Rafael Mendez, is considered by many music critics to be the finest trumpet player in the world today.



OPERA SCENES SYNOPSES

I. "Der Freischütz" ("The Freeshooter")
Agatha, daughter of Cuno, head ranger for Prince Ottokar of Bohemia, is betrothed to Max, one of the young foresters serving under Cuno. The Prince has promised that the hereditary chief forester's post shall be Max's, providing he proves his prowess as a marksman against all contenders. Max fails in his first attempt, but he does find out later that his winning opponent used magic bullets. Despite the fact that he is told these bullets are furnished by the devil

(Samiel), he resolves to get some for himself to assure winning, thereby acquiring a coveted post and his bride. The scene from Act II opens on the eve of Agatha's wedding and the final test. She cannot sleep and awaits the arrival of her lover, whom her father has given permission to pay her a final visit before the day of decision. She has been troubled by a warning given to her by an old hermit that she is in grave danger. However, her joy and rapture break forth as she sees him coming to her in the moonlight.

OPERA SCENES SYNOPSES (continued)

II. "La Forza del Destino" ("The Force of Destiny")

The opera begins with Leonora planning to elope with her lover, Don Alvaro, a young Spanish nobleman of uncertain antecedents, because her father, the Marquis of Calatrava, would never give his approval for their marriage. They are caught by Leonora's father as they attempt to flee. Don Alvaro is attacked by the Marquis, sword in hand, but even though he draws his pistol to protect himself, he does not use it. Instead, he throws it on the floor; it discharges accidentally; the Marquis is killed. The lovers escape and go into hiding. Leonora and Don Alvaro decide they stand a better chance if they separate and meet at a rendezvous later. Leonora assumes the garb of a male and hastens to a certain inn where she hopes to hide. She nar-rowly misses detection by her brother, Don Carlo, who has been tracking the pair, bent on avenging his father's murder (so he believes). The Scene 2, Act II, shows Leonora arriving at the monastery, weary and travel-worn. She exclaims in relief at finding the goal of her journey. She thinks of her brother, telling his story to the people at the inn and remembers that he also told them Don Alvaro had escaped to America. Now, she cries, he has left her alone with her misery. Falling to her knees, she sings a deeply moving prayer in which she implores forgiveness and asks that peace may come to her soul ("Madre, pietosa Vergine"). As she sings, she hears the sound of the monks inside the monastery chanting a hymn and is moved to hope that they will give her the sanctuary she desires. Rising, Leonora hesitantly approaches the convent door, meanwhile praying for courage and strength.

III. "Don Carlos"

Don Carlos, son of Philip II, King of Spain, is in love with the beautiful Elizabeth de Valois, daughter of Henry II of France. She returns his affections, but for reasons of state, is compelled to marry not Don Carlos, but Philip II himself. This frustrating turn of events is further complicated by the fact that Princess Eboli loves Don Carlos too and is enraged because he does not return her love. She discovers that he and Elizabeth still share a deep feeling, and even though they are innocent of wrong-doing, Prin-cess Eboli goes to the King and convinces him that his wife has been unfaithful. King Philip is bitter and broken-hearted. At the beginning of Act IV, the King sits alone in his library, brooding over his wife's coldness and her supposed infidelity. He cries, "Ella giammai m'amo!" (She never loved me!) and despairs over her portrait. It is dawn and he awakens as if in a dream. He longs for sleep but cannot. "Yet," he meditates, "I shall sleep only in my mantle when the day of my doom shall have come" and sings the beautiful aria beginning with the words, "Dormiro sol nel manto."

IV. "Otello" (based on Shakespeare's drama of the same name)

Otello, a noble Moor in the service of Venice, is Governor of Cyprus. Here he has brought his young wife, Desdemona, a Venetian noblewoman who loves him deeply. Otello has promoted one of his ensigns, Cassio, to rank of lieutenant, a move which arouses bitterness and hatred in another of his men, Iago. This is the motivating factor that brings about the tragic consequences of the opera. Iago succeeds in poisoning Otello's mind about his wife's innocent actions as she intercedes in Cassio's behalf for a favor. The jealous Moor publicly denounces Desdemona and flings her to the floor in a fit of rage. Iago's wife, Emilia, handmaiden to Desdemona, is aware of the truth but is afraid to speak for

