still intact. Each movement of the *Three Places in New Haven: Concerto for Marimba, Percussion and Wind Ensemble* by Thomas C. Duffy, BMI addresses one particular place in New Haven. Each is frequented or visited by Rollo, Ives' fictional character of lowest-common denominator aesthetic sophistication and taste.

Castle in the Sky (Rollo Reads a Book) Yale's library was built by stone mansions and is set in a gothic style. The workers took left over materials and, instead of constructing ventilation boxes on the roof in the traditional square-box fashion, covered the air vents with a miniature medieval castle, complete with flying buttresses and cobbled walls. From some distance, one can see this castle, perched curiously on the top of a ten-story building. It floats above Yale's Cross Campus green-space, where students go to sit on the grass after studying.

In this movement, one hears the opening bustle of students scurrying to class. The motives are made of Charles Ives' name through the ancient technique of soggeto cavato (carved subject). C=c, H=b, A=a, R=re=d, L=la=f, E=e, S=Eb, and I=ti=b. Thus, the Ives motive is c, b, a, d, a, e, eb, b. The scurrying fades to reveal the quiet contemplative sounds of students at work)[Yale's' alma mater, Bright College Years [Die Wacht Am Rhein]]. Students run for the library before it closes and one hears the clock tower sounding the warning for doors to close. Once inside, students set to work and the solo marimba presents a 4-part hymn.

However, Rollo has a very short attention span. As the monotony of reading begins to affect him, he daydreams. The sounds of student life outside begin to invade his consciousness. In fact, he wonders why he studies at all—what's the use? (The metaphysical question is presented by the trumpet—in the style of a question that 'may never be answered'). Eventually, Rollo fantasizes that a military maneuver is taking place in the castle in the sky—one hears the sounds of percussion marching troops here and there. The solo marimba attempts to 'question' Rollo's daydream, and things end with neither an answer to the question nor a firm sense of whether the dream is real or the reality a dream.

The Long Wharf extends far out into the shallow New Haven harbor, and had for many years been the place where ships loaded and unloaded their produce and other goods. This was the harbor into which the British sailed during the Revolutionary War (and a few patriots fired a cannon at the British ships; their aim was so poor that the British reported that they conquered New Haven unchallengedl). The harbor also is the one of Savin Rock, for years New Haven's miniature version of Coney Island. Now the New Haven Green is far inland from the harbor's water. Before a century of land fill, the church in which Ives played the organ was very close to the shore itself, close enough for the sounds of the church's bells to be heard on the water.

Rollo opts to spend Sunday morning not in church, but sailing on the harbor. The sun comes up on the peaceful waters of the harbor and Rollo floats about in a state of blissful detachment. Rollo dozes on the boat, here and there one (and perhaps he) hears the sounds of the church service—the hymn that wafts out over the harbor contains a message—it is *Wachet Auf* (Sleepers Wakel).

City Band March is homage paid to Charles Ives' *Country Band March*, and follows the form if its country cousin, including a da capo exposition and a 'coda' in which things become complicated.

The city of New Haven was home to Eli Whitney, the innovator who brought the concept of mass production to life. During Ives' time in New Haven, industry boomed and citizens enjoyed a fine mass transportation system founded on a network of trains and trolley cars. The music represents the sounds of a city at work, busily producing "things," some of metal, some needing to be stamped out, and some requiring much repetitive attention.

Rollo works in a factory and dreams throughout the workday of the pleasant train ride home to the country. He himself is a 'mass product.' He dresses like everyone else, he rides the train in like everyone else, and at day's end, he joins the long trudging line of automatons as the 'masses' move in synchronicity, coming and going to their assigned jobs (hear their robot-like cadence, two quarter-notes, two eighth-notes, and one quarter-notel).

Does the piece end with Rollo boarding a train that increasingly speeds him home, or is it his imagination—the acceleration representing his increasing desperation to be out of the factory and on his own? You decide.

