YSU begins recycling project Monday

On Monday, July 23, the University will begin their campus-wide recycling program, under the direction of the grounds department.


Cardboard containers will be placed on individual desks or in work areas to hold white recyclable paper, which will be emptied into a plastic bin in each office. The maintenance staff will then pick up the paper, take it to a central holding area, and deliver it to a local recycler.

A volunteer from each office will serve as a recycling coordinator that will serve as a liaison to the grounds and maintenance departments.

Aluminum can containers will be placed in vending areas and lounges. All money collected from recycling will be put back into the program's budget.

For the first few months, the project will be a pilot program. In the fall, Student Government, Students for a Healthier Planet, and other student groups wil be contacted for ideas on how students can become more involved in recycling on campus.

In the meantime, students can put their papers in bins at any campus office. Jean Engle, publications editor, said paper can be recycled only if it is white, uncoated stock. It can not be glossy, or have gummed backs or edges, such as stick-on notes. Notebook paper is accepted.
