


The College of

Arts and Sciences Building

A self-contained environment for learning, the \$6.0million College of Arts and Sciences Building opened at the beginning of the spring quarter, 1978. It houses the faculty, facilities and programs of many of the liberal arts disciplines at the University. Eight departments within the College of Arts and Sciences — Economics, English, Foreign Languages and Literatures, History, Philosophy and Religious Studies, Political Science and Social Science, Psychology, and Sociology, Anthropology and Social Work (Biological Sciences, Chemistry, Physics and Astronomy, Geology, Geography, Health & Physical Education, Mathematical and Computer Sciences, and Military Science are housed elsewhere) and the offices of the Dean and Academic Advisors are located in this six-story structure. Some 104,500 square feet of interior space provides room for 17 classrooms, 16 laboratory and storage areas, two language laboratories, a computer terminal room, 161 faculty offices, plus supporting staff offices, five student lounge/study areas, and a 210seat lecture hall with stage.

The building occupies a five-acre site bounded by Fifth Avenue on the west and the campus core on the east. The contours, walk patterns and textures of the central core are continued in the landscaping. The building features concrete frame construction with brick facing and double glazed glass for energy conservation. The design of the building and the site provides for total accessibility of the handicapped.