Guest Artist: Robert van Sice

Robert van Sice has rapidly become today's most exciting performer of contemporary marimba music. To date he has premiered over one hundred works, including concertos, chamber music and solos throughout the world.

In his varied performing career, Mr. van Sice has made solo appearances with symphony orchestras and given recitals in Europe. North America. Africa, and the Far East. In 1989, he gave the first full-length marimba recital at the Concertgebouw in Amsterdam and a return visit is planned with the English composer James Woods' Spirit Festival with Lamentations. This work marks the introduction of his newly developed quarter-tone marimba to the concert schedule, a unique and innovative instrument that brings the marimba closer to its traditional roots, while establishing new parameters of modern expressionism. Additionally, he has played recitals in most of Europe's major concert halls, many of which have been broadcast by the BBC, Swedish Radio, Norwegian Radio, WDR and Radio France. He is now frequently invited as a soloist with Europe's leading contemporary music ensembles, including London Sinfonietta, Ensemble Contrechamps and L'Itineraire in Paris. Mr. van Sice has appeared at the Archipel, Darmstadt, London Meltdown, Ars Musica, Mexico City, Norfolk, Bartok and North American Music festivals among many others. Mr. van Sice recently returned to the stage with renowned flutist Ransom Wilson, a European tour with the Hungarian percussion quartet Amadinda, and a solo tour of Japan.

Robert van Sice is today one of the world's most sought after teachers. In July of 1977, he was appointed as Director of the Percussion Department at the Yale School of Music as well as Professor of Percussion at the Peabody conservatory in September of 1998. From 1988 to 1997, he headed Europe's first diploma program for solo marimbists at the Rotterdam's Conservatorium. Mr. van Sice has given masterclasses in over 20 countries and frequently visits the major conservatories in Europe and North America as a guest lecturer.

Robert van Sice has released four CDs on the Etcetera and Mode record labels. Adams Percussion (distributed in the U.S. by Pearl) sponsors Mr. van Sice.

Dr. Glenn Shaft is assistant professor of percussion and has served as Director of Percussion Studies at YSU since 1996 where he directs the Percussion Ensemble, teaches private and small group lessons, and directs a Jazz Combo. In 2001 he founded and directed the YSU Afro-Cuban Arts Festival.

He is an in-demand performer, educator, clinician, and lecturer whose versatility includes classical percussion, contemporary music, jazz and commercial drumming, and Latin percussion. His expertise includes over 25 years of professional performance and teaching experience.

Mr. Schaft was awarded three percussion performance degrees including the Doctor of Musical Arts from the University of Illinois at Champaign-Urbana, the Master of Arts from Eastern Illinois University, and the Bachelor of Music from the Baldwin-Wallace College Conservatory of Music in Cleveland, Ohio. During his formal training he won numerous academic and music scholarship auditions and was the Concerto Competition Winner at Baldwin-Wallace College Conservatory in 1981. He served as percussion and jazz graduate teaching assistant at Eastern Illinois University and at the University of Illinois.

Dr. Schaft has studied with Tom Siwe at the University of Illinois, Johnny Lee Lane at Eastern Illinois University, George Kiteley at Baldwin-Wallace Conservatory, Tom Freer and Jay Burnham of the Cleveland Orchestra, and Harold Damas - Cleveland jazz drummer and vibraphonist. He studied Afro-Cuban percussion at the National School of the Arts in Havana, Cuba through a grant from the Ohio Arts Council and at the Berklee College of Music World Percussion Festival with Giovanni Hidalgo, Horacio Hernandez, Glen Velez, Jamie Haddad, and Trichi Sankaran. He pursued post doctoral graduate studies at Cleveland State University where he studied contemporary chamber music and served as a Graduate Assistant managing the New Music Associates - a professional chamber ensemble in residence there. He has attended hundreds of percussion clinics and master classes and is an active member of the Percussive Arts Society having served as a lecturer, clinician, performer, member of the College Curriculum Committee, Drum Set Curriculum Committee, Membership Officer, and has attended the annual PAS international Conventions since 1982

From 1988-94, he performed in Cleveland, Ohio with the world percussion quartet BATTU, toured and recorded contemporary American music with the Cleveland Chamber Symphony, Cleveland Ballet, Cleveland Opera, Ohio Chamber Orchestra, and appeared as concerto soloist with the Baldwin-Wallace Conservatory Symphony Orchestra.

