

Collegiate Press Awards

Jambar First Class Honors

The Youngstown College Jambar was again awarded First Class Honors by the Associated Collegiate Press Critical Service according to ratings announced Monday at the University of Minnesota.

The Critical Service by the Associated Collegiate Press is an annual feature of this national journalistic association whose membership numbers over 400 colleges and universities throughout the country. All colleges are classified according to size, type of college, and type of publication (daily, weekly, etc.) Each newspaper is then graded and criticized from every possible angle

including every department of the paper by journalistic experts who boast of years of experience.

The Jambar's rating was made in the bi-weekly publication class for colleges with 1,000 enrollment or more.

The papers are finally given honor ratings if they secure the required number of points. Honors consist of four groups: All-American, or superior newspapers which include approximately the top 10% of those entered; First Class Honors, or excellent newspapers; Second Class Honors, or good newspapers, and finally, Third Class Honors, or fair newspapers.
