**Gospel music** is on the *Folk Festival* concert agenda for the first time, as popular local artist Kenny Eldridge and the Jesus Celebration Singers bring their original modern gospel sound to YSU. The concert will be held on Friday, November 5, at 8:00 pm. We're expecting a large audience for this very talented and popular gospel group, so this year's concert will be in the Kilcawley Center Chestnut Room, just down the hall from Peaberry's, the venue for past *Folk Festival* concerts.

**Kenny Eldridge** has numerous CDs to his credit. He has performed for President Bill Clinton and has made several appearances on the Trinity Broadcasting Network. He has also appeared on the No. 1 show on Black Entertainment Television (BET), the Bobby Jones Gospel Hour, and locally with the Youngstown Symphony Orchestra. Kenny is a former high school music teacher and has been Minister of Music in his local church for the last 25 years.

**Charles Darling** hosts a great evening of gospel with Kenny Eldridge and the Jesus Celebration Singers on Friday, November 5, in the Kilcawley Center Chestnut Room on the YSU campus. The concert begins at 8:00 pm and is free.

**11/6 Kid Ory.** Originator of New Orleans tailgate trombone, who lived long enough to thrive in the post-WW2 trade revival.

**11/13 Sidney Bechet.** First great soloist (still one of the few) on soprano sax, and perhaps the greatest New Orleans clarinetist.

**11/20 Rahsaan Roland Kirk.** Lots of instruments (simultaneously) and showmanship. With genuine high-powered musical content.

**11/27 Eric Dolphy.** Experimentalist reedman — lots of instruments (one at a time).

**12/4 Johnny Hodges.** A saxophone sound that can bring tears to the eyes (particularly those of other altoists), and a relentless sense of swing.

**12/11 Cannonball Adderley.** A sort of post-bop, deep-fried, soul-drenched, much larger version of Hodges.

**12/18 Red Garland.** Full-immersion mellow piano chords with rock-solid blues roots.

**12/25 Sun Ra.** And his Solar Arkestra, from a 1982 German concert; there's exciting music behind the extraterrestrial profundity and/or hokum.
