Report to the members of the Committee

To Mr. Dill

1. The President of the College has added to the former Classroom Counseling Committee the two College deans and suggests for the name of the enlarged group, Student Counseling Committee. The letter has been assigned the additional duty of aiding the College deans in the development of student aptitude tests.

2. As it seems impossible to assemble the Committee at an early date, will you please give individually your criticism or approval of the following recommendations, which should be given immediate attention:

OK
a. Reconsideration: Students with excessive absence may be suspended from extr-curricular activity thru action of the Student Counseling Committee.

b. Reconsideration: No student will be permitted to drop a course (receive "Wd") after the first half of the course. (This is in line with newly proposed counseling methods for this college.)

OK
c. The Committee members will aid the deans in scoring the intelligence tests immediately after they are completed, and comparing their results with the high school intelligence ratings. The deans and registrar, with the aid of the Committee, will have the power at this time to reduce ~~the~~ academic loads of students whose high school and college intelligence test records show that they are incapable of doing full capacity work.

d. That all committee reports, after receiving the approval of the President of the College, be presented on a mimeographed form to the individual faculty members for a final consideration ^{or} approval.

Please place this report with your comments in the box of the chairman no later than Thursday noon, May 5th. The Catalogue Committee would like to have definite information on the above recommendation immediately.
