- (19) FIRST HEARING presents music critics Martin Bookspan, Irving Kolodin and Edward Downes listening to and evaluating new recordings. From WQXR.
- (20) NOW'S THE TIME chooses a jazz standard to call attention to two hours of representative works from the various schools of jazz hosted by "the Professor," Martin Berger.
- (21) THE WIRELESS takes the listener into the twilight zone of radio, resurrecting his favorites of yore.
- (22) WYSU's MAGNIFICENT MUSIC MACHINE. Finally, five hours of free-form fare, time enough for an orgy of oratorios, opera or organ, six symphonies, seven complete cantatas or seventy-seven clipped cadenzas.
