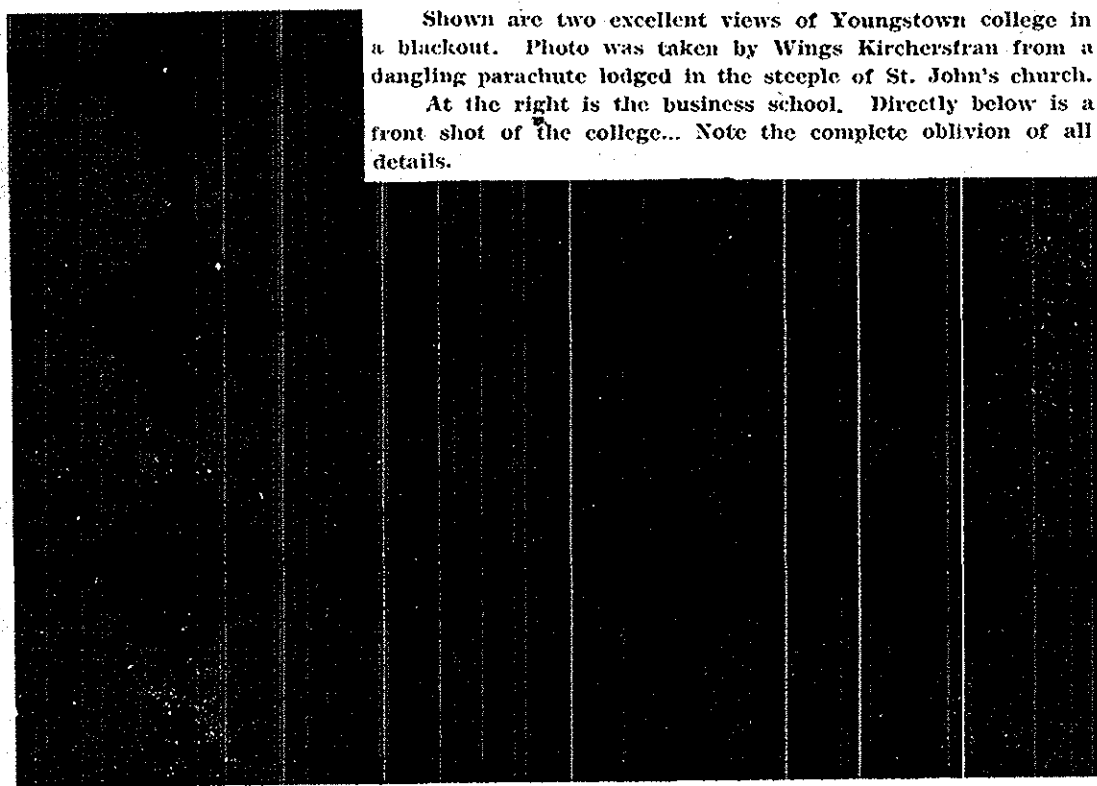


## Blackout Is Fadeout for Students