Other major engagements have included the 1999 Percussive Arts Society International Convention in Columbus, Colorado Music Festival in Boulder, Youngstown Symphony Orchestra, Akron Symphony Orchestra, Concerto Soloist with the YSU Symphonic Wind Ensemble, Skaneateles (NY) Chamber Music Festival, Duluth-Superior Symphony, Lake Superior Chamber Orchestra, Ohio Chamber Orchestra, Robert Page Singers, Ohio Music Educators Convention, Minnesota Music Educators Convention, and Soloist with the Champaign-Urbana Symphony. He has presented numerous faculty solo and chamber music recitals including Baldwin-Wallace College, University of Minnesota Duluth, North Dakota State University, Moorhead State University, Concordia College, and Youngstown State University.

Dr. Schaft's diverse drum set experience includes the Cleveland Jazz Orchestra, Chip Stevens Trio, YSU Faculty Jazz Group, 1940's Radio Hour Show - United States Tour, Chuck Berry, Dan Wall, Ernie Krivda, Marvin Stamm, Todd Coolman, Nick Brignola, John Fedchok, Harold Danko, Randy Johnston, Don Menza, Brian Lynch, Jerry Coker, Ralph Lalama, Anthony Cox, Tommy Dorsey Band, Les Elgart, Larry Elgart, Red Skeleton, Englebert Humperdink, Mitch Miller, The Four Lads, The Four Aces, Nelson Riddle, and the world premiere of Stuart Copland's opera "Holy Blood and Crescent Moon" with the Cleveland Opera. He has recorded with the Cleveland Chamber Symphony, Cleveland Opera, Scott Wyatt, the Air Force Band of Mid-America, and numerous commercial jingles. He was born in Berea, Ohio and presently lives in Poland, Ohio with his wife Sara a professional violinist, and their twin boys - Lewis and Karl.

Thomas C. Duffy

Thomas C. Duffy is Associate Dean of the School of Music and Director of Bands at Yale University, as well as Visiting Music Director of the Hartt Symphony Band. He received the Bachelor of Science in Music Education (magna cum laude) and Master of Musical Arts in Composition from the University of Connecticut, and his Doctor of Musical Arts in Composition from Cornell University, where he studied with Karel Husa and Steven Stucky. He has taught music courses at the Hartford Conservatory, the University of Connecticut, the Auburn Maximum Security Correctional Facility, Cornell University, and Yale University.

Recordings and performances of Mr. Duffy's music include those by college bands, orchestras, and wind ensembles throughout the world. Mr. Duffy has conducted bands and orchestras throughout the United States, Japan, England, France, Ireland, and Italy.

He has served as president of the New England College Band Association, president of the CBDNA (College Band Directors National Association) Eastern Division, president of Connecticut Composers Inc., publicity cochairman for the World Association of Symphonic Bands and Ensembles,

chairman of the Connecticut Music Educators Association Professional Affairs and Government Relations Committees, and a member of American Composers Alliance, BMI, and the American Bandmasters Association. Mr. Duffy represents music education in Yale's Teacher Preparation Program. American Composers Alliance, Ludwig Music and Bourne Company Music Publishers publish his music. In 1996, the Connecticut Music Educators Association selected Mr. Duffy as Outstanding Music Educator of the Year.

