1. Minutes of the Meeting of March 15, 1948

2. Enrollment

Enrollments already completed for the 10-week summer session now total 1107. It is estimated that additional part-time enrollments, business school students, and approximately 150 new freshman and transient students will bring the total enrollment to about 1500.

Fall emrollment for upperclass students is nearly complete. The figures below bring out the fact that need for upperclass subjects will be as urgent next fall as was the need for freshman classes the last two years. It is necessary to remember that junior and senior classes are far more diversified than those which would accommodate students in freshman or sophomore courses. Additional faculty and classrooms will be necessary to handle the larger number of classes, particularly those in specialized fields.

In addition to the 2326 full-time students now enrolled, for fall 1948, it is anticipated that there will be 1,000 part-time students and 650 freshmen. Congressional action on universal military training, if taken before September, will of course have immediate effect on freshmen enrollments. In the absence of such action, 1948 fall enrollment should not be much below the 1947 figure of 4200.

3. Faculty Summer Leaves of Absence

The following teachers will be on leave this summer to continue their graduate work: M. E. Pagaroll, Marcia Welsh, T. C. Smith, Frank Malak.

4. Faculty Appointments

Mr. Karl Benkner will become a full-time member of the Rayen School of Engineering faculty, effective the summer session of 1948.

Mr. Kenneth Raymond Kitchen has been appointed assistant professor of music, effective September 1948.

It is hoped that qualified instructors can be found for full-time positions in the departments of psychology, business administration, and art.

5. Student Activity Awards

Youngstown College debate teams made an excellent record this spring in the second year of their activity since before the war. The two teams won first place honors in the Northeastern Chio invitational debate tournament, over such schools as John Carroll, Hiram and Wooster. In April the debate teams attended the Grand National Forensic Tournament at the University of Virginia, placing in the upper 25% of the seventy schools competing, and defeating Tulane, the University of Georgia, and Carnegie Institute of Technology, among others.

At the annual meeting of the Ohio College Newspaper Association the College newspaper, Jambar, was given the Scripps-Howard newspaper award for the best bi-weekly of the year. This is the third time the Jambar has won the award.

6. Scholarships

Eight students are currently enrolled at the College under the Sharon Steel Scholarships which cover tuition, fees, and books. Scholarships available for students in the fall include four \$100. scholarships from the Strouss-Hirshberg Music Center, one \$300. award for an upperclass student to be chosen by the President, one \$250. annual scholarship from Youngstown Arc Engraving, and the four annual all-expense scholarships of Sharon Steel.

Representatives from the Ohio Edison Company are now working out details of a possible scholarship arrangement with the College. Although student need for such assistance is not as urgent now as in past years, the call for scholarship help will undoubtedly grow as normal enrollments, not covered by the G.I. Bill, resume. Industrial scholarships are invaluable in making college opportunities possible for worthy highschool graduates of this community.