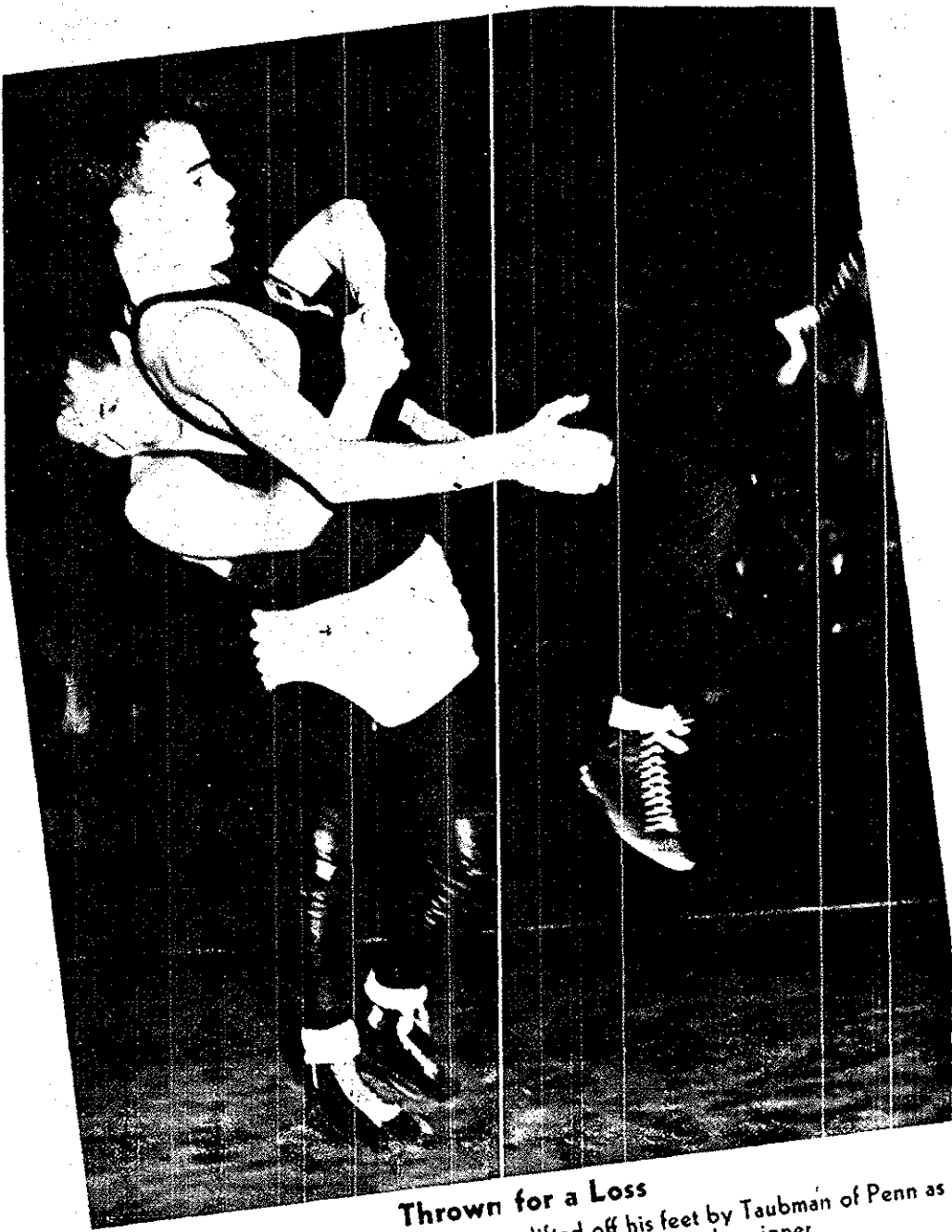
## Caf. Receives Ration Orders

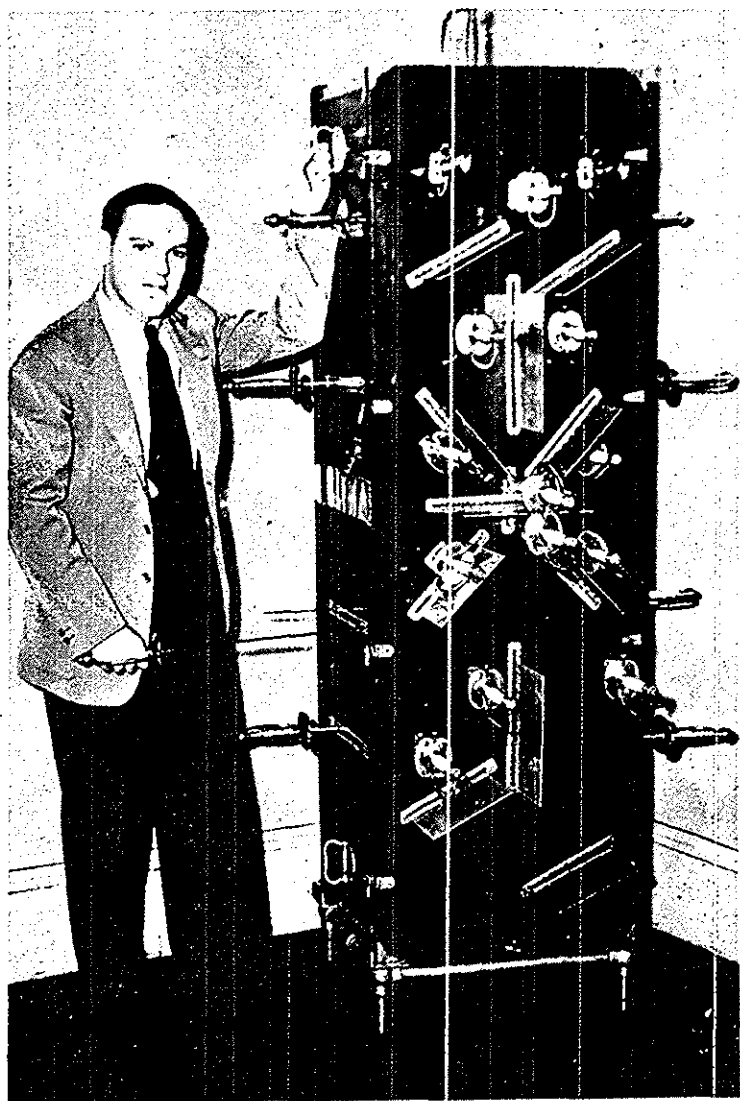

