

Engineering Prof Receives Awards

Paul Narbutovskih, Ph. D., a member of the faculty of the Rayen School of Engineering, was recently honored by the presentation of the Westinghouse Electric Corporation Vice President's Award.

The award was made by Vice President J. K. Hodnette, following a dinner in Mr. Hodnette's honor at the Sharon Country Club.

Mr. Narbutovskih's award was for "outstanding diligence and accomplishment in the analysis and solution of the thermal problems associated with transformer design and operation; invention of new and simple method of calculating thermal transient phenomena;

"Promotion and development of a revolutionary new method of transformer cooling; unstinted effort in furthering the education of younger engineers; and the ability to apply his analytical talents to a wide variety of problems."

Professor Narbutovskih, a registered engineer, received his B. A., E.E., and Ph. D. degrees from Stanford University. He joined the Youngstown College faculty in November of 1946.
