2/4 New Releases. Hammond organist, Sam Yahel's Naxos jazz release, In The Blink of an Eye, is featured.

2/5 Terence Blanchard. Diverse forums, not fragmented career moves, mark the development of this wanderlusting trumpeter/composer.

2/26 Ornette Coleman. Pioneer of 1960s avant-garde, still not assimilated.


Cinema Sounds, with Jim Metzendorf Sunday, 9:30 pm