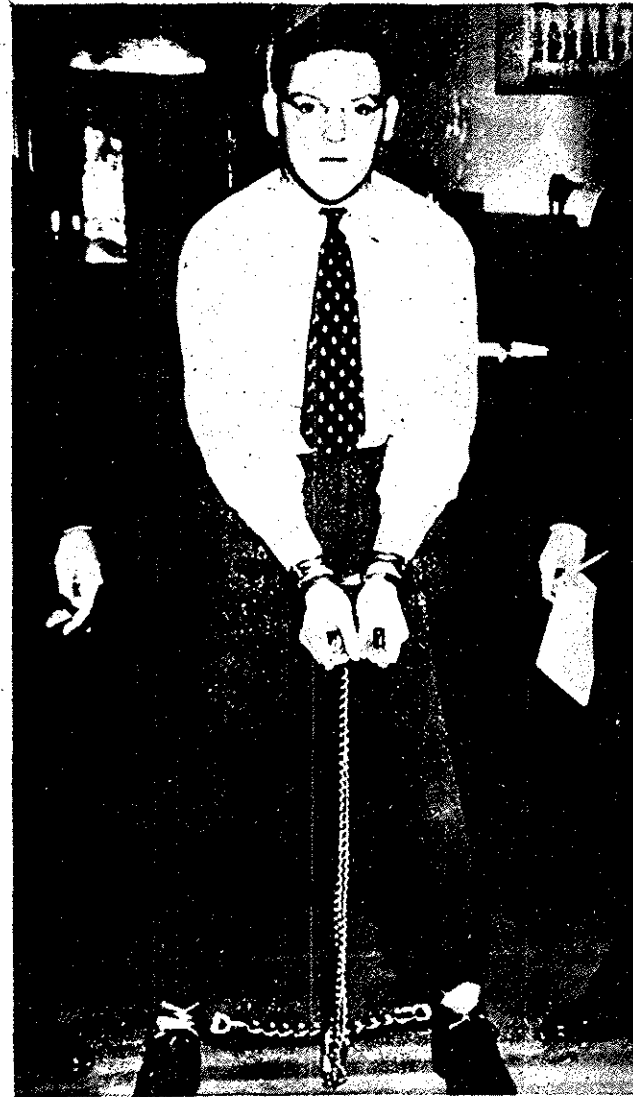




## HOLLIS RENDAR *Escape Artist*

