Several problems were considered at the conference student apathy being the first one. It was generally agreed that the presidents' conference would improve voting per centages in all campus elections. Through the conference also, the organizations can orient Student Council as to what to present to the entering students the different organiza tions in the best light.

Also considered was the problem of social regulations aside from the two pages printed in the student's handbook Most of the students present felt that there was a need for revising the existing regulations. Discussion was post poned, however, pending a report from Council's social com mittee.

Several ways for students to assist the administration in formulating its policies were examined. The consensus was that the only tool available was the formal presentatio to the administration. The effectiveness of such tool was questioned, but all agreed that it was worth trying for the sake of establishing closer ties between our educators and
the students. the students.
Considered also was the feasibility of having a recrea tion room for the use of all students. Since the building of a recreation room is an administrative decision, discussion was
limited to whether a recommendation to the administration should be formulated. Several present were surprised to learn that there are no provisions for recreational facilities in the plans for the Student Union.
