Program Notes

OVERTURE TO "SAUL":

A drama by Alfieri. As a composer, Bazzini occupies a special position among the Italian people; the freedom and grace of his melodies are thoroughly national, but the careful workmanship and harmonic wealth betray the influence of Germany.

The overture is one of high dramatic power, and met with enormous success upon its first presentation in Milan, in 1867, earning for the composer the success he merited.

TRUMPET SOLO:

"Valse Brilliante" is no doubt the most musical of all Clark's solos; melodious, brilliant, and replete with florid cadenza, it has always been a favorite with soloists.

Mr. Stross, our guest soloist, began life as a "newsie," and won his way to the front rank as a trumpet soloist. He is at present traveling in recital under direction of C. G. Conn, Ltd., world's largest manufacturers of band instruments, through whose courtesy we are privileged to hear Mr. Stross this evening.

LIEBESTOD, from "Tristan und Isolde":

In Wagner's version of the story of "Tristan and Isolde" an incident occurs on board the vessel in which Isolde is being accompanied by Tristan to Cornwall to be the bride of King Mark. Isolde, hating the idea of the Cornish marriage, resolves to kill both Tristan and herself by poison to be prepared by her maid Brangane who, however, substitutes a love potion for the death draught. The love potion, we are told, "becomes in Wagner the symbol of irresistable ove."

In the opera, the "Liebestod" is sung by "Isolde" in the final scene. Summoned to cure Tristan of his wounds as he lies at the point of death, Isolde arrives just as Tristan in delirium had torn the bandage from his wounds, and he expires in her arms. Pouring out her soul in a glorious flood of song she sinks upon her lover's body and expires.

"HULDIGUNGSMARSCH": (March of Homage)

Strange as it may seem in this late age, the wind band as a concert instrument is in rather chaotic circumstances, having no agreement as to number, homogeneity or arrangement or instrumental groups necessary to attract the serious composer. Worthwhile concert works must be borrowed and arranged from the original orchestral score.

One of the objects of the newly organized American Bandmasters' Association is to correct this situation; to bring about a settled form, with complete instrumental groups, and thereby induce serious composers to write distinctive music for the concert band.

In this connection it is interesting to note that, while the Huldigungsmarsch is by no means an ideal band arrangement, it is one of the few numbers written by a master composer for wind band. It was written for, and in this form played, by a band at the ceremony of the laying of the corner stone of the Bayreuth Theatre, May 22, 1872.

SECOND HUNGARIAN RHAPSODY:

Liszt based his popular Hungarian Rhapsodies upon folk tunes of the Magyars. This, the best known and best liked of the fifteen rhapsodies, is a medley of lively pieces in the dance and march rhythms which produce stirring effects, and make a universal appeal. It is too well known to require further comment.

The Russian Song

The thesaurus of Russian song is the second richest in Europe in one respect, and the first in another. Every country has, of course, an abundance of musical lyrics. It is admitted by every one who has given any study to the subject that the Russian treasury of song surpasses even the German in variety, if not in quantity.

The remarkable thing is that this unusually rich crop of song has been sown and reaped in less than a century.

The variety of style of the Russian song is the result of the variety of influence, racial, local and cultural to which it has been subject.

Russian folk music had existed long before Russian art music came into being, with the result that when the composers fell under it's spell, it became a genuine influence of which they were more or less conscious.

The Russian composer who, having learned his technique and imbibed a good part of his idiom from Western Europe music of his day, turned then to his native folk music, found it an inexhaustible treasure-house of novelty.

Thus we can speak of a genuine influence of Russian folk song upon Russian art-song.

In addition to marked local difference of race and tradition, a strong Oriental or quasi-Oriental influence. Like his country, he is both in Europe and apart from it.

Often the Russian flavor comes from peculiar rhythms that are not found in songs of any other race; these rhythms in their turn are conditioned by the prosody and inflections of the language. The influence of the build of a language upon the rhythms of the music of a country has never been sufficiently investigated.

Russian prosody has had a great deal of influence on Russian melody. Russian poetry is rich in dactylic endings, which, needless to say, set the English translator insoluble problems at times.

Such vocal rhythms will not be found in the songs of any other race: they are motived and conditioned by the genius of the Russian language. All in all, an adequate idea of the extraordinary richness of a development that has crowded into but little over three-quarters of a century, the most marvellous record that the song can show in any European country in the same space of time.