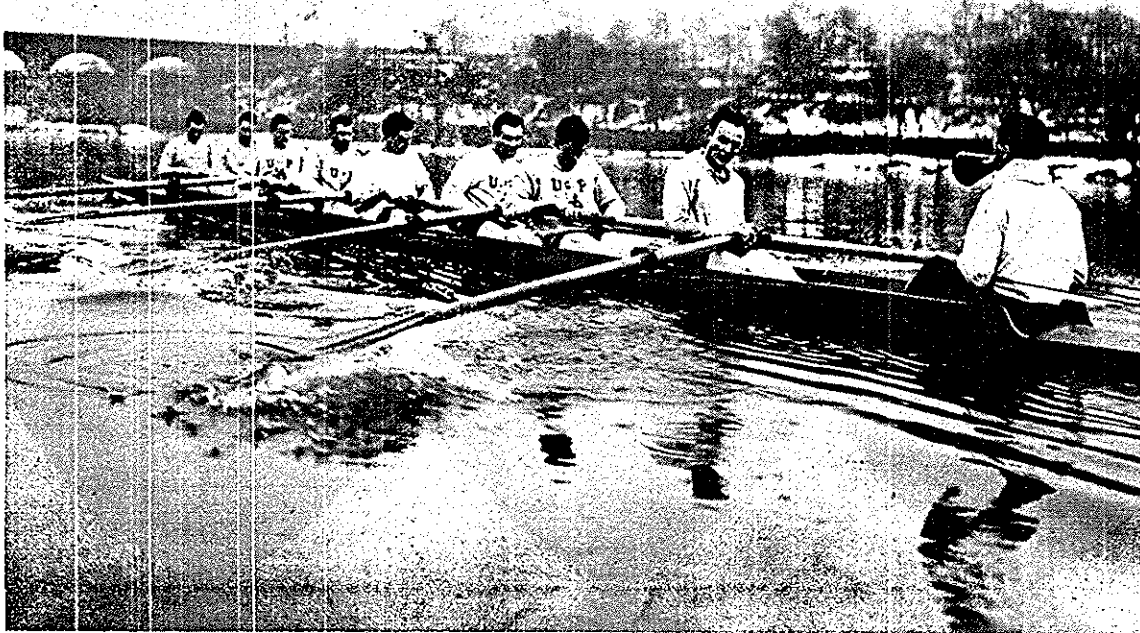

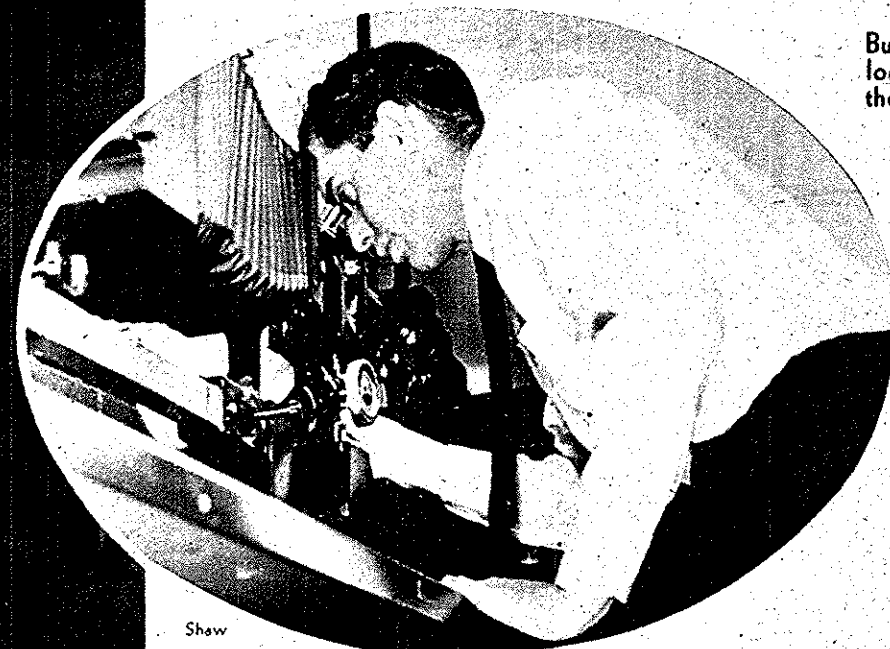