Duffy's first influence, Charles Whittenberg, was hailed at one point as the primary American scion of the second Viennese School. While studying with Whittenberg, he worked in depth with serialism and ordering of all parameters of music. Duffy attended Cornell University, attracted by Karel Husa's unique combination of the art of musical composition with themes of contemporary importance. Duffy first came into contact with Husa's quarter-tones and proportional notation as a saxophonist in the University of Connecticut Wind Ensemble. While at Cornell, he also studied with Steven Stucky, from whom he contracted an interest in the music of Dallapiccola, Ligeti, Reich, Glass, Xenekis, and Lutoslawski. Stephen L. Gage

Stephen L. Gage is Director of Bands, Instrumental Music Coordinator, and Associate Professor of Music at Youngstown State University (YSU). He earned a doctorate at the University of Illinois: Urbana-Champaign, a masters degree at the Eastman School of Music, and a bachelors degree and a Performer's Certificate in Percussion at the State University of New York at Fredonia. Prior to his current position, Dr. Gage was the Director of Bands at Emporia State University (KS) and was the Director of Bands at Auburn High School in upstate New York. At YSU he conducts the Symphonic Wind Ensemble and teaches undergraduate and graduate conducting.

Dr. Gage is currently serving in his ninth season as the music director and conductor of the Youngstown Symphony Youth Orchestra (YSYO). He has numerous publications including articles in the *Kansas Music Review Journal*, in the Ohio Music Educators Journal, *TRIAD*, and in the *National Band Association* (NBA) *Journal* and *NBA Newsletter*. He has been a member of the NBA School Reform Committee, the ABA Ostwald Selection Committee and is currently in his fourth year as the NBA North Central Division Chair. His many professional credits include serving as a guest conductor, clinician, and adjudicator for all state, sectional, regional, and district high school concert bands and orchestras across the United States and Canada. Gage also recently guest conducted the U.S. Army Band: *Pershing's Own* and the U.S. Army Field Band.

Under his direction the YSU Symphonic Wind Ensemble (SWE) and the YSYO were guest performers at the 1998 and 2000 OMEA State Music Convention. In April of 2002 the SWE will appear as a feature ensemble at the Music Educators National Association (MENC) Biennial 2002 Convention in Nashville, Tennessee. The SWE also was a guest performer at the 1996 CBDNA Convention in Green Bay, Wisconsin. The SWE released its first produced compact disc, Lions, Jesters and Dragons, Oh My in the fall of 1998 and its second CD project, Star Wars and Other Scores was released in December 2000. A third CD will be recorded in the spring of 2002 for a November 2002 release. Gage's groups have also performed at state music conventions in Kansas and New York. He serves on the Board of Advisors for the St. Patrick's Day Festival in Dublin, Ireland, and in May of 1999 he was selected as Distinguished Professor at YSU. Professor Gage's biography has been listed on two occasions in the Who Among America's Teachers Journal.

In addition to his conducting career, Dr. Gage has performed with the Erie Philharmonic (PA), the Champaign-Urbana Symphony Orchestra (IL), the Youngstown Symphony Orchestra (OH), and the Jimmy Dorsey Jazz Orchestra; and he was a marimba concerto soloist with the Fredonia Symphony Orchestra. From 1987-89 he served as the President of the International Association of Jazz Educators–New York State Chapter.

Dr. Gage's professional affiliations include a March 1999 induction into the prestigious American Bandmasters Association (ABA). He is also a member of the CBDNA, NBA, OMEA/MENC, Kappa Kappa Psi, Kappa Delta Pi, Phi Beta Mu, and Phi Kappa Phi. Stephen lives in Poland, Ohio with his wife, Stephanie, sons Matthew and Brendan, and daughter Claudia.

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



About the Artist

A specialist in Spanish repertoires, her recording of Iberia was placed on the *New York Times* recommended listening list. "Her fine feeling for line and the sense of a tradition handed down from the composer to Ricardo Vines, Blanche Selva, Frank Marshall and Ms. De Larrocha."

