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Antanas Smetona, pianist

Antanas Smetona, grandson and namesake of the last president of Lithuania, was born in Paris, France. With the outbreak of World War II, his parents came to the United States and settled in Cleveland, Ohio, where the young pianist made his first public appearance in 1945.

Following the completion of his musical studies at the Cleveland Music School Settlement in 1965, where he was the only pianist to be awarded a Certificate of Accomplishment that year, he studied at the Mannes College of Music in New York City, where he received in 1961 the degree of Bachelor of Science. Subsequently, he was accepted as a scholarship student by the Juilliard School of Music where he was awarded the Master of Science degree in 1963. Concurrent with his graduation from Juilliard he was awarded a Fulbright Grant, and in 1965 and 1966 held a grant from the German Academic Exchange Service. In 1966 he received a grant from the Martha Baird Rockefeller Fund for Music and 1967 was awarded the Alfred Hertz Memorial Prize in Music by the University of California (Berkeley). Mr. Smetona has received distinctions in international piano competitions in Vercelli, Geneva, and Paris. He was a student of Leonard Shure for ten years and also worked at the Mannes College with Mme. Nadia Reisenberg. At Juilliard he was a student of Rosina Lhevinne.

Since making his orchestral debut in Cleveland in 1954, he has concertized extensively throughout the United States and Europe, both as a recitalist, and with orchestras in Chicago (Chicago Symphony), New York (Symphony of the Air), Hamburg, Germany (Hamburger Symphoniker), Frankfurt, Germany (Live telecast of the Tchaikovsky B-flat minor Piano Concerto), and other cities.

GUEST ARTIST

Miss Marcellene Hawk, well-known pianist in the Youngstown and Cleveland area, has had numerous national and international appearances as recitalist, soloist with orchestra, (such as the Bach Festival at Berea), chamber music performer (frequently with members of the Cleveland Orchestra, and as Artist-in-Residence at Allegheny Festival, with members of the Philadelphia String Quartet), accompanist and lecture-recitalist in recent recitals in Cleveland, Buffalo, New Hampshire, Pennsylvania, and Town Hall, New York. She has appeared in two series sponsored by the General Studies Division of Case-Western Reserve University - "The Pianist and His Art", shared with Arthur Loesser, Theodore Lettvin, and Eunice Podis, and "Contemporary Changes in the Arts"; Contemporary Music Series of the Cleveland Museum of Art, Haydn Trio Series sponsored by the Cleveland Public Library, and a radio series on WCLV - Cleveland. Additional specialized concerts include a series of Children's Concerts, both solo and ensemble, at the Supplimentary Education Center in Cleveland.

Among her recital appearances this season are, the opening concert of the C. S. U. Artist Series - a "recital of piano music circa 1910", recitals in New York, Missouri, Cleveland, and Youngstown Jewish Center Series, and solo and chamber music concerts at the Cleveland Music School Settlement.

PROGRAM NOTES

OBERON was Weber's last work. It was first produced in 1826 in London with the composer conducting. The opera is a whimsical affair in which Titania, Oberon, and Puck of Shakespeare's "A Midsummer Night's Dream" appear.

Though OBERON was the work of a dying man, it bears no traces of mental exhaustion. It is delightfully fresh, original, and entirely different from all of Weber's previous compositions. The keynote of OBERON is its picture of the mysteries of elfland and the life of the spirits of earth, water, and air. Weber also touches this note in DER FREISCHUTZ and EURYANTHE, but only in OBERON is it struck with full force. The overture, which contains motives form the opera, is frequently performed in orchestral concerts.

CONCERTO NO. 24 IN C MINOR FOR PIANO AND ORCHESTRA, K. 491 W. A. MOZART

Mozart's C minor Concerto was completed by March twenty-fourth, 1786. It was written to be performed by the composer, and was never published during his lifetime. A somber and powerful work, it rarely departs from a mood of quiet desperation.