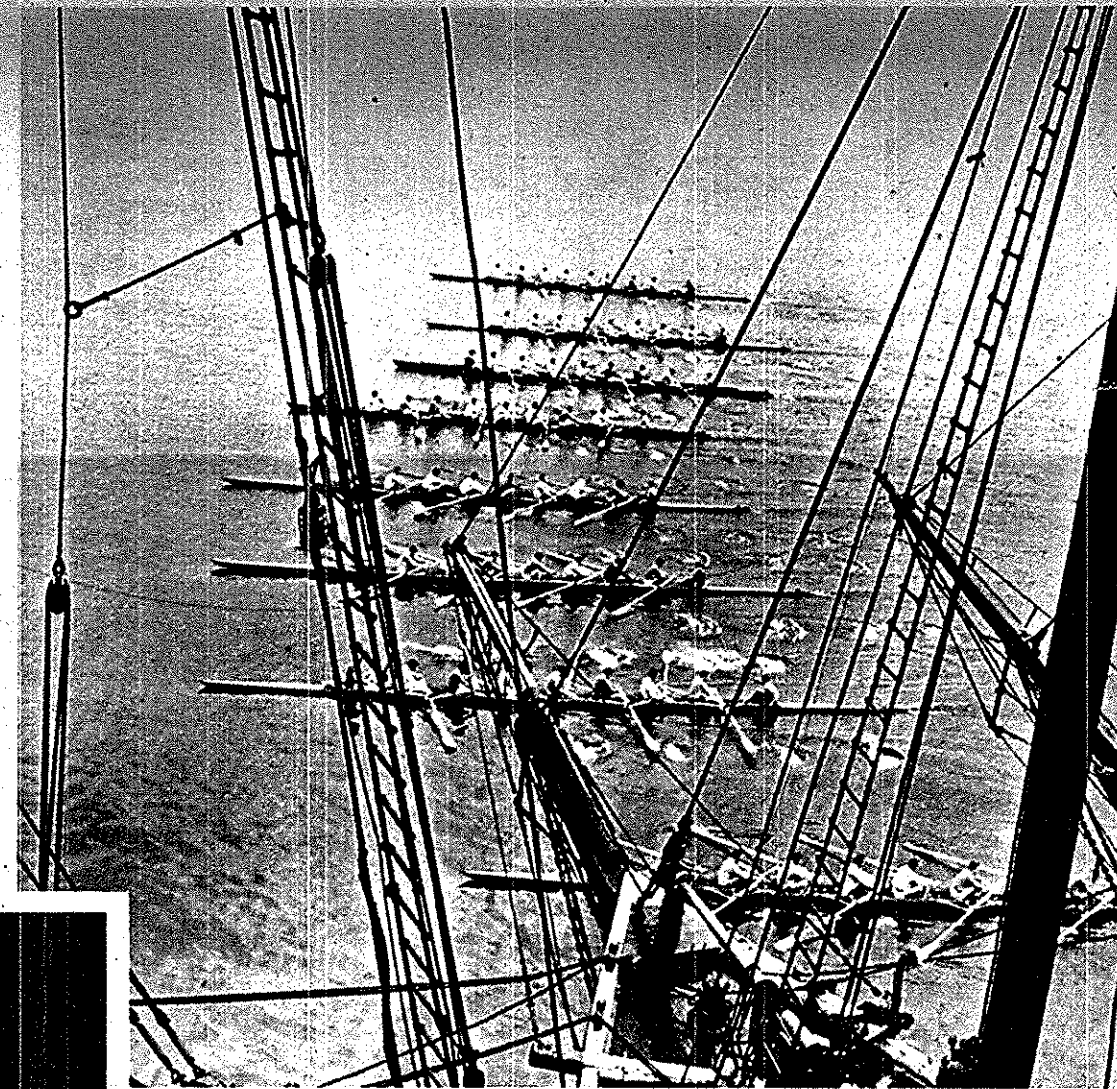

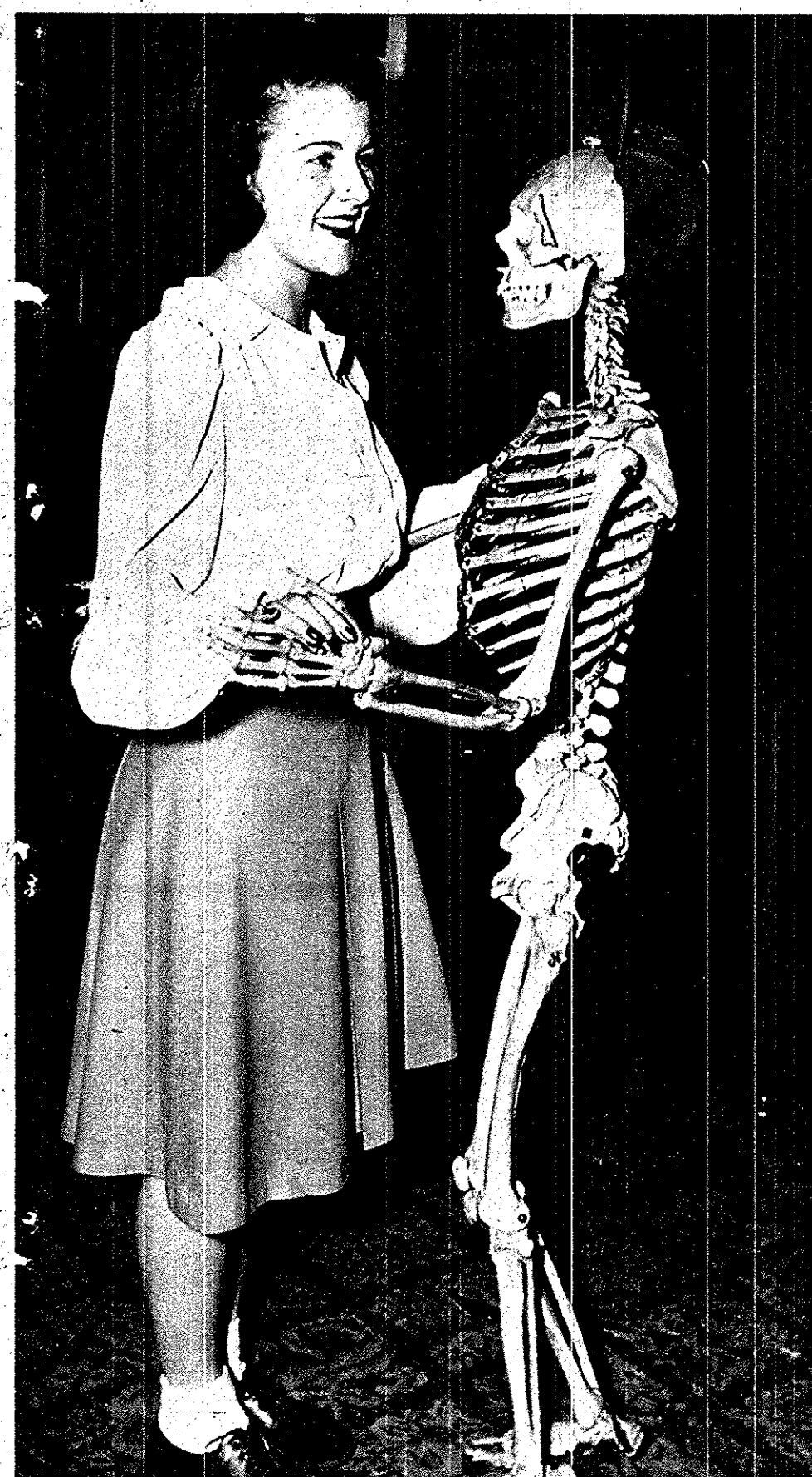
**Studying Grain Structure of