CITY COUNCIL ACTS ON YOCO PARKING PLAN

Proposed legislation to improve traffic and parking conditions near Youngstown College was sent to a committee for preparation and study at the Youngstown City Council meeting Monday.

The legislation, which would ban parking on the north side of Lincoln Avenue from Wick Avenue to Bryson Street, was proposed by First Ward Councilman John W. Barber upon the recommendation of Traffic Commissioner Clarence W. Coppersmith.

"If these recommendations are followed, the parking trouble will be greatly reduced immediately in the college area," Coppersmith said. He added, however, that the "problem in this vicinity is so complex that further changes may be necessary."

Should Use City Buses

Coppersmith suggested to JAMBAR reporter that "boys who live in town, in all fairness, should give out-of-town fellows a chance to use the space that is available in the area." He stated that the problem would be alleviated if city students would use the local busses as much as possible. The Traffic Commissioner said he would go as far as he could to aid the student parkers, but students who didn't show consideration when parking their cars would have to be prosecuted. The collegiate parkers have recently blocked ambulance driveways and have created traffic hazards.

"It will be several weeks before the proposed legislaton will become law," Coppersmith told the JAMBAR.

The following restrictions will be put into effect:

be put into effect:

LINCOLN AVE. — Two-hour parking on the south side from Wick to Elm. No parking on the north side from Wick to Bryson and two-hour parking from Bryson to Elm.

BRYSON ST.—No parking on the east side from Spring St. to Madison Ave. and on the west side from Lincoln to Spring St. Two-hour parking on the west side from Spring St. to Madison Ave.

SPRING ST.—No parking on the north side from Wick Ave. to Elm St.

ARLINGTON ST.—No parking on the north side from Bryson to Elm St.

SCOTT ST.—No parking on the north side from Wick Ave. to Elm St.

WICK OVAL—No parking from Wick to beginning of the oval.
