Dear Dr. Kelty:

I am writing to you in your capacity as Chairperson of the Academic Senate.

On the advice of the Vice President for Academic Affairs, and on the basis of Article V of the Charter of the Academic Senate, I wish to challenge the action taken by the Senate at its meeting on June 2, 1978, regarding the Labor Studies program proposed by the College of Applied Science and Technology.

This challenge is directed not to the recommendation to approve the proposed Labor Studies program, which I believe to be a most appropriate program to be offered by this University, but to the conditions added by motion from the Senate floor and incorporated by vote into the main motion; namely, that Labor Studies 501 be taught <u>exclusively</u> by the Department of History, and that Labor Studies 515 and 530 be taught exclusively by the Department of Economics

What is challenged, in other words, is the principle of placing courses essential to a program exclusively under the control of departments that are not responsible for the program, so that even the scheduling of the courses is dependent on the needs of those departments rather than on the needs of the Labor Studies program. This is of particular concern when the courses in question are not simply service courses for the Labor Studies program, as mathematics for example offers service courses to engineering students, but are an integral part of the major.

This is not at all to deny the soundness of drawing on the expertise of departments that can contribute to such a program, which I am sure can be arranged for on a more informal basis. It is rather to object to denying the person responsible for the Labor Studies program any voice in the determination of the manner in which instructional services are to be performed so as to be in harmony with the goals and purposes of the total program.

I would urge the Senate to carefully review and reconsider this action in view of the possible precedent it might establish.

Dear Dr. Kelty,

Please read into the record of any debate concerning the adoption of an "Early Semester" calendar the resolution which I am forwarding with this letter. I would also appreciate it if you would read this letter to the Senate in order to clarify the position of the YSU-OEA in this matter. I would make such a statement myself, but a commitment to my State Speech Association prevents me from being in my Senate seat on October 6.

The YSU-OEA has not discussed the merits of the "Early Semester" proposal and has taken no position on the matter.

We have received a letter from President Coffelt in which he reaffirms the intention of the University to continue to abide by the Collective Bargaining Agreement. He further suggests that he would seriously consider challenging any action of the Academic Senate which would call for any violation of the Agreement.

Further, President Coffelt's letter states that he does not presently contemplate opening the current Agreement for renegotiation prior to its expiration in 1981.

We take no issue with the President on any of these statements.

We see no inherent collective bargaining problems with an "Early Semester" calendar so long as the changeover date is no earlier than September, 1981, at which time we anticipate going to work with a newly-negotiated agreement anyway.

If any further clarification of the YSU-OEA position on this matter, I will be glad to meet at a mutually convenient time with any member of the university community.

ADMINISTRATIVE BOARDS AND ADVISORY COMMITTEES

FOR 1978-79

Administrative Boards and Advisory Committees are listed in alphabetical order below. Administrative "Boards" are established to provide a means of reviewing decisions of an administrator. The Board may uphold, modify, or reverse such decisions after review. There are three such Boards: (1) Residence Classifications; (2) Student Discipline; and (3) Traffic and Parking Violations.

Administrative "Advisory Committees," on the other hand, are established to serve in an advisory capacity to an administrative office. As such, administrative regulations can be reviewed prior to their implementation or operating policies can be reviewed for possible revision.

I. Appointment

All appointments to administrative boards and advisory committees are made by the President from a list of names of persons recommended by administrative, faculty, staff, and student bodies. Such appointments will be for one year provided that the individual maintains his/her status at the time of appointment (e.g., fullservice faculty).

A. Administrative Members

The administrative officer to whom a board or committee reports shall recommend the names of administrative personnel for committee assignment, and shall be consulted in the selection of a chairperson.

B. Faculty Members

The Senate Executive Committee shall submit names of faculty members to serve on each of the administrative boards and advisory committees. These names will be submitted to the President by May 30 of each year.

C. Student Members

In most instances administrative boards and advisory committees will include members of the YSU student body. In an effort to make student membership as representative as possible, the following guidelines will be followed:

1. Any student enrolled 8 or more quarter hours and in good academic standing may hold Board or Committee Appointments.

- 3. When there are two or more students on a board or committee, only one may be a member of Student Council, unless otherwise specified in the board or committee description.
- 4. Every effort should be made to have all schools (Colleges) of the University represented on the boards and committees. Therefore, when the number of students is less than seven, no more than one should come from a single School (College).
- 5. Names of students to serve on boards and committees will be submitted through the Dean of Student Affairs from a list made and ratified by the Student Council in a formal meeting. These names will be submitted by May 30 of each year.
- 6. The Dean of Student Affairs will assume responsibility for confirming eligibility of students nominated.

II. Chairperson

Chairperson of all administrative boards and advisory committees are appointed by the President. A student shall not serve as Chairperson or Temporary Chairperson of any administrative board or advisory committee.

III. Committee Quorum

A quorum shall consist of the majority of the members of the committee unless otherwise specified below.

IV. Operation During Summer

In principle, it is the expectation that most boards and advisory committees will not be operating during summer months. Some, however, will have responsibilities that require action during this period. When provisions must be made for limited operation during the summer, the chairperson will convene as many members of the board or committee serving the preceding year as are possible.

The incumbent chairperson will continue to serve during the summer session. If the incumbent is not available, a temporary chairperson shall be appointed from among those faculty and administrative members who are available. The appointment will be made by the President in consultation with the appropriate administrative officer.

Administrative and faculty members who are employed directly for the summer session will serve on the board or committee. Faculty members under contract for fall may serve during the summer session if they are available and are willing to participate. Student members must have been enrolled for at least 8 quarter hours during the preceding spring quarter and be enrolled for at least one course during the summer session or be pre-enrolled for the fall quarter.

Quorum requirements may be reduced for summer operations. If the number of members available is below one third, or less than four, whichever is greater, additional faculty <u>ad hoc</u> appointments to reach this minimum number shall be made by the President. In an effort to assure representation on the board or committee, an officer of student government or student council and the Dean of Student Affairs jointly make ad hoc student appointments.

V. Additional Information

The President of the University is an ex-officio member of all boards and committees and shall receive a copy of the approved minutes of all boards and committee meetings.