Steel**

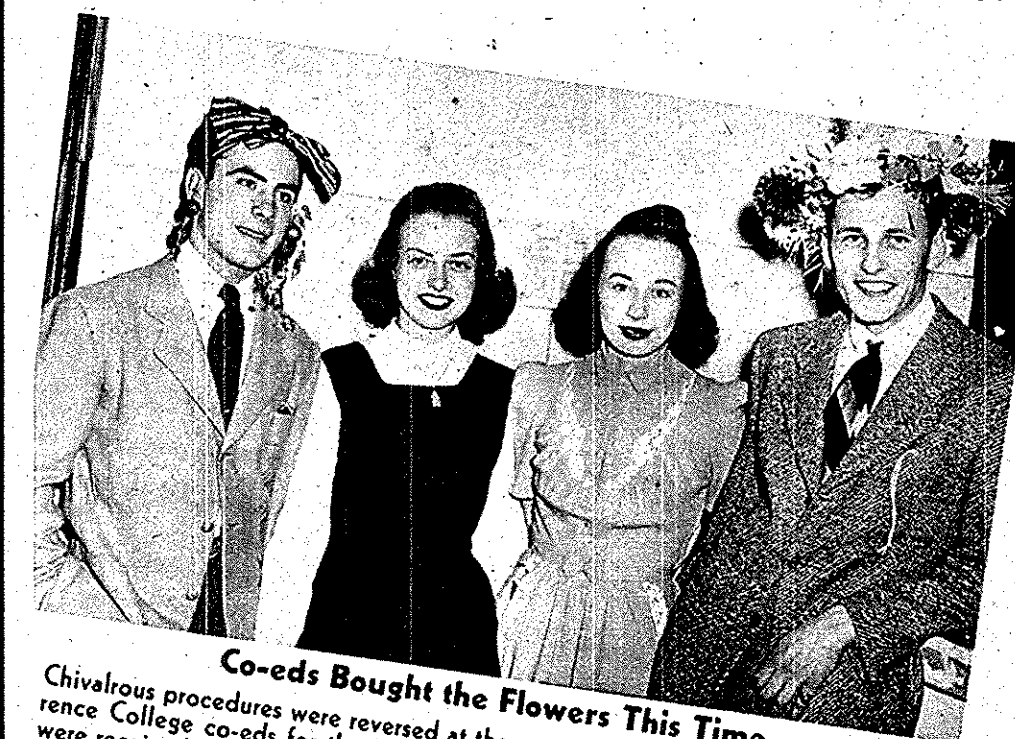
**Huskies Prepare for Season's Opener**