The entrance of the solo piano after a full one hundred bars of orchestral introduction is impressive and meaningful by virtue of its long delay. The rest of the first movement follows strict classical form, with an agitated development section and a recapitulation followed by a short coda. After the brooding first movement, the Larghetto, in E flat major, forms a lovely relief. Its choir-like effect is enhanced by the accompaniment of the wind section. The third movement, a theme and variations, returns to a despairing mood. The theme is simple and poised, and its variations are imaginative and masterfully contrived. The cadenzas for the first and last movements are Miss Hawk's own.

SYMPHONY NO. 5 IN F MAJOR, OPUS 76 ANTONIN DVORAK

Dvořák's fifth symphony was written in 1875, when the composer was thirty-four years of age. It was first performed in Prague, in 1879, by the orchestra of the Czech Theater under Adolf Cech. Simrock published it in 1888 as Dvořák's third symphony, also giving it the arbitrarily high opus number of 76, although Dvořák himself considered the work his opus 24. Dvořák's symphonies are now numbered in order of composition. The fifth is dedicated to Hans von Bulow, an enthusiastic propagator of Dvořák's works, who shortly before had described Dvořák in a letter as "next to Brahms, the most important musician."

The first movement expresses the dew-fresh fragrance of a spring morning. The first theme is introduced by the clarinet and followed by a grandioso theme reminiscent of Beethoven. The violins state a calmly-phrased chromatic theme in D major, which is accompanied by a characteristically undulating triplet figure. The development is primarily based on the first theme and treats the others only in passing. The movement ends in the same mood in which it began.

The second movement is a three-part rondo in an elegiac mood. The plaintive theme is sung first by the celli, then ten bars later by the violins. In the middle section the woodwinds introduce a new theme in A major. The pensive mood of meditation returns to end the second movement and continues in the introduction to the third. After a sixteen-bar transition, the scherzo begins as a Slavonic jig. The second theme is played boldly by the horns, creating a festive atmosphere. The trio is in the key of D flat major and the movement ends with the return of the scherzo.

The finale in one of Dvorák's most distinguished and powerful symphonic movements. It begins in A minor, only gradually finding its way to the tonic F major. At the close of the movement the main theme of the first movement recurs in the trombones, thus spanning the entire symphony and giving it an essential unity of thought and design.

Martin Mailman has taken four symbols from the liturgy and set each to music letting each symbol represent usually a single mood. Contrasting elements, however, are present in each. There is an obvious allusion to bells in the *Introit*, which is tripartite in form and contrapuntal in nature. The ternary design of the *Kyrie* follows its liturgical model. Also there is a clear rhythmic relationship to the work "kyrie" in the first thematic idea. The *Gloria* convincingly expresses the idea inherent in the word rhythmically through juxtaposition of triple and duple accents and melodically with a theme in major key. The *Alleluia* contains a fugal exposition of the main theme contrasted by a second idea clearly illuminating the word "alleluia."

This work was inspired by the poem "Herbst" (Autumn) from *Buch Der Lieder* by Rainer Maria Rilke. Rather than attempting the impossible, namely to describe with words what could only be expressed with music, the poem itself is reprinted here in lieu of any other form of introduction.

Autumn

The leaves are falling, falling as from way off, as though far gardens withered in the skies; they are falling with denying gestures.

And in the nights the heavy earth is falling from all the stars down into loneliness.

We all are falling. This hand falls. And look at others: it is in them all.

And yet there is one who holds this falling endlessly gently in his hands.

Telemann was a prolific German composer who wrote many solo and trio sonatas for flute. The Suite in A minor, although not being performed in its entirety tonight, enjoys great popularity among flutists. The opening movement is an overture beginning in a slow and stately passage, continuing with a brisk episode and ending with a slow movement. The two menuets are part of a series of dance styles with a recapitulation of the first immediately following the second menuet. The final movement, Rejouissance, is in a very gay and frivolous style to conclude the suite.

Miss Hayes ia graduate of YSU, and is now working on a graduate assistantship at the Dana School of Music pursuing her masters degree. She is a student of Walter Mayhall and also performs with the Youngstown Symphony Orchestra.

Tchaikovsky wrote the music for a ballet entitled *The Nutcracker* (Casse Noisette) in 1891 and arranged eight numbers therefrom in form of a Suite for concert use. This band arrangement is by M. L. Lake.

