

Law School Adds Faculty Member

Frank J. Battisti, local attorney, who was appointed to the faculty of the School of Law of Youngstown College, began teaching with the opening of the Spring Quarter on, Mar. 24, Dr. Howard W. Jones, president of the college, has announced.

Attorney Battisti is a graduate of Ohio University where he received the bachelor of arts degree, and has the bachelor of laws degree from Harvard University Law School. He is a veteran of World War II and is at present a lieutenant in the Military Intelligence Reserve Corps. Following his admission to the Ohio Bar in 1950 he was appointed assistant Attorney General of the State of Ohio.

In January of 1951 he was appointed attorney-adviser, Office of the Chief of Engineers, Department of the Army, Washington, handling legal problems in connection with government construction.

For the past year Attorney Battisti's work has been in connection with Military Defense Bases in the European, African, East Asian, and Far Northern Theaters of operation. He has recently associated with the law firm of Attorney Henry P. Kosling, 608 Central Tower.