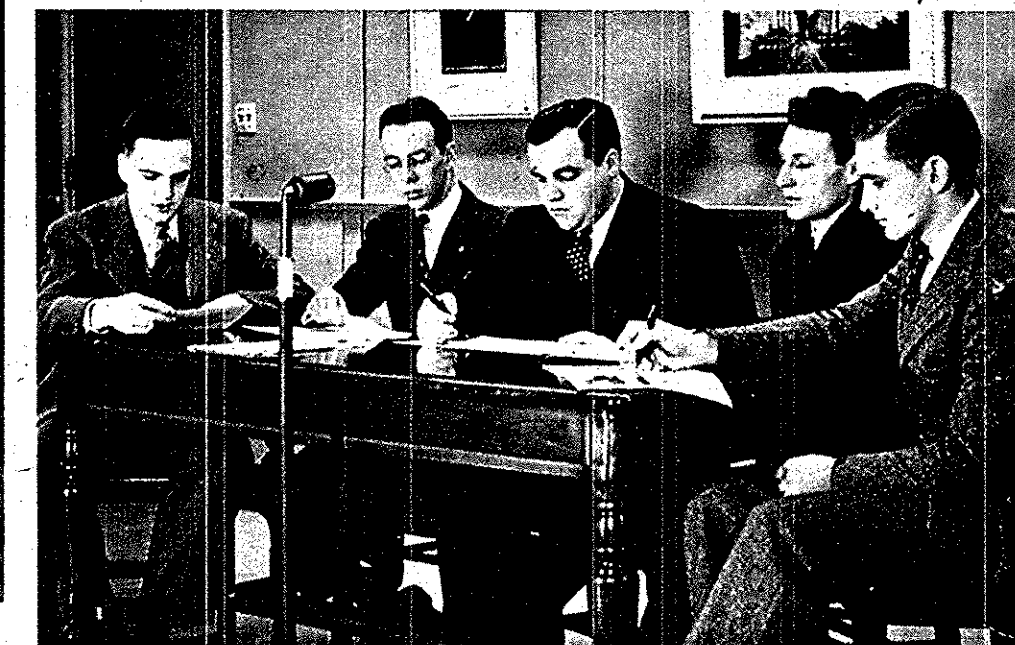
**Straining for the Tape**

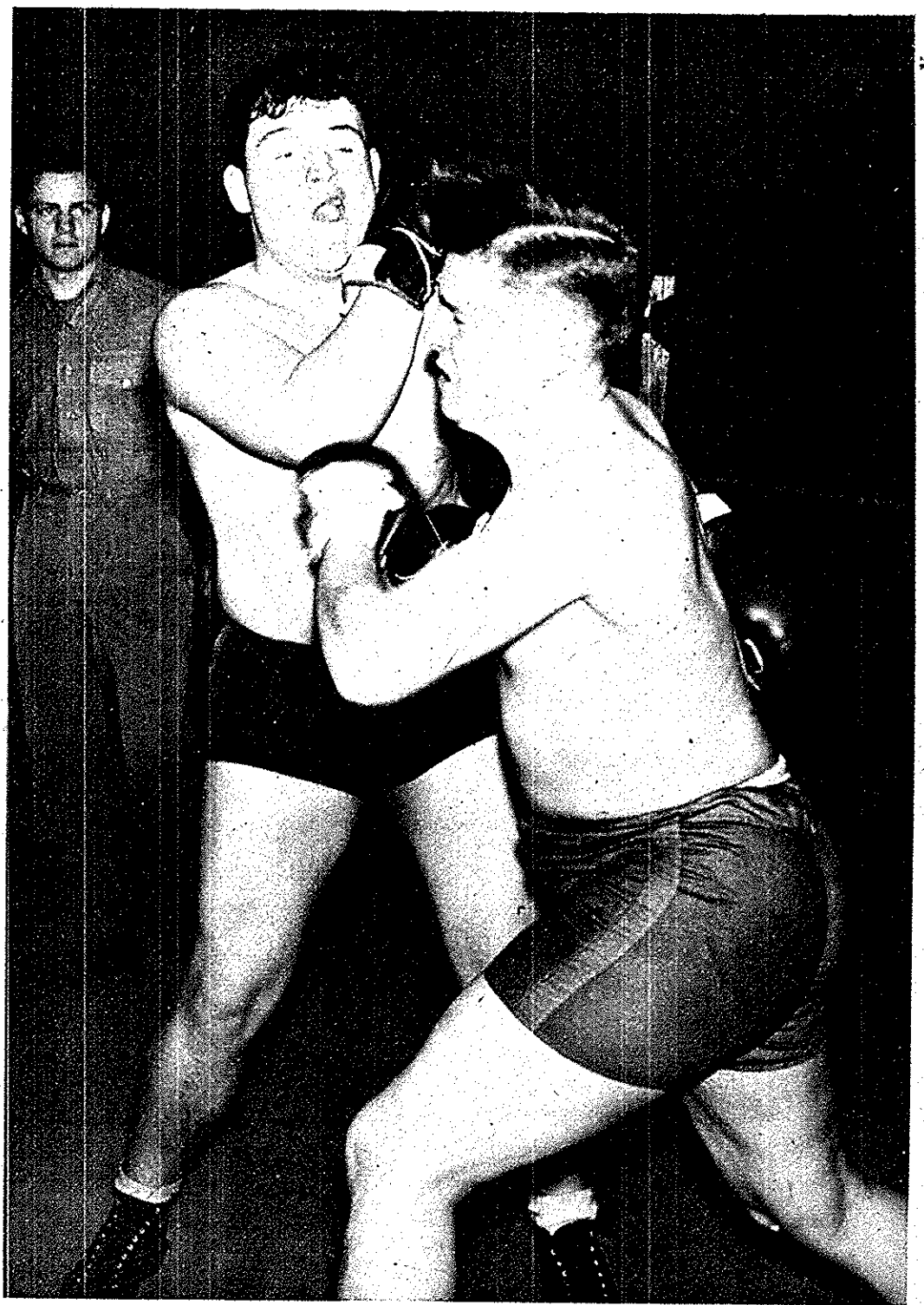