fear of her life. Act IV begins as Emilia leads Desdemona back to her room to await Otello's arrival, as he has ordered. Emilia tries to reassure the distraught Desdemona and tells her Otello is sure to be much calmer ("Era piu calmo"). Desdemona has a premonition of death and tells Emilia of an old sad song that comes to her mind, a song her mother used to sing of to her mind, a song her mother used to sing of a maiden ("Barbara") who waited in vain for the return of her love, and she sings the patheti-cally beautiful "Willow Song" ("Salce, Salce"). She interrupts her song to tell Emilia to make up her bed with her wedding sheets and directs Emilia to use one of them as her shroud if she dies. Emilia is disturbed by these words, takes a ring Desdemona gives her and promises to guard it. The song is continued, then suddenly stopped, as Desdemona listens, certain that she has heard a sigh or knock at the door. It is only the wind, Emilia assures her. Desdemona ends the song in a simple, unaccompanied phrase of infinite sadness. She bids Emilia good night, infinite sadness. She bids Emilia good night, wonders if the ache in her eyes foretells sadness and weeping. A long quiet note in the orchestra, another whispered good night, then just as Emilia is about to go, Desdemona, shaken by fear of impending doom, pours out an impassioned cry and phrase of farewell. Emilia embraces her and leaves. Desdemona then kneels to sing a profoundly moving prayer to the Madonna, the quiet, beautiful "Ave Maria". After a moment of meditation she rises and goes a moment of meditation, she rises and goes quietly to her bed.

V. "The Merry Wives of Windsor" (based on main events in Shakespear's play of the same name)

This is a merry opera, all about a fat old rogue, Sir John Falstaff who imagines himself quite a man with the ladies. He makes a great mistake when he boasts of the conquest he has made with two married ladies. The action opens in Scene 1 with Mrs. Ford reading a letter sent to her by Falstaff. She is shocked at his impudence and remarks that she must consult with Mrs. Page about a plan to teach him a lesson. Scene 2 shows Mrs. Page hurrying out of her house hold-ing a similar letter. The two women compare notes and are outraged to discover they are identical. They begin to see the ridiculousness of the situation and set about to take revenge on Falstaff. Scene 5 discloses Mrs. Ford awaiting the first step of their plan to begin. She has sent Falstaff a reply inviting him to visit her. She soliliquizes about how she will convince him that she is mad about him by her talents as an actress. This will prepare the way for the scheme she and Mrs. Page have conceived that will bring about Falstaff's punishment for his

audacity and insult.
VI. "Eugene Onegin" (based on Pushkin's lyric novel of Russia in the 1820's)

Tatyana, an innocent but intense country girl is given to reading the romantic novels of her day and lives in a dream world. She meets the cold and imperious Onegin at the beginning of the first act, when he accompanies her sister's sweetheart to their home. She falls madly in love and lives in torment because he has not returned her feelings. The second tableau shows Tatyana and her old nurse, Filipevna, as she prepares for bed. She is restless and asks the nurse to tell her a story of how she married and how she felt about love. Filipevna is horrified and says no well-bred young lady should even speak of love. The nurse worries over Tatyana and thinks she must be coming down with a fever. The young girl bids her leave but to bring her a table and writing materials first. The famous letter scene follows, in which Tatyana pours out her heart to Onegin and offers him her love, but still fearful that he will find her naive and undesirable.

PART I

The first part of the oratorio begins with an invocation by the entire ensemble, asking for enlightenment:

Lord, Thou our Master, Thou whose name in all the earth is glorious, and glorious evermore shall be, show us how Thou in pain and woe, through which Thou, Son of God, didst go, at every time wast, even in the darkest hour, forever glorified.

It then proceeds through recitatives and choruses to recount the events in the garden of Gethsemane and Peter's denial of Christ. Thrice the action stops to allow commentary by soloists: the alto aria, "From the Tangle of my Transgressions," the soprano aria, "I follow Thee Gladly," and the tenor aria, "Ah, my Soul." The final chorale comments upon the action in a way quite typical of the entire work, bringing home to Bach's congregation the lesson to be learned by this drama:

Peter, while his conscience slept, Thrice denied his Saviour, When it woke he bitter wept At his base behavior.

Jesus, let not me forget; True devotion teach me; When on evil I am set, Through my conscience reach me.

PART II

The opening chorale of the second part summarizes the action thus far recounted:

Christ, through whom we all are blest, Knew no evil-doing. Him at night did they arrest, Like a thief pursuing,

Led before the godless throng And falsely convicted, Laughed at, scoffed at, spat upon, As the Word predicted.

The pattern set in the first half of the work is now continued. The action is related by the narrator, who recites the words of the Scripture according to St. John. Soloists sing the words of Pilate and Christ, and the chorus portrays the crowds, now the chief priests, now the general throng, now the Roman soldiers. At appropriate places the action is stopped for commentary by soloists and chorus.
