

## Hare sees need for 'black love groups'

Nathan Hare, clinical psychologist and author of The Black conference held yesterday in the television center of the Technical and Community College Building. Hare, who spoke last evening at YSU's planetarium, said that "black love groups" would spotlight the problem of black male and female relationships. "The ground work is being laid for these groups now," Hare replied regarding the format of these groups. He noted that these groups would help black men and women deal with their problems on a one to one basis.

Hare said that the family is crucial in a groups' recognition of self and that the "one parent" situation is a contributing factor, along with urban decay, to affect self-love and self-image.

Hare, the first coordinator of a Black Studies group, stated, "Black history is just as relevant today, because problems are more intense." He noted, "It has been made irrelevant!"

Hare pointed out that most "permissive, liberal" teaching techniques are harmful to oppressed people. He stressed that there should be courses on "how to be a parent" and that black children should not have to be subjected to the individual "trip" of the teacher.

> In regards to the Bicentennial Hare said that blacks should become involved. He explained that the way blacks are presented at the Bicentennial will be important to their image in posterity.

> Hare will be speaking at a black women's conference, Saturday, April 10. He stated that he would try to give them hope and show that black men and women need each other.

Hare is one of the April speakers in the Black History Series, A Salute to the Black Scholar.

When asked about his book The Black Anglo-Saxon, Hare pointed out that the book was written in 1962 and he didn't want to be known by just that book. Hare commented that he was doing some writing on black male and female relationships for a dissertation which he might use for a book.

## Vaughn discusses blacklisting, reopening R.F.K. murder case

Actor Robert Vaughn spoke on reopening the Robert F. Kennedy assassination case and on hisbook, Only Victims concerning the blacklisting of Hollywood actors and writers during Hearings of the House Committee on Un-American Activities, before a near-capacity crowd at St. John's Episcopal Church yesterday, as part of YSU's Artist/Lecture Series.

Vaughn, who is best known for his role in The Man from U.N.C.L.E., listed a number of unresolved questions that remain in the R.F.K. case that included discrepancies in reports on the number of bullets fired and the location of Sirhan-Sirhan when the shooting took place.

"Of the 112 witnesses who appeared in the case, not one placed Sirhan closer than one to three feet in front of Kennedy. Kennedy was shot at point blank range one inch from the back of his head," said Vaughn.



# Shoot!

During the last week of April, the Military Science Department will be sponsoring a "turkey shoot" in hopes of raising funds for the American Cancer Society, with all of the proceeds going to the Cancer Society.

In many instances in the past, any University organization or department affiliated with raising money for a cause has taken a "cut" of the proceeds for expenses and other commodities. However, the Military Science Department, SGM Robert Fairchild(the rifle team coach), and many rifle team menbers and range assistants will be donating their time and energies in hopes of raising \$1000 for this worthy cause.

There is a definite lack of pride at YSU in the University itself, partly stemming from the fact that mass student participation in any event is always at a minimal. Student involvement in University projects has never been anything to brag about. That could all change if all of the students were to get out and shoot. It would be fun, and competitive, and it might start a trend-which is absent from the university-mass participation.

There is no reason why a student wouldn't be able to donate ten minutes of their time, and \$1.50 of their money, and to participate in an event which will take place on campus, and during regular class hours. Fairchild said that he is hoping to raise \$1000, but there is no reason why \$15,000 couldn't be raised.

Students are always looking for a reason to be proud of YSU, but that pride cannot come about unless the students themselves do something to be proud of. And if \$15,000 was raised for the American Cancer Society, at a cost of \$1.50 per student, then the students would finally have a valid reason to be proud of YSU. Remember, it's the students who make the University, and not the University.

In The Jambar letter "Blames USA for Oil Increases" of April 2, 1976, Mr. Ali Ozbeki is inaccurate and portrays a lack of understanding of the processes he describes. It is unreasonable and illogical

to blame the US for the high. price of oil because a balance of payments surplus was experienced in 1975. A balance. of payments surplus means that more dollars come into the US than go out involving trade and finance with other countries; however, a balance of payments surplus is not necessarily beneficial. The original Russian wheat deal brought in dollars, but shortages and higher prices for food followed. The persistent deficits in payments of the US from the early 1950's until recently led to inflationary problems in Europe. The US was obtaining goods and services and

the rest of the world was accumulating dollars that were falling in value. Reasons for the 1975 balance of payments surplus of the US exist other than the effects of oil prices in Europe and Japan on their costs, or the purchases by OPEC of military equipment. In addition to the surge in agricultural exports, wage rates in most other European countries and Japan have been rising faster European countries are associated Britain, France, and Italy have





By playing only the most popular records, the public was spared hearing unwanted, inferior products and could settle into an easily recognizable, collective medium. Most popular,

however, does not always mean the best, and many good songs would be overlooked for various reasons, more often for reasons of unfamiliarity on the part of the radio stations.

It wasn't that the music was always inferior. Often, it was the disc jockey's lack of awareness regarding certain forms. Some personalities, however, offered intelligent, earnest attempts at

progressivism, which would fail as a result of a lack of general public awareness. Drugs, being in vogue tremendously at the time, would impede the professionalism of many di's. It became fashionable, to the point of stereotype to adopt a mellow, drugged-out stance, which would account for sloppy, loose execution.