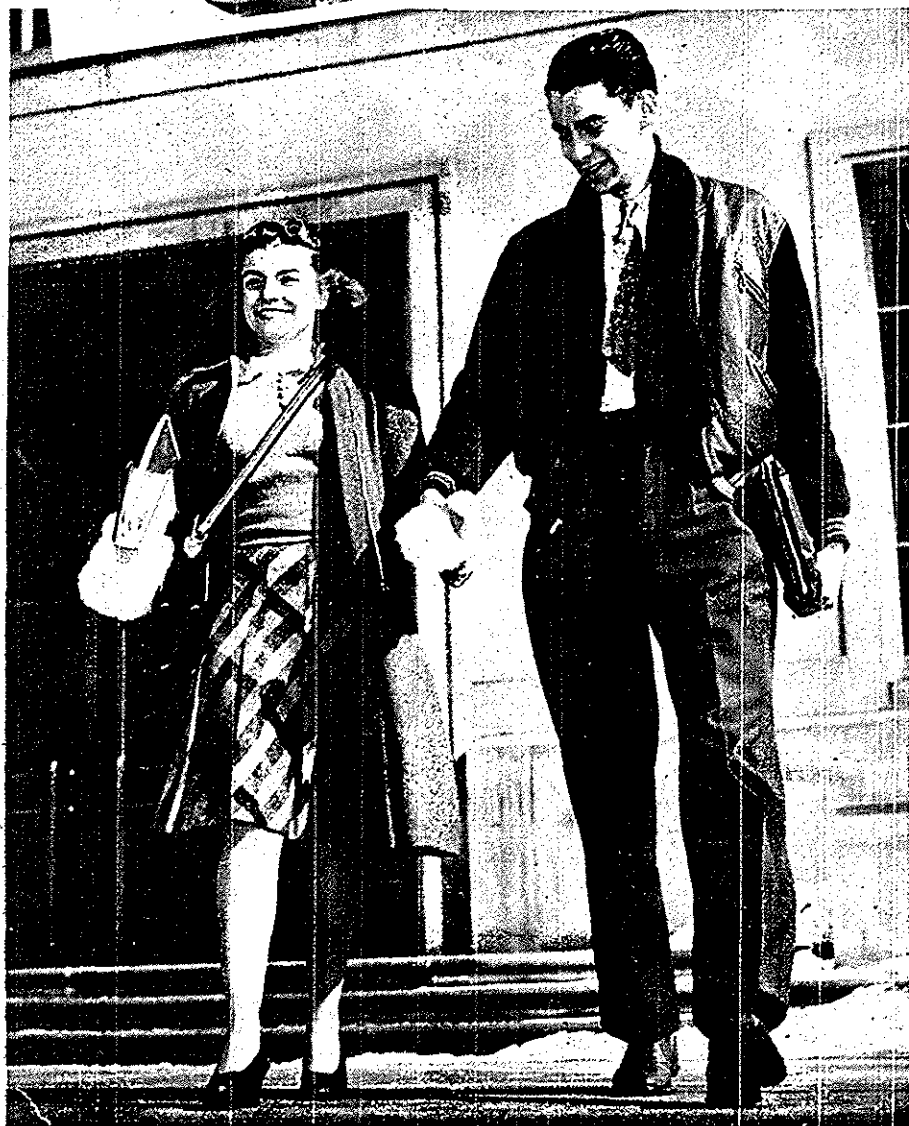

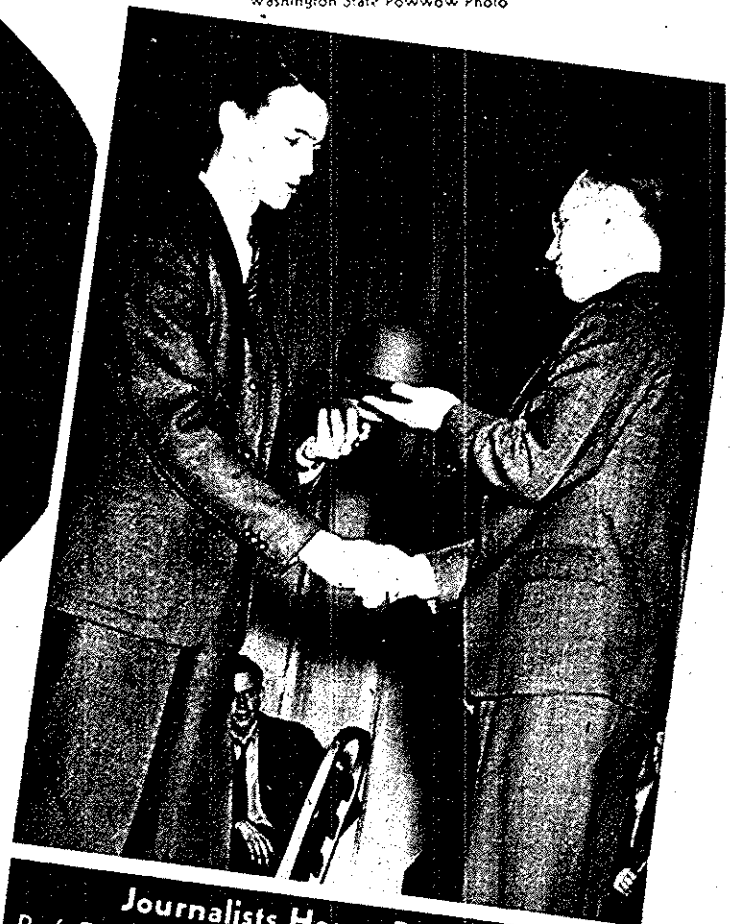