Benita Meshulam received her early musical training from Sidney Foster in Bloomington, IN. After studying piano with Karen Shaw and chamber music with Janos Starker and Gyorgy Sebok at Indiana University, she moved to New York to complete her studies with Richard Goode and Bernard Rose. Benita's recitals have taken her throughout her native United States and Europe. Her performances include Merkin Hall, Steinway Hall, The Spanish Institute, Rockefeller University, and Sarah Lawrence University. Ms. Meshulam's performances of "Goyescas" of Granados have taken her to Toulouse, Boulogne sur Gesse, and Terme d'Armagnac in France as well as the Dame Myra Hess Series in Chicago and Merkin Hall in New York.

Ms. Meshulam feels a particular affinity for the music of Albeniz and Granados. Her family's Sephardic tradition and language date back to roots in pre-Christian Spain. The depth and intensity of her approach to Spanish music have astounded audiences for well over a decade. The Record Geijutsu of Japan stated, "Meshulam's impressive performance displays extraordinarily the difficult work with excellent technique, well-rounded rhythmical breathing, clearly phrased singing, admirably expressed dynamic range from ppp to fff as Albeniz marked—it is a marvelous job."

Concerto for Piano and Orchestra in B flat major, No. 2, Op. 83
Johannes Brahms
(1833-1897)



This concerto was the most expansive written up until this time. The usual three movements is replaced by four, structurally resembling a symphony. Eduard Hanslick labeled this concerto as a "symphony with piano obligato".

Considering this rivals the most difficult

of concertos, a symphony for piano and orchestra seems more fitting.

Brahms began sketching thematic material as early as 1878, after a trip to Italy with his friend, Viennese surgeon Theodor Billroth. Brahms did not return to this work again until 1881 after another trip to Italy. Only two months later he completed the score on July 7, 1881. Unlike his first piano concerto this would be an instant success.

Brahms was the soloist for the premiere at Redouten Saal, Budapest on November 9, 1881. Alexander Erkel conducted the Budapest Philharmonic. This concerto has become one of the best loved and revered concertos in the standard repertoire.

Symphonic Metamorphosis on Themes of Carl Maria von Weber (1943)

Paul Hindemith (1895-1963)



Symphonic Metamorphosis was written in 1943, when Hindemith was teaching at Yale University. He never revealed the source of these themes, but they can all be found in a book of piano duets by Weber.

Hindemith developed this work in a neo-Baroque style which became the trend in the 1920s. This trend faded out, but Hindemith continued to compose under its

influence in all his future works, including the Symphonic Metamorphosis. The premier of Symphonic Metamorphosis was given by the New York Philharmonic in Carnegie Hall on January 24, 1944. Artur Rodzinski conducted.

The following notes are extracted from, The New York Philharmonic Guide to the Orchestra:

- Allegro. The jaunty opening movement is based on the fourth of Weber's Huit pieces, Opus 60, for piano duet.
- II. Turandot Scherzo: Moderato. The distant ancestor of this exotic movement is an old Chinese melody. This is the basis of a theme on which Hindemith composed a set of eight variations building to a big climax.
- III. Andantino. This charming lyric interlude in the style of a slow Siciliano is based on the second piece in Weber's six Pièces faciles for piano duet, Opus 3, Book 2.
- IV. The march-finale follows very closely the model of the "Marcia," which is No. 7 of Weber's Huit pieces, Opus 60. Hindemith's fidelity to his model includes even the contrasting trio section of Weber's "Marcia." Thereafter, Hindemith greatly extends the material into a true metamorphosis.

Music Director



William B. Slocum received the bachelor of fine arts and master of music degrees from the University of New Mexico and earned an artist's diploma at the Julliard School of Music where he studied French horn with James Chambers.

William Slocum is a member of the faculty of the Dana School of Music of Youngstown State University. At the

Dana School he is music director of the Dana Symphony Orchestra, professor of French horn, and a member of the Dana Faculty Brass Quintet. He is also a lecturer in conducting, symphonic literature and the history of art and music.

Previously, Mr. Slocum was conductor of the Cheyenne Symphony Orchestra in Wyoming. He played principal horn in the Buffalo Philharmonic under Josef Krips, toured Japan under Leonard Bernstein, Europe and South America under Zubin Mehta with the New York Philharmonic Orchestra and toured under George Szell while he was member of the Cleveland Orchestra.

