FRED HEMKE

Fred Hemke, prominent saxophone virtuoso and clinician for H. & A. Selmer, Inc., is teaching associate in saxophone at Northwestern University and saxophone instructor at the Gunnison, Colorado, Band Camp and Interlochen National Music Camp in Michigan.

A graduate of the University of Wisconsin and the Eastman School of Music, Hemke studied under Marcel Mule at the National Conservatory at Paris, where he became the only American ever to win a First Prize in saxophone.

He has appeared as soloist with many college, university and high school bands and is known throughout the country as a saxophone recitalist, one of four ever to give a recital at Town Hall in New York.

Of that appearance, the New York Herald Tribune said: "The saxophone is a versatile and many-colored instrument, and Fred Hemke, in his New York debut, at Town Hall, proved himself to be a versatile and agile player . . . Display was certainly the watchword of last night's concert, with rapid passages and sweeping melodies galore, in pieces by Claude Pascal, Bernard Helden and Eugene Bozza, all of which Mr. Hemke brought off with dash and style, fully catching the flirting innuendoes and warm sadness so typical of works for his instrument."

In addition to appearing as clinician for the Selmer company, Hemke has prepared an LP recording, "Contest Music for Saxophone" which has become an educational aid for band directors and musicians all over the country. His "Teacher's Guide to the Saxophone" is also distributed by Selmer.

ROBERT L. GARDNER

Professor Gardner graduated from the University of the State of New York in 1951 and received a Master of Arts degree from Columbia University in 1956.

Subsequent to his graduate work, Mr. Gardner continued his studies in New York and abroad, attending the American School of Arts and Fontainebleau and the Mozarteum in Salzburg. Altogether he has made three trips to Europe, the last in 1959 when he remained for a full year. For the past three years he has been head of the Vocal Department of the Dana School of Music of Youngstown University.