The Valse des Fleurs occurs in the second act of the ballet and is scored in the original, for full orchestra. There is an introduction based on passages in the first part of the Waltz. A Cadenza (for harp in the original, for B flat Clarinet in the present band arrangement) leads to the dance itself. The Waltz consists of four independent parts, which are repeated in differing order and at last make room for the concluding part.

An ancient Russian Christmas carol (Carol of the Little Russian Children), together with a good deal of original material and some motivic elements derived from the liturgical music of the Eastern Orthodox Church, forms the basis for this musical impression of Old Russia during the jubilant Christmas season. Although cast in the form of a single, continuous movement, four distinct sections may be easily recognized, which the composer originally subtitled: Children's Carol, Antiphonal Chant, Village Song, and the closing Cathedral Chorus. All of the resources of the modern, integrated symphonic band are drawn upon to create an almost overwhelming sound picture of tone color, power, and sonority.

Alfred Reed is a composer and arranger of prodigious talent. Though this work was not published until 1969, it was written in 1944 and indicated at that time a promise which has since come to full flower. Over the years Dr. Reed has written copiously and well for the modern concert band. He truly understands the potential of wind and percussion, and utilizes that understanding to produce excellent music.

Einar Holm, a graduate of the Juilliard School, studied the cello with Colin Hampton, Zara Nelsova, Leonard Rose, and Harvey Shapiro, and chamber music with members of the Griller, Juilliard, Primrose and Hungarian String Quartets and the Alma Trio.

As soloist and chamber musician, Holm has performed extensively in North and South America, in Europe, and on radio and television in many parts of the world. He participated in four of the internationally shown films, "Master Classes of Pablo Cassals", and his string quartet, representing the Juilliard School, performed in the film "Lincoln Center for the Performing Arts."

At present Assistant Professor of Cello and Chamber Music at Ithaca College, Holm has taught at a number of institutions including Oberlin and Bowdoin Colleges, San Francisco Conservatory of Music, Accademia Internazionale de Musica da Camera in Rome, Centre Internacional de Violin in Switzerland and Fudacion Bariloche in Argentina. He has recently returned from an extended solo and ensemble tour of Southeast Asia.

His cello is a Giovanni Baptiste Grancino made in Italy in 1705.

Mr. and Mrs. Fitzer, both natives of Youngstown, have been members of the Dana faculty since 1959 and 1962 respectively, and have performed many times as soloists, chamber musicians, and as a piano-clarinet duo.

In 1970, Mrs. Fitzer was invited to be guest pianist with the Ithaca Violoncello Quartet on its concert tour of many New England colleges and universities, of which group Mr. Holm was first cellist.



The words of the Cantata - "Rejoice in the Lamb" - are taken from a long poem of the same name. The writer was Christopher Smart, an eighteenth century poet, deeply religious, but of a strange and unbalanced mind.

"Rejoice in the Lamb" was written while Smart was in an asylum, and is chaotic in form but contains many flashes of genius.

It is a few of the finest passages that Benjamin Britten has chosen to set to music. The main theme of the poem, and that of the Cantata, is the worship of God, by all created beings and things, each in its own way.

The Cantata is made up of ten short sections. The first sets the theme. The second gives a few examples of one person after another being summoned from the pages of the Old Testament to join with some creature in praising and rejoicing in God. The third is a quiet and ecstatic Hallelujah. In the fourth section Smart takes his beloved cat as an example of nature praising God by being simply what the Creator intended it to be. The same thought is carried on in the fifth section with the illustration of the mouse. The sixth section speaks of the flowers - "the poetry of Christ." In the seventh section Smart refers to his troubles and suffering, but even these are an occasion for praising God, for it is through Christ that he will find his deliverance. The eighth section gives four letters from an alphabet, leading to a full chorus in section nine which speaks of musical instruments and music's praise of God. The final section repeats the Hallelujah. (Notes by the Rev. Walter Hussey, rector of St. Matthew's Church, Northampton, England, for whom Britten wrote the Cantata on the occasion of the 50th anniversary of the consecration of the church, September 21, 1943.)


