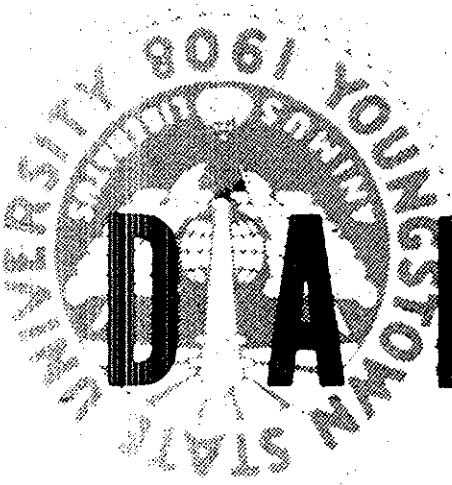


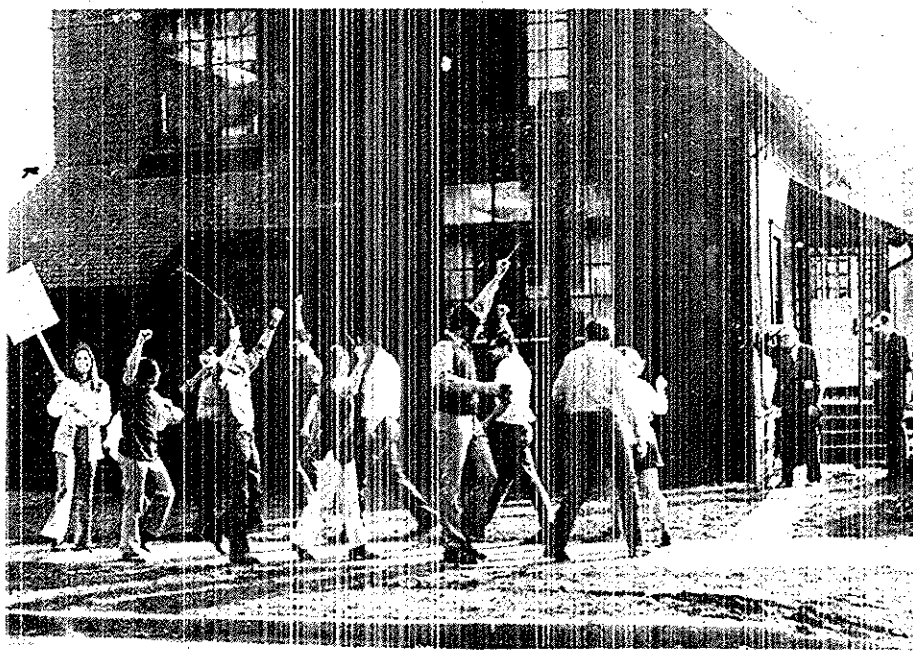

'Dambar' staff strikes, calls YSU Trustees 'obscene'

The entire *Dambar* staff walked off their jobs Wednesday in a dispute over an article appearing in the *Dambar* which the staff considered objectionable.

The article dealt with the actions of the Youngstown City Council and the YSU Board of Trustees. The staff feels that both groups are abortions and therefore obscene.

The staff's action was initiated by Miss Dorothy Dodge, former *Dambar* darkroom chief and graduate of Good Shepard High School. Miss Dodge stated that all good sheep should rebel at this flagrant abuse of the immoral standards of the students at YSU.

Rumor spread of a possible coup in the *Dambar* hierarchy and violence flared when two of the *Dambar* staffers were seen picketing

the *Dambar* building shouting "Viva Smetlzer" and carrying large photographs of Omar Sharif.

The building is currently under the benevolent protection of the Phi Delta Theta security force.

YSU prof changes mind, refuses full professorship

Dr. Bigwater Podunk announced in a press conference that he was turning down the University's offer of a full professorship in the Exploitation and Imperialism department. He said he would rather do research in the Deep South, where there was less prejudice.

After the news conference, President Pubsley said that Dr. Podunk had been unfair to the University in not formally giving them the reason for his leaving. We are going to fight this in court if necessary." He continued that the University's attorney, Obfuscator Dimwit, would seek a preliminary injunction against Dr. Podunk's leaving as soon as he could find his office.

Dimwit called Podunk's decision a flagrant violation of the university's contracts with its faculty and declared that he would fight the case as high as the city traffic court if necessary.

Podunk answered that it was the University's responsibility to

maintain an atmosphere that would make faculty want to stay. Podunk's attorney, Hygiene Shrub, said, "I am fully investigating the matter, and I am confident that my client can win the case." and then told the *Dambar* reporter he had no comment.

University Vice-president for Endemic Affairs, Allen Poc, said that he had no opinion. He would not elaborate.

Podunk's department chairman, Dr. James ("Jimmy the Gump") Kleptomaniac, said that he would hate to lose someone of Dr. Podunk's insight and teaching ability, but that he could understand how a worker like Dr. Podunk would object to working with the capitalists in the Exploitation and Imperialism department.

There was a militant picket line set up around Dr. Podunk's house late yesterday afternoon, but Dr. Podunk dampened their enthusiasm and chased them off with his garden hose.

Famous grammarian cites dilemma, publishes

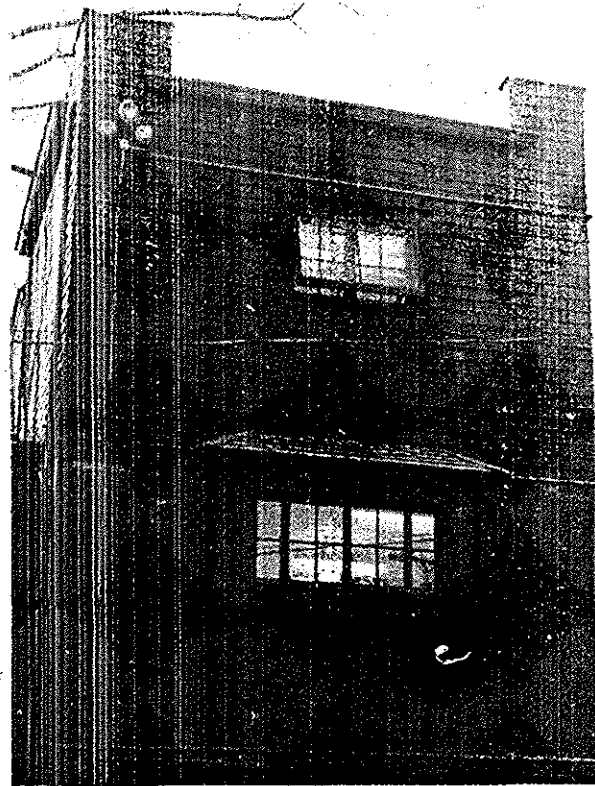
