<b>Abstract:</b>	The Faculty Meeting would assemble to conduct business upon the call of the President of the University. The Faculty Meeting eventually evolved into the State of the University Address as it became more formal and more campus members got involved.

## **Historical Sketch**

The Faculty Meeting began under the Presidency of Howard W. Jones. The Faculty met several times a year with the President and would discuss various topics that the faculty participated in or related to (i.e. student activities, commencement plans, various reports on campus committees, enrollment figures, college objectives, bylaws of the faculty, faculty involvement in the student council, new faculty, etc...) and topics that reflected the times such as the Veterans Affairs Committee and the War Effort in the 1940s. When the University became state in 1967, the Faculty Meetings were called the "General Faculty Meetings" and Albert L. Pugsley presided over them. As time went on and the university grew, the meetings of the faculty became more formal as more people became involved and soon administrators and staff members became involved, as a result "The

State of the University Address” given by the President in the Fall of each year evolved from the meetings.

### **Scope and Content Note**

The records were stored in Jones Hall until transferred to the YSU Archives and Special Collections in 2003. The records are arranged chronologically and consist of only one series, the minutes taken at the meetings from 1932-1972.
