Dean Paraska was in attendance to answer questions concerning the granting of academic honors to graduates of two-year programs. After some disucssion the committee unanimously passed item #2 as submitted; i.e., high honors to those individuals who have obtained a 3.7 average and honors for those individuals who have obtained a 3.4 average.

Dr. Ward was also present to explain the proposal submitted by the Department of Foreign Languages. This involved the proper placement of undergraduates in foreign language courses. The proposal:

- 1. The Modern Language Association National Standardized Examinations for placement in elementary and intermediate foreign language courses will be administered on a voluntary basis.
- 2. If a student does not elect to take a placement examination, he will be advised according to Form 100 issued by the Department of Foreign Languages and Literatures. If he elects to audit a course or complete a course for a grade which repeats work previously done, he will not receive credit hours toward graduation.
- 3. A student who takes a placement examination will be advised to enter course(s) on the basis of the examination results. If the course(s) he is advised to enter repeat(s) work previously taken, he will receive credit hours toward graduation provided the last grade received in the high school foreign language course was the equivalent of "C" or better. The student will, in no case, receive credit hours toward graduation for previous work in the courses preceding that course in which he is advised to enroll on the basis of his placement test score by the Department of Foreign Languages and Literatures.

A lengthy discussion ensued involving mandatory versus voluntary placement and ramifications thereof. The motion to approve Item #3 passed the committee with one dissenting vote.