Slocum has conducted numerous district, region and state orchestras. During the summer of 1994 he appeared as guest conductor with the Aguascalientes Symphony Orchestra in Mexico performing a program devoted entirely to the music of Manuel de Falla.

In May, 2000 Slocum was the guest artist at the Horn Swoggle in New Mexico, where he played a solo horn recital, conducted master classes and conducted the professional ensemble. He was guest professor of horn at the Harid Conservatory in Boca Raton, Florida, and most recently played extra horn with the New York Philharmonic Orchestra.

Slocum has appeared on two compact disc recordings issued through the Dana Recording Project. One compact disc "The Expressive Horn" consists of music for horn and piano and the other, "Apocalypse", is a recording of the Dana Brass Quintet.

Currently Slocum is serving in the twenty-first season as music director of the Cleveland Philharmonic Orchestra.



Caroline Oltmanns receives recognition for performances in the United States as well as abroad. Reviews rave about her "focused and heartfelt emotion" (L'Alsace, France); her "mature creativity" (Fürther Zeitung, Germany) and her "finesse, power and liveliness" (Dernières Nouvelles d'Alsace). Recital venues in Europe have included the Stadttheater Fürth, Germany

and Festival International de Piano Franz Liszt, France. Performances in the United States have included the Cleveland Institute of Music; the Redlands Bowl, Redlands, CA; Ohio University in Athens, OH and Music from Stan Hywet, Akron, OH. She was featured as soloist with the Cleveland Philharmonic Orchestra. Her most recent recital tour of South Africa included performances at the Universities of Potchefstroom and Johannesburg. Caroline Oltmanns' latest solo CD features works by Haydn, Schumann, Liszt and Sonata in f minor op. 5 by J. Brahms.

Ms. Oltmanns' playing has been heard on radio stations KUSC and KKGO Los Angeles; FMR Cape Town, South Africa; WKSU in Kent, OH; WXXI in Rochester, NY; WYSU in Youngstown, OH; and WQED, Pittsburgh, PA. Radio interviews in Germany have been broadcast on Norddeutscher and Süddeutscher Rundfunk; Radio Bremen; Hessischer Rundfunk and Westdeutscher Rundfunk. Televised interviews include KVCR-TV, San Bernadino, CA; Bayerisches Fernsehen and other stations.

Dr. Oltmanns is a Fulbright Scholar, she received an Annette Kade Foundation Scholarship and a Stipendium der deutschen Wirtschaft. Her primary teachers were John Perry and Robert Levin. She currently teaches at Youngstown State University where she joined the faculty in 1994.



Katherine Hoover is herself a flutist. She has specialized in composing works inspired by Native American subjects as is the case in *Winter Spirits*.

The two *Night Thoughts* were inspired by the color illustrations of William Blake, especially those he did for Edward Young's *Night Thoughts on Life, Death, and Immortality. Night Thoughts I* was written when the composer was in his early teens. It is a short Theme and Variations. *Night Thoughts II* is a short etude that explores cross rhythms of three against five while using an alternating scale and blues scale elements.

Twentieth-Century composer Pierre Octave Ferroud had a strong interest in Asian culture. "Bergère captive" depicts the Chinese shepherds that were captured and made prisoners during the war, and the melancholic melodies that they sang and played at night. Toan-Yan or the "Festival of the Double Five" is celebrated in China the fifth day of the fifth month to remember the heroes that drowned themselves to avoid military dishonor. The contrasting dance-like and solemn sections represent the contrast between peace and war. The piece includes an original Chinese theme usually played with a bamboo beak flute.

PROGRAM NOTES

"The Inferno" and "The Ascension" are the first and third movements of a four movement work entitled "The Divine Comedy", based on the Dante Alighieri's literary classic of the same name. The story of Dante's trilogy is very basic: one day Dante finds himself lost in a dark wood. Virgil, a character based on the revered Roman poet, appears and rescues him. Virgil guides Dante to a contemplation of Hell and Purgatory. Dante, having confessed his faults, and with Beatrice as his guide, is led into Paradise and attains a glimpse of God.

Stephen L. Gage, conductor

Stephen L. Gage is Director of Bands, Instrumental Music Coordinator, and Associate Professor of Music at Youngstown State University (YSU). He earned a doctorate at the University of Illinois: Urbana-Champaign, a masters degree at the Eastman School of Music, and a bachelors degree and a Performer's Certificate in Percussion at the State University of New York at Fredonia. Prior to his current position, Dr. Gage was the Director of Bands at Emporia State University (KS) and was the Director of Bands at Auburn High School in upstate New York. At YSU he conducts the Symphonic Wind Ensemble and teaches undergraduate and graduate conducting.

Dr. Gage is currently serving in his ninth season as the music director and conductor of the Youngstown Symphony Youth Orchestra (YSYO). He has numerous publications including articles in the *Kansas Music Review Journal*, in the Ohio Music Educators Journal, *TRIAD*, and in the *National Band Association* (NBA) *Journal* and *NBA Newsletter*. He has been a member of the NBA School Reform Committee, the ABA Ostwald Selection Committee and is currently in his fourth year as the NBA North Central Division Chair. His many professional credits include serving as a guest conductor, clinician, and adjudicator for all state, sectional,

regional, and district high school concert bands and orchestras across the United States and Canada. Gage also recently guest conducted the U.S. Army Band: *Pershing's Own* and the U.S. Army Field Band.

Under his direction the YSU Symphonic Wind Ensemble (SWE) and the YSYO were quest performers at the 1998 and 2000 OMEA State Music Convention. In April of 2002 the SWE will appear as a feature ensemble at the Music Educators National Association (MENC) Biennial 2002 Convention in Nashville, Tennessee. The SWE also was a quest performer at the 1996 CBDNA Convention in Green Bay, Wisconsin. The SWE released its first produced compact disc, Lions, Jesters and Dragons, Oh My in the fall of 1998 and its second CD project, Star Wars and Other Scores was released in December 2000. A third CD will be recorded in the spring of 2002 for a November 2002 release. Gage's groups have also performed at state music conventions in Kansas and New York. He serves on the Board of Advisors for the St. Patrick's Day Festival in Dublin, Ireland, and in May of 1999 he was selected as Distinguished Professor at YSU. Professor Gage's biography has been listed on two occasions in the's Who Among America's Teachers Journal.



PROGRAM NOTES

The Firebird was the first of the great trilogy of ballets that Stravinsky wrote between 1909 and 1913 for Diaghilev's Ballets Russes company in Paris. He started to compose it in November 1909 and completed it in May 1910, a month before the first performance. As he later recalled, he "attended every rehearsal with the company. . . after rehearsals Diaghilev, Nijinsky (who, however, was not dancing the ballet) and myself generally ended the day with a fine dinner, washed down with good claret". Stravinsky was anxious to succeed with this first important commission, and succeed he did. The work, which can be seen as marking the beginning of his artistic maturity, made him famous, and further commissions for *Petrushka* and *The Rite of Spring* followed rapidly.

In order to make the score usable in the concert hall, Stravinsky made three different suites from the complete ballet at different times: one in 1911, another in 1919 (the version performed this evening), and a final one in 1945. While the suite uses the same instrumentation as the ballet and simply provides endings for each movement (the score printed from that of the ballet), the second and third suites rework the music for a smaller band.

The story of *The Firebird* is based on two Russian fairy-tales. The Firebird, brilliantly colored symbol of goodness, and Katschei, a green-taloned ogre who represents evil, vie for the soul of the young prince Ivan Tsarevich. Only the Firebird knows how to break the spell Katschei has woven, by opening the egg-shaped casket, which contains his soul. That achieved, the prince is released, and the other signs of Katschei's triumph—men turned into stone, maidens held captive—are also reversed. The prince is betrothed to his beloved Tsarevna.

This setting of The Firebird Suite (1919) was done by Randy Earles and edited by Frederick Fennell.

Bernard Goldberg, Flute

Bernard Goldberg, honored leading flute performer and teacher, is Principal Flute Laureate of the Pittsburgh Symphony Orchestra, where he was Principal Flutist from 1947 to 1993.

Marcel Moyse said of Mr. Goldberg: "Sans doute mon successeur." Mr. Goldberg has often been soloist at the world's leading music festivals, including Mostly Mozart, Casals, Marlboro, Edinburgh, Prades and Carnegie Hall. He studied with Kiburz, Torno, Barrere, Lavaillotte and Moyse. Mr. Goldberg studied Bach with Alexanian and coached privately with Pablo Casals.

Mr. Goldberg, founding conductor of the Three Rivers Young People's Orchestra, presently conducts the McKeesport Symphony and teaches at Brooklyn College and City University of New York. As a conductor, Goldberg has led the Duquesne University Opera Workshop, the Westmoreland Symphony Orchestra, the Brooklyn Heights Music Society and the Edgewood Symphony Orchestra. He has recordings on the Capitol, Columbia, Command, Cook, Priceless, Harmony Hall, Turnabout and MMC labels.

Dr. Grover Pitman, French Hom

Dr. Grover Pittman has performed professionally with Leon Fleisher, Ezra Rachlin, Victor Allesandro, Henry Mancini, André Previn, David Effron, and Ísiaiah Jackson, all well-known conductors. A charter member of the well-known Annapolis Brass Quintet, he has also performed extensively in professional orchestras (the San Antonio, Austin, Annapolis, Charlotte, and Youngstown Symphony Orchestras), opera orchestras (San Antonio and Charlotte), and in solo recitals in several states and in Europe.

Dr. Pitman's formal educational background culminated in the Doctor of Philosophy degree in Historical Musicology from The Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C. His doctoral dissertation was an in-depth study of Gregorian Chant as practiced and notated in the eleventh and twelfth centuries in the medieval province of Aquitaine. His continuing post-doctoral work has taken him to the Monastery of Solesmes in south-western France, the Biblioteque Nationale in Paris, the British Museum in London, and Old Sarum in southwest England, to name a few.

Dr. Pitman is in his thirty-first year of teaching at the college level. He is currently the Chair of the Department of Music at Westminster College, New Wilmington, PA. Dr. Pitman teaches Music History, Introduction to Music, Introduction to Classic Jazz, and Studio French Horn. He has taught music at Westminster College, Muskingum College, Winthrop College, and Fredericksburg High School. Besides teaching, Dr. Pitman enjoys performing live music, demonstrating new high-technology equipment and methods, and transcribing ancient music manuscripts.

Dr. Pitman believes that students choosing a profession in the arts should become highly proficient and knowledgeable in their chosen field. They should become self-reliant and confident in their own abilities, and they should be able to work cooperatively in group settings. To perform well, one must combine academic knowledge of composers' lives and works, historical backgrounds, historical performance practices, and technical requirements with mechanical expertise on one's instrument, with interpretive skills, and with emotional content and feeling.

Gladys Stein, Piano

Glays Stein is an honor graduate of the Julliard School of Music, where she studied with Rosina Lhevinne and later became her teaching assistant. In 1985 Ms. Stein's article on Lhevinne was published in the Piano Quarterly. As a recipient of the Fulbright and Rockefeller grants, she studied and performed in Austria, where she did research on the music of Franz Schubert.

She performed at the Tanglewood and Aspen Festivals (the latter on the recommendation of Leonard Bernstein) and has given recitals in Israel and Poland. She has also given four Carnegie Hall recitals, including a critically acclaimed performance devoted to Schubert's three posthumous piano sonatas.

Her recordings have been featured on Warsaw Radio and on radio stations in Germany and Finland. Ms. Stein previously taught at SUNY in Binghampton, then joined the Duquesne faculty in Pittsburgh, where she is Professor of Piano.


